> Sindh Rural Support Organization Emergency Relief Centre (Sukkur)

Introduction:

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) is a non-profit organization, registered under Section 42 of the Companies Ordinance 1984, working in the rural areas of upper Sindh, Pakistan. SRSO is funded by government of Sindh to work in the designated 9 districts of Sindh i.e. Sukkur, Khairpur, Ghotki, Nausheroferoz, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Larkana, Kashmore-Kandhkot and Shahdadkot.



There are 424 union councils in all 9 districts with a total population of 1,274,000 households. According to SRSO's estimates 79 union councils out of 424 union councils fall in Kacha area of River Indus or neighboring union councils. Approximately, 217,000 households live in 79 Union Councils and are directly or indirectly affected by current phenomenon of the flood.

Currently, SRSO is working with more than

363,000 rural households of which **two-third** (270,000) households are from three districts - Kandhkot Kashmore, Shikarpur, and District Ghotki where 100% poor households have been organized in all the Union Councils of the districts. The Government of Sindh has made huge investments during the last one and half year under the project of "Union Council Base Poverty Reduction Programme" in two districts (Shikarpur and Kandhkot -Kashmore). The PPAF funding in district Ghotki has focused on Social Mobilisation Project through World Bank.

Flood water has entered SINDH Province completely devastating more than 11,000 villages in the Kacha and surrounding area, displacing more than 300,000 households from their villages along with 1,065,000 livestock.

According to the SRSO's preliminary rapid assessment report (the rapid assessments have been done during last three days) the flooding started right from **Guddu** affecting Districts situated at both banks of River Indus namely Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur, Ghotki, Sukkur, Khairpur, Larkana, Naushero Feroze.

Currently, the need for providing humanitarian relief and support in restoring the basic lifeline facilities of the local communities in the affected areas is emence and is increasing as more water is pouring in due to breaches in the protection bunds in upper streams of sukkur.

The population which had moved from the affected areas are in dire straits and no humanitarian agencies have reached out to the far-flung areas to meet the basics such as food and safe water. The capacity of the government and local response agencies are already over stretched. The situation is alarming and chaotic.

Mobility, access and logistic support to affected rural villages and populations are the key emergency issues. Restoration of basic community micro infrastructure like; link roads, foot bridges, suspension bridges, destruction of standing cash crops, livestock diseases prevention, irrigation channels, food storage, drinking water supply systems and sanitation are the major problems for rehabilitation.

Our assessment suggests that already over 300,000 households have been directly affected by the flood inundation, destorying houses, livestock, shops, standing crops and uprooting trees in the Kacha as well as in Pacca area where water from the breaches has already started inundating. The

flooding water is entering into houses and buildings, giving little time to evacuate food and non-food items and personal belongings.

SRSO in coordination with the respective District Governments is engaged in relief activities with the support of stake holders at their districts, but is handicapped due to poor infrastructure and inadequate resources.

The affectees to be focused are women, girls, special need persons, elderly and extremely poor through in-kind support activities to restore basic emergency life, while providing Food, Shelters, Clothes, Shoes, Blankets, Medicines, Drinking Water and Sanitation.

SRSO has begun with the provision of Food and safe drinking water from August 9, 2010 starting from Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Ghotki followed by Sukkur and Khairpur. Initialy, SRSO is focusing on about 5000 displaced families and will increase its relief operations as the resource commitment come through from donors.



Strategy:

SRSO has established the following to start the relief work and below information is available on our web site from today:

- 1. Established Emergency Cell at HO Sukkur with dedicated telephone land-lines and fax number with a person present to respond round the clock.
- 2. Designated District Officers/Managers (with Contact Nos. and list follows).
- 3. Designated remote Unit Offices In-charge for the relief work (list follows).
- 4. Ensured that Unit Staff to be available on alternate duties for 24 hrs.
- 5. Established mechanism to prepare Updates on the situation on daily basis and circulate to all.
- 6. Established Procurement System.
- Prepared Vendors list for Raw Material (Food etc), Utensils and other Kitchen Appliances, Tents, Plastic Sheets etc.
- 8. Organized Finance / Admin persons at all level to support relief.
- 9. Organised 20 vehicle pool (pick ups) to cater the need of shifting relief material from sukur to the districts of relief operations.
- 10. SRSO has estabilished the following relief centres and has deputed trained staff for relief work.

This trained staff is conducting assessments at relief camps and hand over a token to the families and provides support to affected families according to the assessment.

SRSO is working in close coorodnation with RSPN and NRSP to raise funds. The RSPN has been talking to USAID for funding, which is ecpected to follow.

Contribution of National Rural Support Program (NRSP and Institue of Rural Management (IRM) in relief work with Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO):

IRM has joined hands with SRSO by deploying 15 employees and 5 vehicles which are engaged in field activities with SRSO teams. Similarly 27 employee of NRSP and 8 vehicles along with the drivers are also working with SRSO in this relief work.

Livestock: this devatating flood has also affected the live stock. According to primary assessment at least 1,065,000 animals had been affected. SRSO has started vaccination and deworming the livestock available in relief camps. SRSO has allocated Rs. 300,000 for livestock. SRSO has hired 5 veterinary doctors for its emergency centre, who are working round the clock.

Meetings: SRSO management called an emergency meeting on Monday, August 9, 2010 at Head Office to develop its strategy for relief work. The CEO shared the situation of flood affected areas which he has personally visited. In this meetings different teams were formed with different assignments to work on flood relief programme.

All the district Managers and their team will be responsible for their relief centre and field activities. They will report each activity on daily basis to Documentation and Reporting coordinators.

It was also decided that daily debriefing meeting will be held at 8:00 am, to review the last days activities and planning of the coming days and to share the situations at field level.

Flood Activities Report August 10, 2010

Physical Infrastructure and Technology Development (PITD):

SRSO PITD team is busy in assessment for safe drinking water and sanitation. In this connection PITD team visited the affected area of District Sukkur and Khairpur. They identified the need of 270 HH for Latrine and Hand pumps. They will start work for these house holds from August 12, 2010.

Meetings with stake holders and Donors: SRSO in coordination with the respective District Government, USAID and WFP and other Donors held meetings to plan the Quantum and volume of the relief packages for the affected. Several proposals for relief are on course for finalization at strategic level. SRSO with the coordination of RSPN and USAID will provide Dry food kits to 21,000 families in five districts.

Mr. Abdul Hameed Bullo conducted meeting with WFP team for warehouses in Sukkur. He also attended and NGO conference regarding relief work in flood affected areas with UN Agencies.

SRSO also dispatched the letters to DCOs for coordination in relief activities and information sharing regarding focal points.

SRSO Khairpur Hub office demanded one vehicle to support PPHI in medicine distribution.

Mr. Abdul Hameed Bullo also conducted meeting with DCO Sukkur and shared information regarding 8,000 flood affected settled in Government schools.

Snake bite and scorpion bite cases were reported, patients were supported to reach at PPHI centers.

District Shikarpur: In Shikarpur District, SRSO Team assessed the flood displaced families camp at Government Girls Primary School 1, where communities from the katcha area of Shikarpur and Taluka Thull, District Jacobabad are temporarily settled. There are 172 families and 1187 persons there. In this assessment SRSO teams registered the families and give them token and arranged food and safe drinking water for affected families.
