Executive Summary

The last worst- affected in SRSO are district is the Qamber/Shehdadkot. The water, which breached Thori embankment on August 7 reached Dadu district after devastating kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad and Shehdadkot inundating hundreds of villages and small towns include Jacobabad city, Thull and others. The people have started moving to safer places towards Larkana, and hilly tracks of *Kacho* area. The population migrated to hilly tracks have been cut from land road access and have become more vulnerable to food, shelter, water, and health. WFP is trying to reach them with food dropping through helicopters. However, the scale of support required is too large than the droppings being made.

The overall economical loss incurred due to this disaster has still not been estimated and reported. This area has been considered very much rich in fisheries and rice crop, sugar cane and other cash crops. The funds for the relief work, so far allocated, by the government and non government organizations and international donors doesn't seem to be sufficient for the affectees which are living in the established relief camps.

The situation of district Dadu is becoming worst day by day and the number of IDPs is increasing in Larkana due more inundation in Dadu and KN shah. The increasing number of IDPs resultantly requires more relief work in Larkana which is already full of IDPs.

The reported cases of births in relief camps and the health and diet issues of the pregnant women are of great concern for all of us and specifically in these un-hygienic conditions. The increasing ratio of death cases due to hunger, diarrhea, gastro and other diseases needs immediate attention of the authorities and relief workers. The hospitals of Sukkur, khairpur and Larkana are overcrowded and do not have capacity and the number of cases reported for severe dehydration, gastro and malnutrition are in hundreds in a day in each district. The space of hospitals has become insufficient and this section also needs to be focused more to save the children and weak portion of the IDPs which is around fifty percent and situation needs more medicines, expert doctors, support staff and emergency hospitals for the IDP packed districts khairpur, Sukkur and Larkana.

The planning needs to be done for the recovery and rehabilitation of the flood affected people.



As of Sep 9, 2010 SRSO has provided cooked food to **922,000** individuals (funded by SRSO, Engro & GoS and district governments of Khairpur & Jacobabad) and dry ration of different packages to **505,000** individuals (**72,000** families) supported by WFP, USAID/RSPN District Government Khairpur, Individuals, groups, and Engro Foundation/PPAF. Besides, **NRSP** is distributing food in district Ghotki supported by WFP. The separate figures will be included in next report.

The total number of animals provided treatment is around **98,000** and **151** MTs of fodder has been distributed.

Besides this, SRSO is also working on provisions for safe drinking water through tankers and installations of critical infrastructure. (i.e. hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps. For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO has installed so far **223 hand pumps** and **545 latrines** in district Khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot and Sukkur relief camps established by the District Governments in collaboration with UNICEF, PPAF/ENGRO and from its own resources. SRSO is in the process of finalizing the large scale response in WASH sector with the funding and technical support from UNICEF to cover 6 worse affected districts. **80,000** households will be focused with financial support of **Rs.194 million** from **UNICEF**.

SRSO has been facilitating PPHI "mobile medical camps" where the number of patients treated till date is 238,000 (OPD). PPHI is working through its established medical camps on every point of the flood area with the qualified doctors and other support staff and sufficient stock of medicines. PPHI is producing separate full report on daily basis and is available for public information.

SRSO under its regular programme and Union Council Base Poverty Reduction Programme (UCBPRP) had provided microhealth insurance to more than 70,000 households. 60% of them are affected and displaced. SRSO Social Mobilization teams have been trying to reach the IDPs through providing information and facilitating the insured IDPs to reach dedicated hospitals for proper treatment. Till to date SRSO has facilitated **270** patients of different diseases by the Sehat Salamt Card in panel hospitals duly recognized by the Adamjee Insurance Company limited. These flood affectees are the members of Cos and VOs formed under UCBPRP programme funded by Government of Sindh.

SRSO has also supported **20** patients having severe diseases including surgeries and delivery cases.

SRSO through female staff members is conducting health & hygiene sessions with the affected communities in the relief camps of Sukkur.



The flood has severely affected livestock along with human beings; therefore, SRSO started supporting livestock from its own resources. It has started providing vaccination, treatment, deworming, and fodder.

