Meanwhile, all major stakeholders from the district administration, line departments, community institutions, and CSOs attended the workshop especially all key line departments i.e. Works and services, Irrigation, Revenue, women's protection, and Forest Department including; Local Govt, Social welfare, Health, Education, Works and services, Irrigation, Revenue, women's protection, and Forest Department were also part of the workshop. Active Civil Society Organizations and community representatives participated and presented key DRR challenges and issues of the district. Project activities shared in the program under the project implemented by Sindh Rural Support Organization -SRSO and Action Against Hunger-ACF in district Thatta. Suggestions and recommendations were also requested to improve the district Thatta contingency plan. In the last Appreciation, shields were also distributed among stakeholders and the team of the ECHO project for their excellent work.

## UNFPA Team visited SRSO SRHR Sehatmand Khandan Project Kamber-Shahdadkot/October 19, 2022

UNFPA Team members Ms. Byramgul and Mr. Aijaz visited SRSO UNFPA-SRHR under the Sehatmand Khandan at Kamber-Shahdadkot. They met PPHI, DHO, and women's safe house and observed the need of the community regarding GBV, and issues which are referred to further relevant departments.

DPO-SRSO Sasui Lohar briefed the UNFPA project and its whole structure and how different partners i.e. SRSO, RSPN, Aahung, and LAS are connected to achieve the goal of the project. She told that IEC material and technical support are given by RSPN and Aahung. The team was interested to work on AYFS as well and suggested adding socio-psychological support (Psychologist) to young women, focus for the community was to provide health services and improve SRHR services.



## Project Director PINS-ER-3 visits SRSO Larkana/October 07, 2022

Program Director EU funded RSPN Led PINS-ER-3 Mr. Mudasir Ahmad accompanied by Rao Ayub Senior Technical Manager ACF/RSPN and Mr. Abdullah Audit & Compliance Manager RSPN Islamabad visited PINS interventions undertaken by Sindh Rural Support Organization in district Larkana.

They visited 3 locations in district Larkana where they meet with goat beneficiaries and observed the procurement process of goats. RSPN team visited Village Ghulam Hussain where AWSS was initiated through a Gravitational flow of water from 2400 ft. On 3rd location, they observed the going sanitation scheme at settlement Piaro Khaskheli and conducted a dialogue with VO members on all interventions of a program, especially on HH KG.

Mr. Jamal Mustafa Shoro (SRSO RGM) Mr. Hamid Ali Magsi (PM-SRSO), DM, and DPO team were also part of the visit.

# BEP (Rural Market Test Project)

## Training on Project Introduction and Implementation Strategy for 3rd Phase CRPs

*Kamber-Shahdadkot/October 19 and 20, 2022*



Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) Kamber-Shahdadkot held 2 days of Training on Project Introduction and Implementation Strategy for third-phase CRPs under the BEP Project. A total of 35 Female CRPs from 3 Talukas i.e. Kamber, Miro Khan, and Sijwal Junejo of district Kamber-Shahdadkot attended this training. 1st-day Training following agenda points was discussed in detail;

1) introduction of project, social mobilization, supply chain management, order placing, delivery mechanism, and storage guidelines for BEP products.

2) reasons behind malnutrition and ways of addressing these issues, 3) roles and responsibilities of Community resource persons (CRPs). 4) detailed Information on the BEP product, its ingredients, and methods of use, and 5) understanding the process of registration, Identification of malnourished Pregnant and lactating women through MUAC measurement.

The second day of CRPs training continued and focused briefly on project activities. The following agendas were deeply discussed by facilitators.

1) How to conduct Household/follow-up visits for the sale of BEP (Wellma). 2) Marketing and communication skills. 3) Introduction of marketing material/IEC material (pictorial flipbook). And 3) Reporting mechanism (how to fill weekly and monthly formats).

Ms. Abida Channa (DPO-BEP-SRSO) and Mr. Badar ul Islam (RSPN) conducted training, meanwhile, Ms. Ayesha Program Manager (BEP) remained a key observer of training and provided technical support. On the last, all CRPs were awarded certificates.

