* The assessment was started on July 17, 2022 therefore results may vary because the villages were visited before the starting of heavy continuous rain falls, so their current situation might have changed in terms of the magnitude of damages. The assessment data is being collected in two ways i.e. through Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with CIs Leaders and members and visits to affected areas by social mobilization teams (SMTs) and direct interaction with affected households regarding the extent of damages/losses. This also involves the physical verification process at the ground level with the affected population.

This information is based on the initial assessment while the final and accurate assessment would be ascertained after the joint damage assessment survey, which is in progress.

Initially SRSO initiated the rescue and relief operations in submerged water through linkages with other departments to provide the relief operations

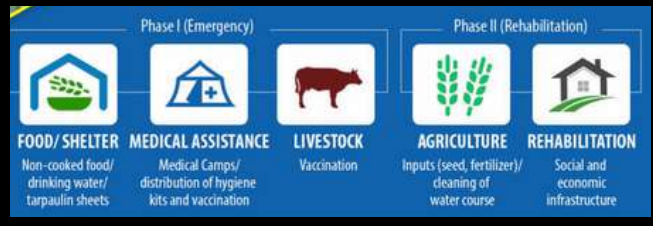

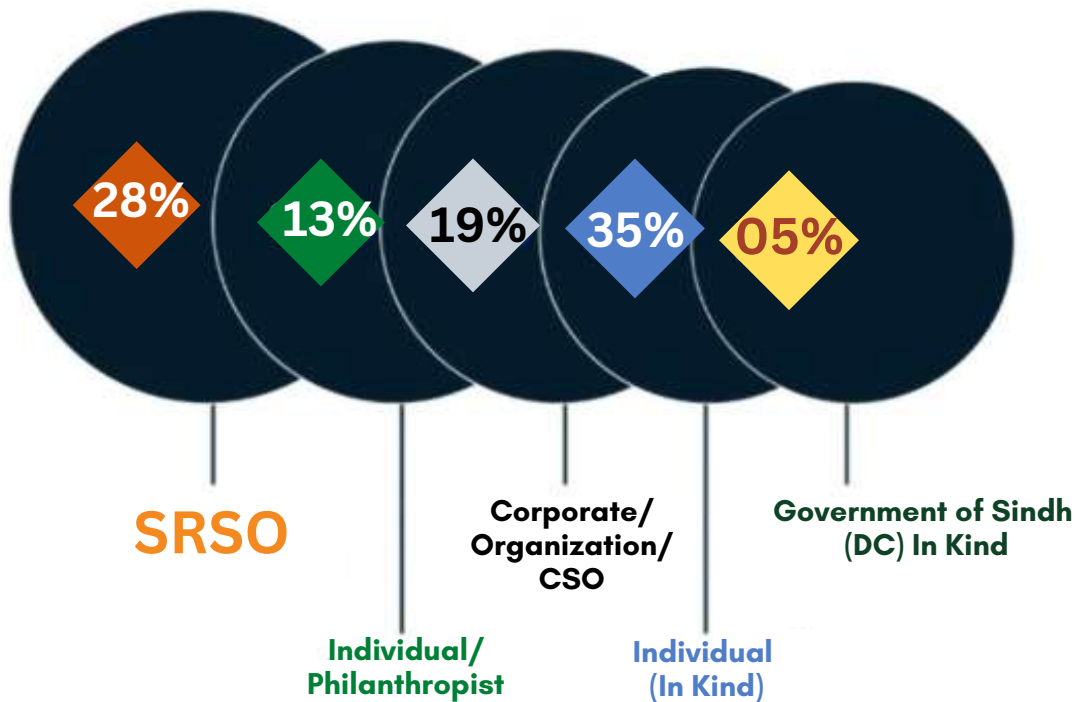

Free Veterinary Camp by Brooke Pakistan

In flood humanitarian and livestock crisis, Brooke has launched an emergency relief work for the equine welfare community to help care for wounded, starving, or sick horses, donkeys, and mules, as well as the communities they support, following widespread flooding in Pakistan. Over 750,000 livestock animals have already been killed in Pakistan since the crisis struck and large numbers of those that survive including horses, mules, and donkeys require food and medical care.

Brooke has set up relief camps and mobile health units providing food, water, and longer-term rations for animals. The charity is also providing treatment for sick or injured animals and supporting the supply of food rations to equine-owning families.

In pursuance of this, On dated 29th Sep 2022 Brooke SRSO district Larkana organized a Free Veterinary Medical Camp at Village Hakeem Sandelo, UC Bux Jatoi, Taluka Bakrani, District Larkana. Where 152 cattle and buffalos and 69 goats and sheep were vaccinated to prevent animals from fatal and contagious diseases. Besides this 67 affected animals have been treated.

