The students were facilitated to visit "Mohen-Jo-Daro" the most important and ancient "Archeological Site" of world. The exposure trip aimed at increasing knowledge of students on renowned "Indus Valley Civilization." Particularly about the livelihood of inhabitants of civilization. In addition, the students visited Radio station Khairpur, Faiz Mahal (Former palace of the ruler of state of Khairpur) and IRC Khazana. The visit imparted opportunity to youth to have access to those venues and sites, which have been mentioned in textbooks, and to get firsthand information.



A senior delegation from Government of Baluchistan participated in Experience Sharing workshop


Karachi March 12, 2020

COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE: BACKGROUND, APPROACH, INTERVENTIONS, & ACHIEVEMENTS March-June 2020



The recent outbreak of Coronavirus caused massive catastrophe in 192+ countries across the world. In wake of this catastrophic situation, WHO declared Emergency throughout the world that was followed through declaration by Government of Pakistan. In this context, a National Plan is being enforced immediately to cater Pandemic COVID-19 response through lockdown has been varying including Gilgit-Baltistan and AJK. Sindh has been the first one to impose lockdown across the province that has been implemented as per SoPs.

Consequently, considering the situation, the worthy Board Members of SRSO immediately called an extra-ordinary meeting on 24th March 2020, via Tele Conference to discuss the risks and devise mitigation strategy, and Board decided that SRSO should contribute to extend its support the poor of Sindh through the organized communities in its target districts, and in this regard allocated substantial budget for the support in this testing times without jeopardizing the safety of the employees, organized communities and the general public, thus giving a helping hand to the Government of Sindh.

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) initiated the Emergency Response in the context of the COVID-19 through Community Institutions (CIs). These CIs have been organized by SRSO that have been supporting to deserving persons and households in many kinds. They have been utilizing their savings, skills, assets, and linkages to provide relief services during and after lockdown situation. The tremendous potential and resilience of CIs have contributed to relief services as the organized entity for prevention of the spread of coronavirus and enabling deserving persons to access relief services in pandemic situation. In the wake of the situation arising out of the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19), Community Institutions have responded to the COVID-19 situation with the following initiatives.

- Community awareness campaigns for mass awareness raising
- Ration distribution among poorer HHs
- Utilization of community savings by Community Institutions (CIs)
- Relief assistance through Field Farmers Schools (FFAs) and

ыusiness Development Groups (BDGs)

- Volunteer Services at UC level through Relief Committees and facilitation role in EHSAAS Emergency Cash Program for ensuring social distancing and transparent way of cash delivery to the Beneficiaries
- Awareness Raising of community members against COVID-19 with support of National Command and Operation Center under signed MoUs with 10 district demonstrations
- Distribution of pre-cautionary items i.e. Soaps, Face Masks and Sanitizers
- Support to local authorities in Govt. health facilities and quarantines centers.




COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE: OVERALL INTERVENTIONS & ACHIEVEMENTS



A. RATION DISTRIBUTION

17,164 poor households (HHs) were provided with ration and cash grants.



1,072 households received Cash Grant and 16,092 households received Ration Bags



B.COMMUNITY AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS

30,795 community awareness campaigns were conducted on COVID -19 through **1,820 community volunteers** (community leaders, CRPs, etc.) and **14,073 community institutions** (COs, VOs and LSOs) engaged on public awareness campaigns.



C.THE SOCIAL-DISTANCING

863 Social-Distancing sessions aiming at behavioral changes were conducted at community level in which **10,647 community members** participated and were made aware in SRSO 14 out-reach districts.



D. PRE-CAUTIONARY ITEMS DISTRIBUTION

21,084 Pre-cautionary Items were distributed among the poor HHs of the targeted communities including 15,708 face masks, 3,770 soaps, and 1,576 sanitizers.



E. REGISTRATION UNDER EHSAAS CASH PROGRAME

194,824 potential beneficiaries were registered under EHSAAS Emergency Cash Programme-Govt. of Pakistan in SRSO operational areas by 4, 671 community institutions (CIs) and CRPs in SRSO 14 out-reach districts of Sindh.



F. SUPPORT TO GOVT.HEALTH FACILITIES

3,940 items were provided to Govt. Health Facilities, local authorities set up four quarantine centers, and one private medical center was supported through the provision of cooked food, surgical masks, sanitizers, and soaps.