## Launched the Basket of Goods (BOG)

*Kamber-Shahdadkot/October 13, 2022*

SRSO under the BEP (Balanced Energy Protein) Project WELLMA sachets' Launching was done successfully for malnutrition women in First Phase in district Kamber-Shahdadkot and has achieved better results. Based on achievements, added a set of some goods to our basket like; soap, sanitary pads, and PT strips.

For this purpose on October 13, 2022, launched The Basket of Goods (BOG) in 5 clusters, where selected CRPs started to enhance their sales in the respective clusters. Looking at previous results of our teamwork and sure the promise of better results will be fulfilled for more vulnerable women in the targeted areas.



## SRSO - Flood Relief Support to 25 Community Resource Persons (CRPs) under BEP (Balanced Energy Protein) Project

*Kamber-Shahdadkot/October 11, 2022*



Post rain and flood the rural community suffer not only do they face calamity in the shape of damages caused to their property i.e. houses, agriculture, and livestock but their source of income and livelihood is majorly affected too. As they are running low on food supplies.

SRSO Kamber-Shahdadkot with the collaboration of RSPN and Hystra under the BEP (Balanced Energy Protein) Project provided support to 25 Community Resource Persons (CRPs) after the need-based assessment. For this purpose, relief items were provided to them in the form of ration bags, mosquito nets, and hygiene kits at the field unit Nasirabad. Mr. Asad Ali Jatoti (DM-SRSO) and Ms. Abida Channa (DPO-PEP) were present during the distribution.



# 4-Days Youth Champions Training under UNFPA-SRHR Sehatmand Khandan Project

Kamber-Shahdadkot/October-10-13, 2022

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) Kamber-Shahdadkot has started the Youth Champions Training on “Community Engagement for Promotion of Sexual and Reproductive Rights and Improve their Access to SRHR services” under UNFPA-SRHR the Sehatmand Kandan Project. Total of 470 youth from different talukas of the district will be selected and trained on SRHRs and each training consists of 4 days of extensive learning and engagement of youth.

The first four days of training of selected New Youth Champions (YCs) of taluka Miro Khan and Kamber were organized successfully on October 10 to 13, 2022 at SRSO District Office Kamber, in which 43 YCs (21 Girls and 22 Boys) from UCs Tharo Wadho, Gul Muhammad Chacho, and Abri attended this training.

All sessions were conducted through participatory and interactive training methodology by trained master trainers of SRSO. The participants were engaged in groups, plenary, and individually as well as drama, drawing, documentary, group work, and presentation as per the RSPN agenda and toolkit by UNFPA Youth Development Officers.

Understanding of Human Rights, Gender and Gender Based Violence, Early child marriages, its existing law of Sindh 2013 consequences and impact, Puberty, term health, SRHR, and birth space briefed by DPO. Below mentioned sequence of sessions is arranged.

- 1) Self Esteem, 2) Communication, 3) Puberty, 4) Early Child marriages
- 5) Gender, 6) Gender-Based Violence, 7) Human Rights and 8) SRHR

Last day, Ms. Almas Akbar Project Manager, and Ms. Saima Shaikh Coordinator RSPN-UNFPA-SRHR Project also visited the training and distributed certificates among the participants. Meanwhile, different stakeholders mainly; Mr. ADHO Syed Habib Shah (Health Department), Mr. Karim Bux Mangi (Pathfinder), and Mr. Tashkeel Ahmed (Legal Aid Society) of the project also visited the training and observed the training process and interacted with participants and shared their views and role in the project and youth and reproductive health rights.

Mr. Asad Ali Jatoti DM SRSO Kamber-Shahdadkot inaugurated the training. Meanwhile, Ms. Sasui Lohar DPO-SRSO- UNFPA-SRHR the Sehatmand Kandan Project is the key facilitator of training and other Youth Development Officers (YDOs) are facilitating different sessions as co-facilitator. At present, SRSO is implementing The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) funded Community Engagement for the Promotion of Reproductive Health Rights (RHR) of Youth and Improve their Access to Reproductive Health (RH) Services under Sehat Mand Khaandaan Project in collaboration with RSPN in district Kamber-Shahdadkot. The overall objective is to contribute to UNFPA’s effort to support policy initiatives and advocacy for increased investment in marginalized young people, including access to Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR).