SRSO District Larkana team conducted awareness session on health & hygiene at VO Saidudero Taluka Ratodero in which 53 females participated. District larkana after that to maintain the dignity of women during emergencies 39 dignity Kits have been provided to the adolescent girls and women.



SMU Jacobabad team visited flood-affected families in various villages suffering from viral diseases like cholera, gastroenteritis, malaria, and scabies. SMU Jacobabad Team also delivered the hygiene sessions to keep them safe from these fast-spreading diseases.

Food & Non-Food Items Distribution

SRSO Hyderabad team, distributed 14 ration bags, 14 Corton biscuits, Nestle milk powder, Cerelac, soup, surf, shoes, and stitches clothes among the 14 flood-affected families of village Haji Noor Muhammad Shoro Union Council Railo Taluka Kotri District Jamshoro.05 families from the same village distributed stitched clothes and soups.



WASH Activities- Aqua Water Purification Tabs and Aab-e-Nuqra (Qarshi) For purification Drops

SRSO social mobilization teams district Larkana conducted a dialogue with VO Usman Ali Abro taluka Larkana and VO Allah Warayo Solangi Taluka Ratodero regarding the importance of safe drinking water in our lives and outbreak of waterborne diseases in the areas hit by recent HAVOC caused by the rainfall. After that, a demonstration has been rehearsed on how water can be purified by using Aqua Water purification tablets. After that 400 water purification tablets have been provided to the 40 households for 10 days, each household will consume one tablet a day to purify the water



Free Medical Camp

SRSO District Larkana set up a free medical relief camp to reach the communities that are cut off due to flood, with the collaboration of the Government of Sindh District Health Officer (DHO) Larkana, Marie Stopes Society at Village Hatri Ghulam Shah UC PuranoAbad Taluka bakrani to provide lifesaving assistance to the most vulnerable people. A total of 257 Patients were medically examined during the mobile camp, and essential medicines, vaccines, treatments, and nutrition supplements were provided. Access to maternal health care is a prominent challenge among IDPs in this regard 22 ante-natal care and 12 post-natal care were provided by the Marie Stopes Society team. 40 Malaria suspected cases were also screened under GFTAM Malaria Project, 20 patients tested positive

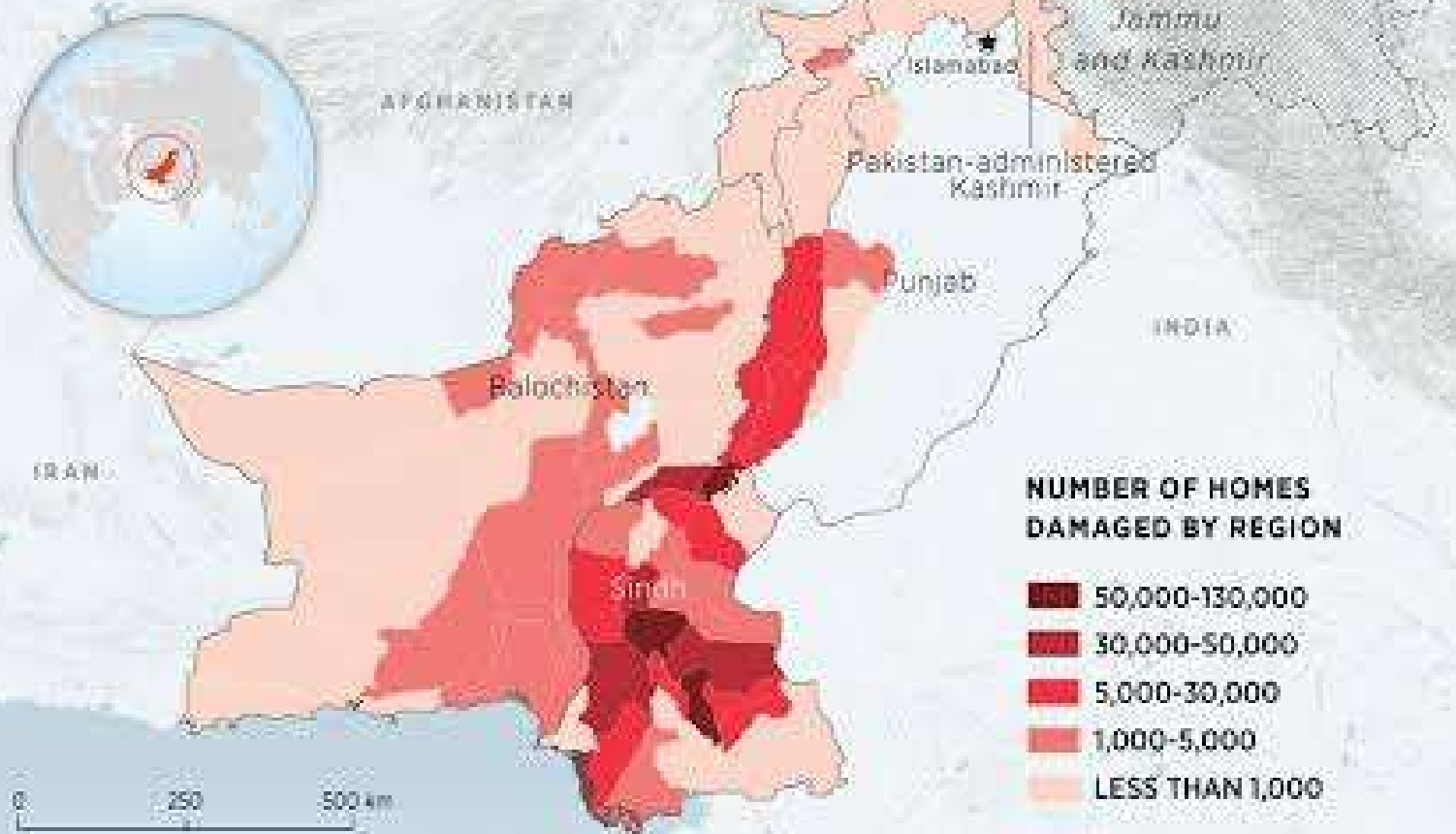
AKHO In-Kind Assistance Mirpurkhas Flood Affectee Community

