

^{*} The assessment was started on July 17, 2022 therefore results may vary because the villages were visited before the starting of heavy continuous rain falls, so their current situation might have changed in terms of the magnitude of damages. The assessment data is being collected in two ways i.e. through Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with CIs Leaders and members and visits to affected areas by social mobilization teams (SMTs) and direct interaction with affected households regarding the extent of damages/losses. This also involves the physical verification process at the ground level with the affected population.

This information is based on the initial assessment while the final and accurate assessment would be ascertained after the joint damage assessment survey, which is in progress.

PAKISTAN: 2022 Monsoon Floods

Situation Report No. 8

As of 30 September 2022

This report is produced by the OCHA Humanitarian Advisory Team (HAT) in Pakistan in collaboration with humanitarian partners. It covers the period from 24-30 September 2022. The next report will be issued on or around 7 October 2022.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Prevalence of water-borne and vector-borne diseases is a growing concern especially in Sindh and Balochistan, where many districts remain inundated.
- Around 1.6 million women of reproductive age, including nearly 130,000 pregnant women, need urgent health services.
- 8.62 million people in 28 assessed districts estimated to be in crisis and emergency phases of food security between September and November 2022, according to preliminary findings from Balochistan, Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa – including some 5.74 million people in flood-affected districts covered by the assessment.
- Government-led multi-sectoral rapid needs assessments completed in Sindh, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with the support of NGOs and the UN.






Impact of the 2022 floods on agriculture in Pakistan's Sindh Province





Provincial level

The five most affected provinces are Balochistan, Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab and Gilgit-Baltistan. However, many more districts, without an official 'calamity' official level are also reportedly impacted.



Sindh Province

Cross sector

Key figures

- The floods in several areas of Sindh over the past week have raised the affected population recorded by the PDMA to 11.9 million and 2.2 million households, an increase of about 10 per cent, but this has not been reflected in the NDMA, where the affected population remains at 14.5 million, with no change in the past few days (NDMA 28/09/2022, PDMA 27/09/2022).
- 7.25 million people remain displaced, of which 1.21 million in Khairpur, 1.07 million in Larkana, 804,000 in Dadu and 557,000 in Umerkot. 377,000 people remain displaced in camps in Sindh, yet this represents a reduction of more than 40% over the previous week (PDMA 21/09/2022, PDMA 27/09/2022).
- Priority needs include shelter and food, followed by potable water and sanitation services and NFIs (IRC 06/09/2022).

Latest updates

- Water levels: Floodwaters are rapidly receding in different parts of Dadu district. However, the water levels have shown no sign of decreasing in Khairpur Nathan Shah, Bhan Syedabad and Johi districts (<u>Dawn</u> 24/09/2022).
- Population affected: The floods in several areas of Sindh over the past week have raised the affected population recorded by the PDMA to 11.9 million and 2.2 million households, an increase of about 10%, but this has not been reflected in the NDMA, where the affected population remains at 14.5 million, with no change in the past few days (NDMA 28/09/2022, PDMA 27/09/2022).
- 8 most affected districts: Qambar-Shahdadkot, Jacobabad, Larkana, Khairpur, Dadu, Naushehro Feroz, Thatta and Badin were declared the worst-affected districts in Sindh by the National Flood Response Coordination Centre (Dawn 26/09/2022).
- IDPs: 377,000 people remain displaced in camps in Sindh, yet this represents a reduction of more than 40% over the previous week. Larkana is the district with the largest camp population with over 139,000, followed by Hyderabad with 89,000 (PDMA_27/09/2022). According to a survey by SRSO, 50 to 60% of flood affected people in Dadu, Khairpur, and Naushero Feroz districts have either permanently migrated to safe cities, especially Karachi, or at least in the short term (Pakistan Today 27/09/2022).
- Returnees: 3,500 out of around 19,000 IDPs in Karachi are left in government-relief camps, with most having already left to go back to their hometown. 16,000 flood affected people were still hosted at 28 different camps, 8,000 in district East, 3,800 in district West and 3,200 in Malir district (<u>Dawn</u> 26/09/2022).

