The objective of this programme is to assist the ultra-poor and very poor in graduating out of poverty on a sustainable basis and enable

women and youth to realize their development potential; simultaneously improving their overall food security, nutritional status and resilience to climate change.

Under the programme, BISP beneficiaries who are willing to start their own businesses will be provided with a one-time grant of Rs 50,000 to start their own business.