Over 1,000 dead in Pakistan amid heavy monsoon rains

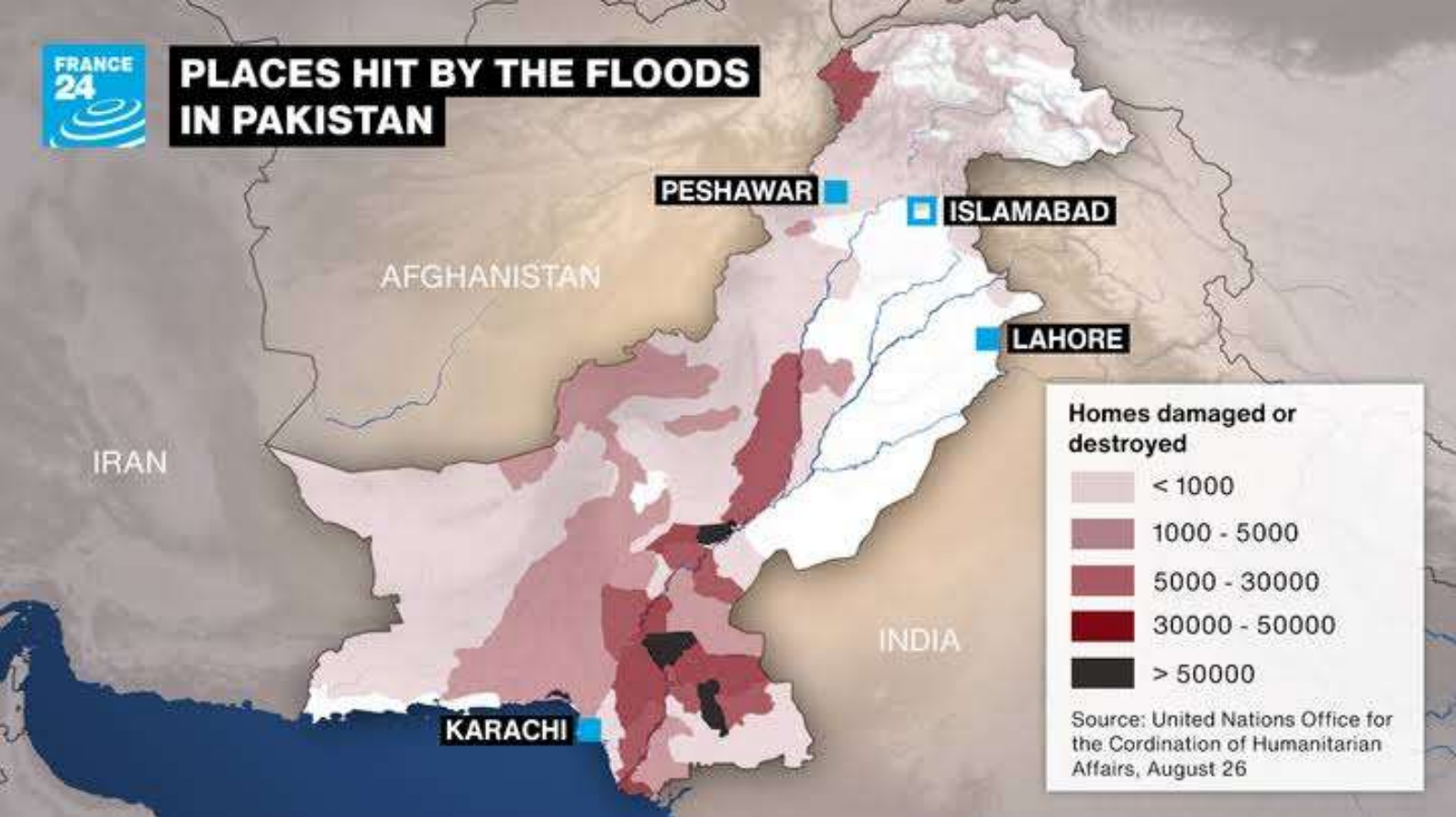

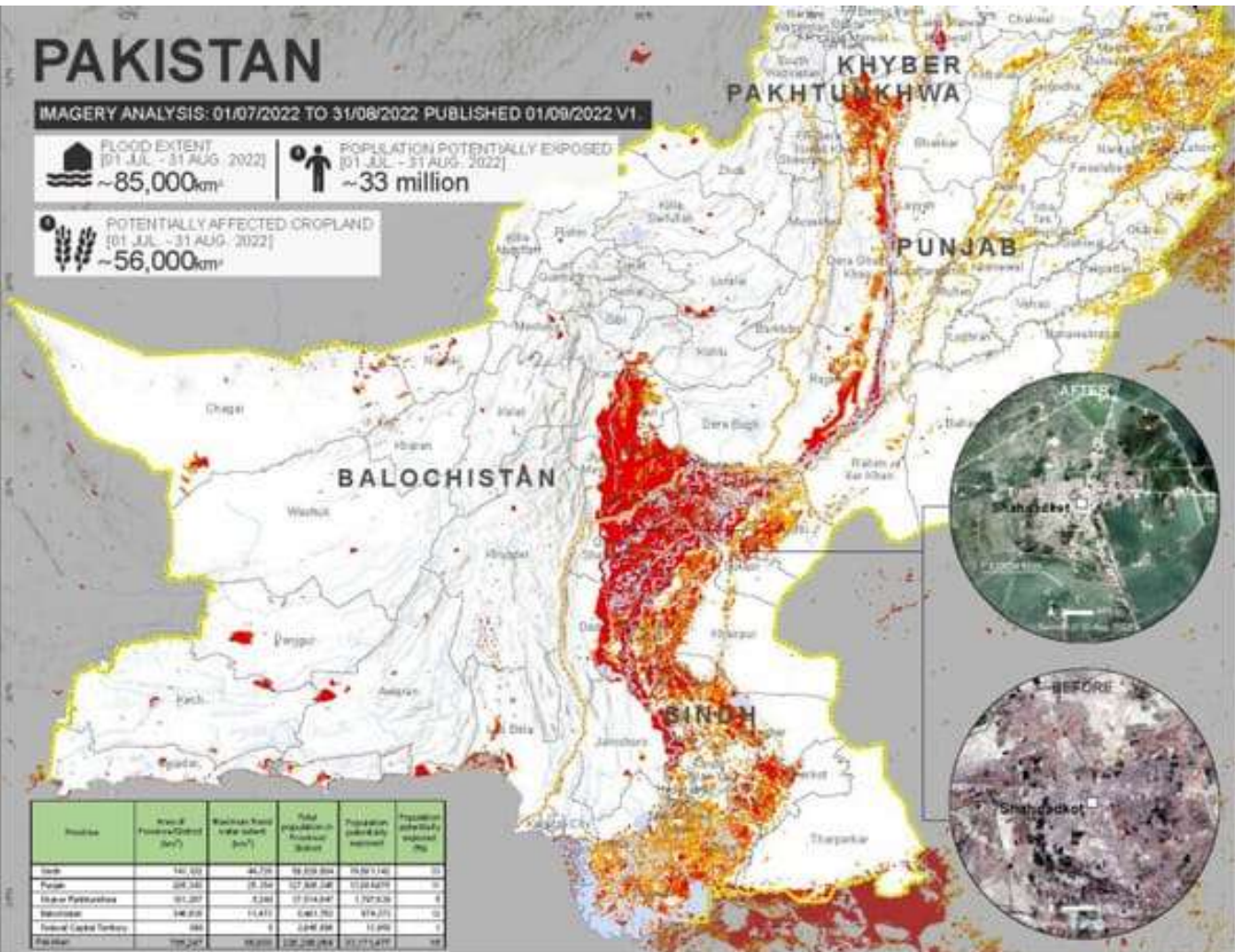

This map illustrates cumulative satellite-detected water using VIIRS in Pakistan between 1 July to 31 August 2022. Within the analyzed area of about 800,000 km², a total of about 85,000 km² of lands appear to be affected with flood waters amongst which 56,000 km² are flooded croplands. Based on VIIRS population data and the maximum flood water coverage, at least 33 million people were potentially exposed or living close to flooded areas in July-August 2022.