# Country Coordinator- Malteser International visits SRSO's Flood Emergency Response Activities

*Mirpurkhas/October27, 2022*

Mr. Fayaz Shah Country Coordinator Malteser International visited Malteser-supported emergency relief activities in district Mirpurkhas. He visited medical camps and relief items distribution in targeted rain-affected UCs of Taluka Jhudho district Mirpurkhas. Mr. Ghulam Rasool Samejo (RGM-SRSO), Naimatullah Sawand (AM-MER-SRSO), and DM-Mirpurkhas facilitated the visit. SRSO Team organized the Free Medical Camp Venue Juman Kapri of UC Khuda Bux-2, Taluka Jhuddo. Where free check-up services & medicines were provided to the 376 Families. First CC Malteser paid a visit to Free Medical Camp, where he checked the token system, documents, and prescription and also did a conversation with the Doctor about the humanitarian situation in terms of health, nutrition, and disease trend analysis. He also conducted short interviews with a few patients and see the process of treatment. In addition, he also conducted a dialogue with villagers about health issues and challenges for survival.

2nd he participated in relief Items distribution where Rations Bags, Hygiene Kits, Tarpaulin, Water Cane, Water Purification tablets, and mosquito nets were distributed among 100 flood-affected families in UC Mir Allah Bachayo and UC Mir Khuda Bux 2 of Taluka Jhuddo District Mirpurkhas. The RGM conducted a session on the proper utilization of water kits and how to use purifier tablets. Mr. Fayaz Shah appreciated the SRSO work with dignity and respect for affected families. At present, SRSO is providing Emergency Assistance to Monsoon Rain Flood Affected Families with the support of Malteser International at Sanghar and Mirpurkhas districts.





# Free Eye Camps for SRSO Staff by Micro-Health Insurance (MHI)

*240 staff members were served*

*Sukkur Head Office & Shikarpur/October 17 & 26, 2022*



SRSO-Micro Health Insurance (MHI) in collaboration with Al-Shifa Eye Trust Hospital Sukkur organized two Free Eye Camps. The main purpose of the camp was to provide eye care services to the SRSO Staff, especially drivers. Doctors and technician staff of Al-Shifa Eye Hospital Sukkur conducted camp and provided services. During camp, doctors checked the eyes and provided medicines/eye drops, chasma, and medical advice for proper eye care and treatment. A total of 245 staff members (208 males and 37 females) were treated for OPD.

1st camp was organized on October 14, 2022, at SRSO Complex Sukkur. A total of 164 staff members (141 males and 17 females) were treated for OPD, and 11 cases (7 males and 4 females) and 01 IPD were referred for further treatment during one day camp. Col. Hidayatullah TI(M) Administrator ASTEH Sukkur also visited the camp.

2nd One-day-Eye Camp on October 26, 2022, at SRSO district Office Shikarpur. A total of 81 staff members (67 males and 14 females) were treated for OPD.

SRSO-Staff appreciated the joint efforts of Al-Shifa Eye Trust Hospital and the SRSO management especially the Insurance Section in arranging an eye camp to provide much-needed health care. Mr. Rashid Bhatti (SRSO-MHI Manager) and the MHI team facilitated the staff and Al-Shifa Team in managing the camp. He thanked the Al-Shifa team, SRSO management, and administration for their support and facilitation.





## PRODUCTIVE ASSETS DISTRIBUTION AMONG THE ULTRA-POOR FAMILIES OF SHIKARPUR AND KASHMORE@KANDHKOT DISTRICTS

At present, SRSO is implementing National Poverty Graduation Programme (NPGP), with the funding of The International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), in Shikarpur and Kashmore@Kandhkot districts. The overall goal of the Programme is to assist the ultra-poor and very poor in graduating out of poverty on a sustainable basis, simultaneously improving their overall food security, nutritional status, and resilience to climate change.