SRSO has signed LFA on August 10, 2010 (one month plan) with WFP for the distribution of **2,432.142 MTs** food items (wheat flour, Edible Oil and High energy biscuits) under "food for flood affectees' programme" to **42,857** households in the five districts and up to September 04, 2010 we have distributed to **39,514** households.

The WFP has also approved the proposals of food supply for 10,000 households for district Larkana and for more than 31,000 families' food facility provision of **5,600 Metric** tonnages of food items. (Wheat flour/ rice, Edible oil and HEBs).

SRSO in partnership with the PPAF and Engro Foundation has provided Dry food, hygiene kits, hand pumps and Latrines for 2,000 household and fodder for 10,000 animals. The distribution of food items, hygiene kits and installation of the hand pumps and latrines had been completed.

SRSO has obtained support of food and Non Food Items supported by **USAID through RSPN** for **7,500** households where food and non food items including flour, cooking oil, sugar, tea, pulses, dates, spices hygiene kits and utensils and distribution of the same has been started from September 08, 2010 and till now the **1,650** households has been provided the same.

A project of UNICEF "WASH for flood affectees" has been started where Latrines, Hand Pumps and **1,800** Hygiene kits had been provided and sessions of the affected people being conducted in order to aware them regarding health and hygiene issues in Khairpur, kashmore and Shikarpur districts. UNICEF has extended the support in the WASH sector for 6 districts beginning from September with material and cash support of Rs.194 million. The project is for 4 months.

SRSO has been providing two time cooked food to the IDPs in the four districts - Sukkur, Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Jecobabad for more than fifty thousand families on daily basis in the IDPs camps established by each district government. The above distribution has been in its final touches and the government of Sindh has asked to continue the support till further relief intervention is made available to the affectees.

SRSO signed an agreement with GOAL Ireland and the project is aimed to provide shelter, hygiene (hygiene kits, hand pumps and pit latrines) and NFIs for the **3800** flood affected families in the worst hit districts in SRSO operational area i.e. (Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Larkana). The MoU of the project has been signed and the proposed completion period is two months. The relief material has been procured by the funding partner and distribution will





be done by the SRSO. Further that SRSO's relief activities except the above supported families are to be funded by the up to the extent Rs. 3.4 Million.

A. SRSO flood relief project progress

WFP food for flood affectees

This program is planned to supply dry Rashan to **42,857** household (in five districts initially) and under second and third MoU10, 000 households for Larkana and 32,000 Households for Kashmore) for thirty days comprising wheat, cooking oil and high energy biscuits (50kg-80 Kgs 4.5 Kgs & 2.25 Kgs respectively and in some cases 100 Kg Rice in replacement of flour) per household. Flood affectees of the five districts in the camps registered with the District Government are being provided this relief package. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

Cooked Food distribution (Sindh Government)

Cooked food provisions are made bases on an MoU signed between the SRSO and Relief Commissioner and upon initial commitment the food facility was to be provided for six days to the district government established camps and the government of Sindh provided funds amounting to Rs. 17.00 Millions. This programme, as per mutual understanding has been extended till Eidul fitr.

Under this programme SRSO has been providing two time a day cooked food to the IDPs in the three districts Sukkur more than 50,000 flood affectees of Kashmore-Kandhkot, Jecobabad and Shikarpur districts in the IDPs camps established by each district government. However the number of IDPs in Sukkur is increasing due to consistent supply of food, hence the SRSO management has decided to supply food to all the people residing in the camps without demanding increased funds with reference to increase in IDPs from the government or limiting the supply to the numbers provided by the district government. For Sukkur the distribution is executed by NIRM staff with the support of SRSO. The above said arrangements has also been implemented in district Jacobabad where government food is being distributed by the SRSO team.

SRSO Relief Operation

SRSO cooked food support (Funded by GOAL Ireland)

SRSO started providing cooked food to the flood affected families from very start of the flood and supplied cooked food to families which are in camps in SRSO's operational area of nine districts and the basic aim of the drive has been to provide food to those who are in remote camps and where government and other relief work agencies or philanthropists has not yet reached. Affected families are assessed and provided food. The contents of the supplies are 1 Kg cooked rice and 15 liter water per household.