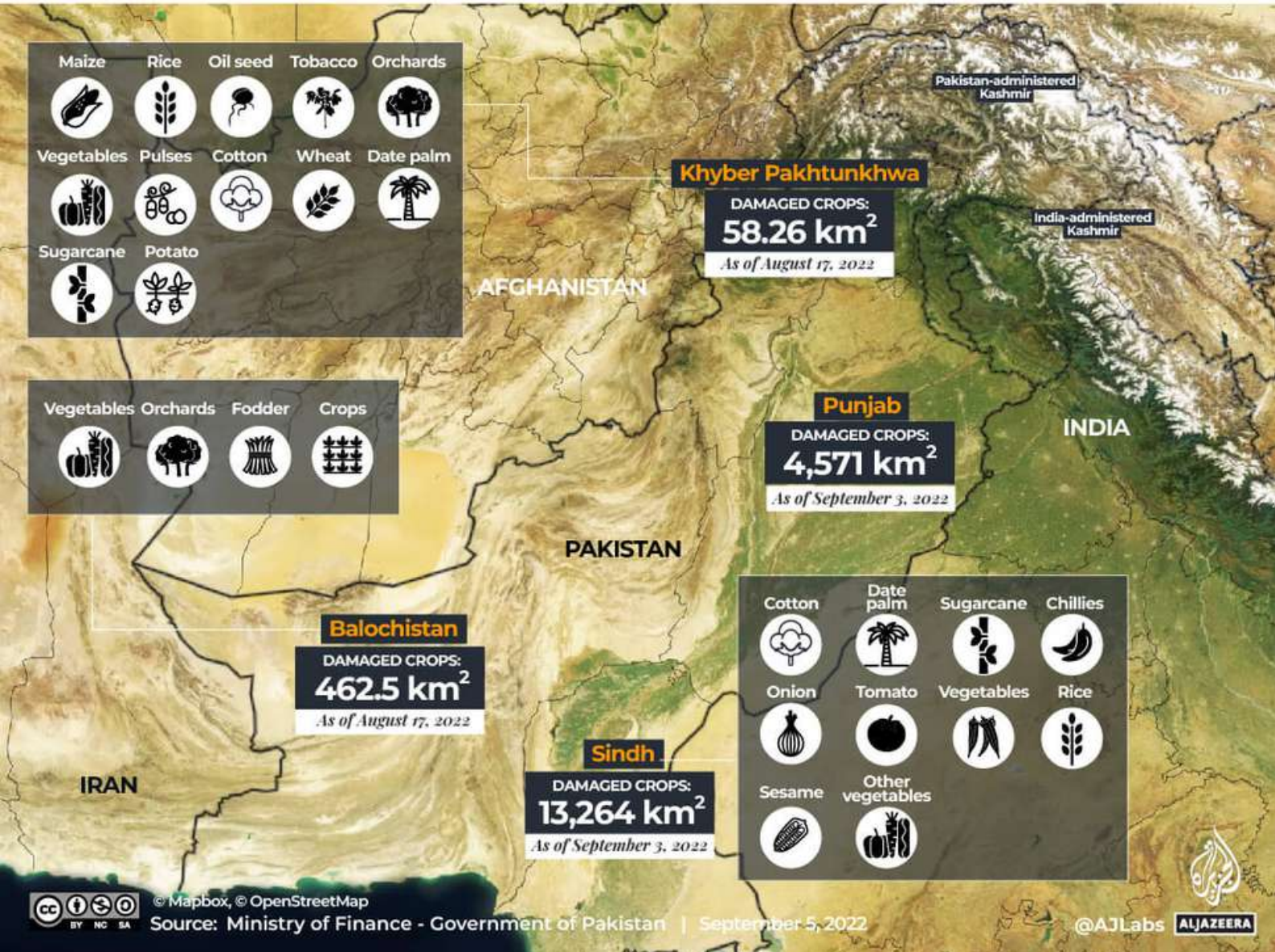