On October 28, 2022 Provision of 112 productive assets (Calves) to targeted BISP beneficiaries in taluka Shikarpur, Khanpur & Garhi Yaseen of Shikarpur, and 50 calves of district Kashmore-Kandhkot in taluka Kashmore & Tangwani, to improve their lives & livelihoods

On October 26, 2022, the SRSO Shikarpur transferred 08 tangible assets other than LS (Kiryana Shop) items to the ultra-poor families of BISP beneficiaries under the NPGP funded by IFAD GM-MF and RGM-SRSO joined the distribution ceremony.

On October 25, 2022, SRSO distributed vaccinated 72 Calves to BISP beneficiaries in taluka Kandhkot & Tangwani of dist Kashmore-Kandhkot to empower rural women with the provision of productive assets & skills to improve their lives and livelihoods.

October 21, 2022 SRSO distribution of productive assets (Grocery Shop Items) as a grant to 10 rural women of Shikarpur to improve their lives and livelihood.

On October 20, 2022, for the economic empowerment of rural women, SRSO distributed vaccinated 57 Calves to ultra-poor women of dist Shikarpur.

October 18, 2022 SRSO Shikarpur distributed 140 tangible assets (Heifer's) to the ultra-poor families of BISP beneficiaries of 3 talukas i.e. Shikarpur, Lakhi, and Khanpur of district Shikarpur.

On October 14, 2022 SRSO District Kashmore @Kandhkot handed over Tangible Assets to 79 Ultra Pooors Households. Two distribution ceremonies were organized first at village Markh UC Ghouspur and 2nd at village Ali Shir Colo UC Aakhero Taluka Kandhkot.

On October 12, 2022 SRSO Shikarpur office, distributed 97 tangible assets (Heifer's) to the ultra-poor families Ms. Saima Khan & Mr. Muhammad Ahmed from NPGP-PIU ( Islamabad) were also present and observed the distribution process.

On October 11, 2022 SRSO District Kashmore transferred 21 Tangible Assets to Ultra Poor Families. Ms. Saima Tabasum and Mr. Mohammed Ahmed from NPGP PMU Islamabad Participated in Distribution Point at Ahmed Khan Cattle Farm Mitha Chowk Kandhkot



## **SUCCESS STORY of Ms. Nooran w/o Jumo Khan**

***"We can't save people from poverty by giving money, but we can get them out by giving them consciousness"***

Ms. Nooran w/o Jumo Khan, resident of Village Abdullah Domki UC Qais Ali Bilawal has tremendously improved herself and her family with the help of SRSO PO of PPAF, Ms. Nooran has 5 children her eldest son married an educated girl, and moved to his father-in-law, Ms. Nooran's eldest son was one of the few sources of income, but after marriage, he left his parents out. It was difficult for Ms. Nooran's husband to bear all expenses of the house, and he had to pull the donkey cart because he had no choice but to do so.

During the interview, Ms. Nooran w/o Jumo Khan said that, "I am a naive and poor woman I teach the Quran to the children of my village, my son left me after his marriage he was the only good resource of income to me, he used to come to see me, but I never showed him my condition, my second son is very sincere and kind to us, he always asks me to open him a shop or set him some business but, I did not have the money for it, my husband and I earn very little from the donkey cart, stitching, and rili art. Seeing us in such dire straits, my two daughters started working on the land of the landowner, I remained silent and kept praying for help, and Allah answered all my prayers with the great visit of SRSO PO of PPAF".

"SRSO's (PO of PPAF) team visited the village, and they went from house to house, to record data on the extremely poor to which my name was added too, I asked them to give me a motorcycle loader for my son, a few days later SRSO's (PO of PPAF) teams came back to us and asked us to form a committee of three members, and after all processes, I got a motorcycle loader of PKR. 96,000 for my son, (60,000 given by SRSO PO of PPAF, and I had added the remaining 36,000 from my income)".

