Executive Summary

The flood relief effort is in its 5th day and SRSO's main focus has been the immediate relief provided to flood affected through food drives and installation of critical infrastructure at relief camps. WFP food packages have now started to come into the SRSO warehouses in Sukkur for distribution to 5 districts. Beside WFP, SRSO's own daily food ration has so far reached over 47,000 individuals. 12 CLTs and 12 handpumps have been installed in 4 camp locations with 532 displaced people. District government has also asked SRSO to step in and create infrastructure and provide supplies at its own registered camp sites.

A. Emergency Projects & Progress

1. WFP Food Drive

Overview: WFP food drive is targeting to supply 42000 HH with one month's ration comprising of wheat 50kg, cooking oil 4.5kg and high energy biscuits 2.25kg per household.

Execution Responsibility: Distribution and logistics are managed by Nisar Pathan and assessment of household is managed by Dr. Ghulam Rasool. Both of these activities are run by district managers

2. SRSO Food Drive

Overview: This drive is the supply of daily rations to families which are in camps in SRSO's regions. Families are assessed and given a food token on day 1 and supplied with food the day 2 based on the token. The food includes 1kg cooked rice and 15 litres of water per household.

Execution Responsibility: Assessment and Distribution is managed by the district managers locally.

3. PPHI Health Project

Overview: PPHI is providing medical care for Households in various camps with logistical support from SRSO.

Execution Responsibility: The program is managed by Naimatullah Shaikh and on field operations are run by the local Social Service Sector teams at district level.

5. Water and Sanitation

Overview: SRSO is installing handpumps and CLT at various camp locations. This project is funded internally by SRSO.

Execution Responsibility: Sikander Sanam and Yar Mohammad are responsible for selecting camps and mobilizing engineering for installing water and sanitation infrastructure.

6. Engro & PPAF

Engro and PPAF have agreed to work with SRSO to provide flood relief in Ghotki. The project will provide cooked food twice a day to families which have been already identified and registered. The project is targeting 300 households and 2500 beneficiaries. 1000 water coolers and 500 jerry cans are also part of the package. The scope may be enhanced to include livestock. The project is expected to start on August 15.



B. Other News

SRSO management met with DCO Sukkur, PDMA DG and minister Khursheed Shah to share SRSO progress. Government requested that SRSO support government organized camps in various districts and installs the necessary infrastructure at these camps. SRSO will also provide food provisions at the camps. SRSO is awaiting a detailed list of camps from the district governments.

SRSO management held a meeting with DCO Shikarpur along with WFP team. DCO shared the list of relief camps. It was mutually decided that SRSO will work in those relief camps, which will be endorsed by DCO. SRSO team then registered the people in Government High School 1.

Water and Sanitation team conducted meeting with DCO Khairpur for hand pumps and latrines. While hand pumps were not available, DCO handed over material for 200 latrines to SRSO.

Teams of NRM and IRM are engaged in relief activities along with teams of SRSO.

Diarrhea, skin disease, malaria are now common diseases at relief camps.

SRSO has provided 500 bed net to PPHI, 200 to EDO (H), 200 to SRSO Ranipur unit and 400 SRSO Khairpur unit.
