Executive summary

The devastating flood in Sindh Province has badly affected human lives and properties. Torhi Bund breach inundated the vast area of Kashmore- Kandhkot, Shikarpur, Jacobabad and Qambar- Shahdadkot districts resulting in complete destruction of many towns and thousands of villages and settlements, standing crops, basic infrastructure and displacement of the millions. In the result of the catastrophic situation of the people of above districts and people from Ghotki, Sukkur, Khairpur and Naushehro Feroze are displaced.

The latest update of the flood situation is that there has been a breach in Begari canal and Qubo Saeed has been completely inundated and thousands of households are displaced currently.

During its rapid assessment SRSO has assessed the basic needs of these affected communities. SRSO started its relief work by providing these IDPs food and safe drinking water and coordinated with other aid agencies for support of flood affectees.

SRSO Relief programme

SRSO has been operating an emergency relief programme since August 09 but there is still an acute shortage of food, shelter, sanitation, clean water and health and hygiene materials, needed for hundreds of thousands affectees and the numbers are increasing as the flood water is proceeding downwards.

During this period of relief operation SRSO has provided cooked and raw food to **51,038 and 9,403** households respectively, safe drinking water through tankers and installation of critical infrastructure (i.e. Hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps.

SRSO with support of PPHI has treated around **10,809** OPD patients through mobile camp services and also conducted health & hygiene sessions with the affected communities in the relief camps of Sukkur, Khairpur and Shikarpur districts. For live stock SRSO is working on vaccination and treatment arrangements and total service for livestock in de-worming, vaccination and treatment totaled **30,060** animals.

For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO has installed **100** hand pumps and **107** latrines in district Khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot and Sukkur relief camps established by the District Governments in the above districts in collaboration with UNICEF and from its internal funding.



SRSO is also distributing WFP raw food under "food for flood affectees programme" for **42,000** households in the **five districts** in accordance with WFP approved distribution plan.

SRSO in partnership with the PPAF and Engro foundation will provide relief material to **6,000** affected families of district Ghotki and the package for these affectees consists of raw food items, safe drinking water, sanitation, shelter sheets and the hygiene kits. This relief project also consists of fodder and vaccination material for **15,000** animals. This project material has been procured and the distribution will start very soon.

A project of UNICEF "WASH for flood affectees" has been started where CLTS, Hand Pumps, Hygiene kits will be provided and sessions of the affected communities will be conducted in order to aware them regarding health and hygiene issues.

SRSO is also working on the strategy of pooling resources with different national and international aid agencies in order to maximize the relief operation efficiency and is ready to provide in-kind support and facilitate the relief operation being carried out by other organizations working for the flood affected people in SRSO operational area.

The international agencies willing for collaboration include Mercy Corps, GOAL, and International Organization for Migration and other local organizations. SRSO is holding discussion regarding need assessment, areas of intervention, geographical locations, implementation plan, monitoring & reporting and audit matters for different relief projects.



A.) SRSO flood relief project progress

WFP food for flood affectees

WFP food drive is targeting to supply 42,000 household with food for thirty days comprising wheat and cooking oil (50kg 4.5 kg respectively) per household.

Flood affectees of the five districts residing in the duly registered camps either by the District or identified and referred by SRSO to the district government are being provided this relief material.

The security responsibility of this distribution lies with the arrangements taken by the district governments. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

SRSO cooked food support

This drive is the supply of cooked food to families which are in camps in SRSO's operational area of nine districts and the basic aim of the drive is to provide food to those who are in remote camps and where government support, other relief work agencies or philanthropists has not yet reached. Affected families are assessed and provided a food token and then food supplies the following day. The contents of the supplies are 1 Kg cooked rice and 15 liter water per household.

SRSO-PPHI Health facilitation

SRSO and PPHI have started a mobile medical facility for the flood affectees in order to provide the medical services to the sick, injured and snake bitten including preventive vaccination for different viral, fungal, bacterial and other diseases. This facility will be extended to Kashmore-Kandhkot and Shikarpur Districts very soon.

Except the above SRSO has purchased fodder of more than Rupees One Million which is to be for distributed in Sukkur Shikarpur and khairpur districts.

SRSO with the support of UNICEF is executing the WASH project for flood affectees in the relief camps of Kashmore, Khairpur and Sukkur districts. This project aims to provide awareness in the IDPs regarding health and sanitation issues. In this project UNICEF providing Jerry kanes and hygiene kits containing (tooth powder, cotton, sanitary pad, soap and detergent soap). Personal Hygiene, hand wash, use of latrine and use of soap is focused in health and hygiene session.

SRSO from its own fund has installed 20 temporary latrines in district Shikarpur.

Engro in Ghotki District is providing 50 hand pumps and 50 latrines for flood affected persons. From which 5 hand pumps and 20 temporary latrines have been installed.

Engro cooked food distribution under SRSO management in Ghotki District

SRSO has taken over the Engro food distribution in district Ghotki where cooked food is being provided to 300 households (2500 beneficiaries) affected by the flood. This service is provided twice a day every day. These families are identified and registered with Engro foundation in Obavro Tehsil of District Ghotki. This service will continue till further relief intervention takes place.

B. OTHER NEWS

SRSO management is in close coordination with District Coordination Officers, senior army officials and updates them on a regular basis. There is collaboration with Sindh Police and Pakistan Rangers for safe distribution and to avoid chaos and any mismanagement in the relief camps.

SRSO and PDMA are in close coordination where daily updates and day to day situations are discussed.

SRSO distributed foods in Jacobabad city using C-130 as all the roads into Jacobabad are closed due to inundation.

UNICEF Country Chief visited relief camp at IBA Sukkur.

Number of displacement persons in Larkana is increasing as people shifting from Shahdadkot and Qubo saeed after inundation.

ISSUES AND CONCERNS

- Spread of diseases including Malaria, cholera, gastro and intestinal causing fatal to the children and old-age.
- ❖ Law and order situation is getting worst in Kashmore-Kandhkot, Ghotki and Shikarpur districts.
- Destruction of infrastructure including roads, schools, hospitals, communication installations.
- ❖ More displacements due to new breaches in the Protection Band and distributaries like Beggary Canal affecting District Shehdadkot.
- Qubo-saeed, Meero Khan, qamber and Shehdadkot town under threat of being inundated.