Community Awareness Campaigns Organized By Community Institutions (CIs)

The community awareness campaigns have been initiated under COVID-19 Emergency Response by SRSO and Community Institutions (CIs) to make aware communities well aware about COVID-19 to undertake preventing measures for combating with the pandemic in an effective manner. Under these campaigns different types of interventions i.e.; community sessions, handwashing activity, IEC material dissemination, and public announcements were planned and initiated by SRSO Teams and community institutions (CIs) at different levels especially in targeted communities of the SRSO out-reach areas of 14 districts in Sindh.

30,795 Community awareness campaigns: 8,535 items of IEC material were distributed ,**1,736** announcements were made using mobile speakers, **386** announcements made using local mosques/ churches/ mandirs/, and **4,245** community sessions were organized from January to June 30, 2020 through **1,820** community volunteers (community leaders, CRPs, etc.) and **14, 073 community institutions** (COs, VOs and LSOs) support and engagement.





Farmer Field School (FFS) is combating with COVID-19 Emergency 2020

During COVID 19 Situation Farmer Field School (FFS) has played a pivotal role for supplying fresh vegetables to villagers. When lockdown was announced and people were confined at home/village, they faced hardship in purchasing food on daily basis from cities especially vegetables. The members of FFS were aware about it and they purchased fresh vegetables from Agriculture Entrepreneurs (AEs) that were made available to them economically and free of cost to poorest families. **656 Farmer Field Schools (FFSs)** have been established in three districts (Larkana 221, Kamber-Shahdadkot214, and Shikarpur 194) under European Union (EU) supported Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS) and developed Demo Plots as well. These demo plots have played very important role in the fulfilment of food and nutrition needs of FFSs member and poor families of the area.

2606 poor Households (HHs) have been supported till May, 2020 through distribution of fresh vegetables supported by these developed demo plots by Agriculture Entrepreneurs (AEs) of Farmer Field Schools (FFSs) and demo plots that benefited in 3 districts i.e. Larkana 1136 HHs, Kamber-Shahdadkot 382 HHs, and Shikarpur 1088 HHs respectively.





Community Mobilization and Awareness Raising on COVID-19 under NCOC Agreement

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by SRSO with 10 District Administrations under National Command and Control Center (NCOC) Agreement regarding Community Mobilization and Awareness Raising on COVID-19. In this regard, different activities were started from May, 2020 in order to mobilize and aware communities through conducting awareness sessions and dissemination of IEC material provided by health department/district administration in 10 outreach districts(Larkana, Kamber-Shahdadkot, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Kashmore @ Kandhkot, Khairpur, Sanghar, Mirpurkhas., Badin, & Thatta). Orientation/training sessions of Community Institutions' representatives on COVID-19 were also conducted with the support of the District Health Department, and handed-over IEC material. The trained/oriented CIs representatives conducted the community-based awareness sessions on social distancing, handwashing activity disseminated and displayed IEC material as well in their areas.



Role Of Community Institutions In Relief Committees-Govt. Of Sindh

Government of Sindh formed the Relief Committees in order to provide relief especially ration to most vulnerable families during the lockdown at District, Taluka, and UC level. The notification was issued by Govt. of Sindh and nominated representatives of community institutions as a member, and engaged them into the identification and distribution of ration. Deputy Commissioners, Assistant Commissioners, and UC Chairmen following their domain chaired these committees.

348 special committees with active memberships of LSOs, VOs, and CRPs activists were formed Relief Committees at District, Taluka, and UC Levels. These committees worked in **459 UCs of 64 Taluka and 14 districts of Sindh.**



Role of Community Institutions in Ehsaas Cash Registration Programme



4,617 community institutions (CIs) village Organizations (VOs) 4,132 and Local Support Organizations (LSOs) 485 in 495 Union Councils of 14 out-reach districts of SRSO played an active role in the registration process of **194,863 potential beneficiaries** of the EHSAAS Cash Programme Govt. of Pakistan. The role of CIs in the registration and cash transfer process is as under;

• The community members were informed about EHSAAS Programme and facilitated into registration process through door to door visit.

• On the request of district administration, community institutions (CIs) managed EHSAAS Cash Centers and ensured social-distancing, handwashing, and other SOPs at centers.

• Cls arranged hand-washing corners and ensured soaps, sanitizers, and drinking water facilities or beneficiaries, cash transfers centers, staff, and visitors.

• Cls also conducted awareness sessions, made aware, and sensitized the people on COVID-19 and its preventing measures.

• These efforts of CIs were widely appreciated by community members, media, and district administration at large.