SRSO Clean Camps Campaign:

SRSO has started through its senior female staff "the clean camp campaign" and until now six camps of Sukkur city accommodating 546 IDPs have been brought into this program where



cleaning material including Finis, spray pumps and nail cutters ad combs have been provided by SRSO and hygiene sessions are being conducted to make the camp environment conducive and free of diseases. This campaign is aimed to be extended in the whole district. This activity will enable to develop the linkages of the IDP with the government departments such as health and civic services. This campaign is further supported and extended by the NIRM staff.

Malaria Prevention Project

Health Facility under Sehat Salamat Package of UCBPRP

SRSO insurance division has been working to facilitate the flood affectees in order to have access to the health insurance cover which was provided under Sehat Salamat scheme of Government of Sindh extended during UCBPRP to the CO and VO members and for this we are providing guidance including issuance of duplicate identification documents, confirmation of the memberships, facilitating the panel hospitals. The overall insured families are 56,000 in district Shikarpur and Kashmore-Kandhkot and 20,000 families covered under SRSO regular programme and till September 03, 2010 the CO, VO members treated were as follows.

School in Box by UNICEF:

SRSO in partnership with UNICEF is working on "School in a box" project. The objective of the project is to help to re-established learning as the first step towards the restoration of normal schooling following an emergency. Currently three Schools has been established in flood relief camps where one hundred and ninety students of the early educations have been registered.

B. OTHER PROJECTS

- 1. Brookes Pakistan and SRSO in partnership agreed to distribute fodder for flood affected animals in Sukkur District.
- 2. Mr. Irfan Ahmed Shaikh a representative of Science Caravan inducted seven volunteers and a cargo vehicle to SRSO for relief work.
- 3. SRSO planned to distribute 5,000 female dresses from its own resources in the flood affectees on the eve of Eid ul fitr out of which more than three thousand dresses has been distributed and rest are din distribution process which will be completed in due course. These dresses were stitched by the female community workers which were trained in VTECs during vocational skills development package under Union Council Based Poverty Reduction Programme funded by government of Sindh in Shikarpur and Kashmore Kandhkot districts. In addition to this 350 dresses have been distributed in district Khairpur and Sukkur relief camps.
- 4. We are thank full to Mr. Humayun who has extended his support for the flood affectees and distributed **250** utensils kits and has shown interest for the further assistance.
- 5. Federal Minister Mr Fazul Shah Jelani held a meeting SRSO Ranipur team appreciated the work done by the SRSO for the flood affectees in Ranipur.



C. OTHER NEWS

SRSO and PDMA are in close coordination where daily updates and day to day situations are discussed.

SRSO has been hosting cluster meetings of the Donors and implementation partners and monitoring agencies on daily basis where upcoming situations, issues are discussed and planning is being made to handle horrible situation after flood.

SRSO has held a meeting with Planning and Development department for installation of Water Filtration Plants for flood affected. These water filtration plants are portable on vehicle where there is less number of affectees and install where huge numbers of flood affectees are settled in relief camp. The water filtration plant will benefit a population of about 10,000 per day.

Food Distribution on August 30, 2010 at Government Degree Collage Sukkur was visited by the delegation from CNN and BBC along with Mr. Nisar Ahmed Pathan (Operational Manager) Emergency Unit SRSO.

UNICEF team visited the school inbox and shared their views with the children from the flood affected families present in the school.

GOAL Ireland has been involved in survey for the nutrition needs of the children ten years and for this purpose the hospitals of the Sukkur, khairpur and Larkana has been visited.

D. New situation:

Since water is receding fast. IDPs will soon return to their homes as EID is approaching and the relief work will be slowing down. Would the IDPs get proper support while they move back.

What will happen to the infrastructure (water, electricity, houses, etc), which had been damaged already in all the flood affected villages.

How all the Aid and Government Agencies will ensure that the people are not abandoned and the support continues (health, food, fodder, shelter, water, etc).