Food security and Livelihoods

Key figures

- 3.7 million acres of crops remain affected by the floods. While the figure is alarming and the highest among the
 country's provinces, the unusable area has been reduced by more than 20 per cent in the last week. Kamber
 remains the worst affected district with almost 25% of Sindh's total crops flooded (PDMA_27/09/2022).
- 414,000 animals killed, mainly in Dadu, N. Feroze and Khaipur, showing a 40% increase since 21 September (PDMA 21/09/2022, PDMA 27/09/2022).
- Decreased amount of food consumption reported by 68% of key informants (IRC 06/09/2022)
- Access to food and livelihood reported by 14% of the population according to key informants (IRC 06/09/2022)
- Access to markets reported by 32% of the surveyed population according to key informants (IRC 06/09/2022)

Latest updates

- Shortages of fodder continue to be reported (Reuters 20/09/2022), as floods have destroyed fodder needed for livestock feed. Farmers have warned that in the coming weeks, if no relief measures are put in place, they will be unable to provide the fodder they need to feed their livestock (Pakistan Today 21/09/2022).
- Loss of crops: About 50% of the fields remain underwater, according to Jam Khan Shoro, irrigation minister in Sindh (Pakistan Today 26/09/2022). A loss of around 88% of the total expected cotton production is likely to be lost in Sindh. Damage to sugarcane crops amounted to a loss of USD 273 million. In economic terms, rice, cotton, and sugarcane together faced a direct loss of USD 1.30 billion (rice: USD 543 million, cotton: USD 485 million, and sugarcane: USD 273 million) (ICIMOD 09/09/2022).




Key figures

- At least 1,200 health facilities have been damaged, mostly in Sukkur, Larkana, Hyderabad, Mirpurkhas and Shaheed Benazirabad (<u>The Express Tribune 21/09/2022</u>, <u>Pakistan Observer</u> 20/09/2022).
- At least 126 health facilities completely destroyed, of which 65 in Mirpurkhas, 22 in Hyderabad, 17 in Sukkur, 13 in Larkana, 7 in Shaheed Benazirabad and 1 in Karachi (Dawn 05/09/2022).
- More than 3 million people in flood-affected areas of Sindh infected by various diseases since July, including for gastroenteritis, dengue, diarrhoea, acute respiratory diseases and skin infections according to the Sindh Health Department (Pakistan Observer 25/09/2022).
- Only 17% of the population can access health services according to key informants (IRC 06/09/2022).
- Around 30% to 40% of healthcare services without basic medical supplies according to key informants (IRC 06/09/2022).


Latest updates

- Rise in mosquito-borne diseases: 4,000 malaria cases are being reported daily, reaching 162,395 confirmed cases reported in the province throughout the year, according to health department data (<u>The Express Tribune</u> 25/09/2022). At least 44,000 suspected cases of malaria were reported last week (<u>Fleuters</u> 21/09/2022). 4,319 dengue patients have been reported in September alone, an increase of 60% of cases in one month (<u>The Express Tribune</u> 25/09/2022).
- Increase in outbreak caseloads: 605,839 cases of diarrhoea and 666,370 cases of skin diseases have been reported in all the districts (<u>The Express Tribune</u> 25/09/2022). Snake bites are also reportedly on the rise, especially in (<u>Pakistan Today</u> 26/09/2022).
- Shortage of health professionals: Sindh Health Department requested the Health Secretary and the Chief Secretary of Punjab to send at least 380 doctors and paramedics to address the flood-related health crisis in the province(<u>The Pakistan Observer</u> 24/09/2022).
- Negotive coping mechanisms: The overcrowding of medical services in Sindh and the crisis over the shortage of pain drugs has led to negative coping mechanisms, such as the use of alternative and unscientific therapies to treat diseases such as dengue fever (<u>The Express Tribune 24/09/2022</u>).






Casualities from June 14 to Aug. 31




Figure 9: Crop sown areas and damage intensity across the subdistrict (tabsit) level in Sindh (Source: Sentinel-1 satellite image-based flood extent mapping and Sentinel-2 satellite image-based vegetation conditions assessment)




Figure 11: Key vegetable production zones of Sindh and flood extent in the region





As they are running low on food supplies. The delegation was led by Mr. Narwan, DRR Manager of Dompet Dhuafa, and Muhammad Noor and Dedi Fatal were from Dompet Dhuafa, Indonesia. Mr.Hassan Rind from Wecare Organization also accompanied them. They visited all damaged households of the village and met with flood-affected VO members, probed regarding their needs, and finally, they will support low-cost houses, toilets, handpumps, and rations in this village. after they thanked SRSO for visit at flood affected area.







Sukkur: on 4th October 2022 food & Non-food items were distributed among the community of village Garho goth of Uc Akbar Pur taluka Rohri. A total of 41 HH benefited from these items. However cumulatively 41HH benefited from different Villages of taluka Rohri respectively. Nonfood items included Shaal, Clothes, blankets, Shoes, crockery & Chair Pai.
