Executive summary

The devastating flood in Sindh Province has badly affected human lives and properties. Torhi Bund breach inundated the vast area of Kashmore- Kandhkot, Shikarpur, Jacobabad and Qambar- Shahdadkot districts resulting in complete destruction of many towns and thousands of villages and settlements, standing crops, basic infrastructure and displacement of the millions. In the result of the catastrophic situation most of the people of northern districts of Sindh including Ghotki, Kashmore, Jacobabad, Shikarpur and Jacobabad have migrated to Sukkur, Hyderabad and Karachi. The better off have moved to their relatives and friends houses while poor and more vulnerable are living in relief camps established in tent villages or government buildings and in open sky.

The latest update of the flood situation is that there has been breach in Begari canal and the Qubo Saeed has been completely inundated and thousands of the households are displaced in current date.

During the rapid assessment SRSO has assess the basic needs of these affected communities. SRSO started its relief work by providing these IDPs, food and safe drinking water and coordinated to other aid agencies for the support of flood affectees.

SRSO Relief programme

SRSO has been operating on the emergency relief programme since last one week but still there is acute shortage of food, shelter, sanitation water and in health and hygiene materials needed for hundreds of thousands affectees and the numbers are increasing as the flood water is proceeding downwards.

During this period of relief operation SRSO has provided cooked and raw food to **51,038 and 9,403** households respectively, the safe drinking water through tankers and installation of critical infrastructure (i.e. Hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps.

SRSO with support of PPHI has treated around **10,809** OPD patients through mobile camp services and also conducting the health & hygiene session with the affected communities in the relief camps of Sukkur, Khairpur and Shikarpur districts. For the live stock SRSO is working on vaccination and treatment arrangements and total service for livestock in de-worming, vaccination and treatment figured to **30,060** animals.

For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO have installed **100** hand pumps and **107** latrines in district khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot and Sukkur relief camps established by the District



Governments in the above Districts in collaboration with UNICEF in khairpur and from internal funds in other two districts.

SRSO is also distributing WFP raw food under "food for flood affectees programme" for **42,000** households in the **five districts** in accordance with WFP approved distribution plan.

SRSO in partnership with the PPAF and Engro foundation will provide relief material to **6,000** affected families of district Ghotki and the package for these affectees consists of raw food items, safe drinking water, sanitation, shelter sheets and the hygiene kits. This relief project also consists of fodder and vaccination material for **15,000** animals. This project material has been procured and the distribution will be started very soon.

A project of UNICEF is in process for the provision of health and hygiene facilities which will be materialized very soon.

SRSO is also working on the strategy of pooling the resources with different national and international aid agencies in order to maximize the relief operation efficiency and is ready to provide in-kind support and facilitate the relief operation being carried out by other organizations working for the flood affected people in SRSO operational area.

The international agencies willing for collaboration include Mercy Corps, GOAL, and International Organization for Migration and other local Organization and have discussion regarding need assessment, areas of intervention, geographical locations, implementation plan, monitoring & reporting and audit matters discussed against different relief projects.



A.) SRSO flood relief project progress

WFP food for flood affectees

WFP food drive is targeting to supply 42,000 household with food for thirty days comprising wheat and cooking oil (50kg 4.5 kg respectively) per household.

Flood affectees of the five districts residing in the duly registered camps either by the District or identified and referred by the SRSO to the district government are being provided this relief material.

The security responsibility of this distribution lies with the arrangements taken by the district governments. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

Distribution summary (District wise):

SRSO cooked food support

This drive is the supply of cooked food to families which are in camps in SRSO's operational area of Nine Districts and the basic aim of the drive is to provide food to those which are in remote camps and where government support, other relief work agencies or philanthropists has not yet reached. Affected families are assessed and provided a food token and then food supplies. The contents of the supplies are 1 Kg cooked rice and 15 liter water per household.

Water and Sanitation

SRSO is working on provision of safe drinking water and sanitation facilities and for this tanker services and installation of hand pumps and CLTS at various camp locations are being done. SRSO manages this activity through its own resources. The material for the 200 hundred hand pumps and latrines has been procured.

The SRSO management is of the understanding that health management is very much critical in this scale of disaster.

Engro cooked food distribution under SRSO management in Ghotki District

SRSO has taken over the Engro food distribution in district Ghotki where cooked food is being provided to 300 households (2500 beneficiaries) affected by the flood. This service is provided twice a day every day. These families are identified and registered with Engro foundation in Obavro Tehsil of District Ghotki this service will positively be continued till further relief intervention take place.

B. OTHER NEWS

SRSO management is in close coordination with District Coordination Officers, Army high officials and updates them on regular basis and for distribution the services of the Sindh Police and Pakistan Rangers are attained for safe distribution and to avoid chaos and any mismanagement in the relief camps.

SRSO and PDMA are in close coordination where daily updates are day to day situations are discussed.

SRSO Distributed foods in Jacobabad city using C-130 as all the roads towards Jacobabad are closed due to inundation.

UNICEF Country Chief visited relief camp at IBA Sukkur.

Dr.Zaigham Abbas (President APPNA Foundation) visited relief camps in Khairpur District and distributed700 High Energized Biscuits among the children in relief camps.

ISSUES AND CONCERNS

- Spread of diseases including Malaria, cholera etc.
- * Law and order situation is getting worst in Kashmore-Kandhkot, Ghotki and Shikarpur
- ✤ Destruction of infrastructure including roads etc
- More displacements due to new breaches in the Protection Band and distributaries like Beggary Canal affecting District Shehdadkot.
- ♦ Qubo-saeed, Meero khan, qamber and shahdadkot town under threatfo being inundated.