Talking about her loader income, she happily said, "My son earns PKR. 1000 to 1500 per day from the loader, now we can eat good food, and I saved 20,000 from loader income and started two new businesses, one of my businesses is of wheat and rice trade, and I utilize my donkey cart and loader for too, I have installed a weighing scale in my house; I measure wheat rice of all villagers and earn PKR. 500 to 1000 daily, my second business is a Spaza shop which I run at my home and earn PKR. 100 to 150 daily, I am very grateful to SRSO (PO of PPAF) for helping us get out of this predicament and poverty"

After meeting up with Ms. Nooran Jumo Khan I really realized, really "We can't save people from poverty by giving money, but we can get them out by giving them consciousness"

Ms. Nooran Jumo Khan is happy with her assets (motorcycle loader, weighing scale, and spaza shop), and she is thankful to Almighty Allah, SRSO, PPAF, IFAD, and GOP.

# PROGRAMME FOR IMPROVED NUTRITION IN SINDH-PINS-ER-III

Food Security and Early Recovery Support to lactating and pregnant women through providing 147 milking goats under PINS ER-3 Programme

SRSO is implementing the EU-funded "Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh" (PINS) in partnership with RSPN in Larkana, Kamber-Shahdadkot, and Shikarpur districts. The overall objective of the programme (PINS) is to sustainably improve the nutritional status of children under five and pregnant and lactating women (PLWs) in Sindh.



## Shikarpur/October 25, 2022

Sindh Rural Support Organization, District Shikarpur on dated 25 October 2022 under EU funded Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh ( PINS ER-3) provided grants for 45 goats to the poorest Households of Taluka Lakhi and Khanpur identified by Community Institution i.e. VO/LSO. Each HH procured two milky goats to improve the nutrition of under-five years children and a PLW beside that Community Livestock Extension worker also vaccinated the goats to save them from seasonal diseases. Currently, SRSO under PINS-ER-3 is distributing milky goats with an aim of Food Security and Early Recovery Support to lactating and pregnant women in 3 programs covering districts.

## Larkana/October 25, 2022

The people of Sindh already faced the challenge of food security and malnutrition, according to the World Bank report 48% of mothers and children are malnourished. This challenge is increasing after devastated rain flood. Keeping view of this situation, Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) distinct Larkana under EU funded Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS ER-3) identified 147 pregnant and lactating women under 5 children from the most rain-affected areas of the two talukas of the district. Each beneficiary has been provided financial support of Rs 30,500 to purchase 2 milking goats. This distribution was started and completed successfully from October 07, to 18, 2022 in 20 Union Councils of 2 Talukas i.e. Baqirani and Dokri district Larkana. The main purpose of this activity is the availability of milk at HH, support poor women, and mitigate the challenge of food security.

Mr. Mudasir Ahmad (PD-PINS-ER-3), Mr. Hamid Ali Magsi ( Programme Manager-SRSO-PINS), and Ms. Parveen Mahar (DPO-PINS-SRSO) also participated in the distribution and observed the process and talked beneficiaries.

These pit latrines are highly applauded by the community, visitors, and administration.

SRSO-Natural Resource Management Sector (NRM) organized two-days Training of Trainers (ToT) of SRSO staff under Govt. of Sindh-funded Sindh Irrigated Agriculture Productivity Enhancement Project (SIAPEP)-Govt. of Sindh (SIAPEP) on October 18 and 19, 2022 at SRSO Complex Sukkur. Total of 30 staff members (two from each district attended the ToT. The key objective of the training was to build the capacity of the assigned SRSO staff for SIAPEP about the project and its key NRM-Manager facilitated the training meanwhile Mr. Ghulam Rasool Samejo (RGM-SRSO) also talked with participants and emphasized the proper selection of beneficiaries and implementation.

Currently, SRSO is implementing World Bank-funded SIAPEP-On Farm Water Manager-Govt. of Sindh for promoting kitchen gardening (KG) in 15 districts of Sindh. The ultimate aim of this project is to improve water management in irrigated agriculture resulting in increased agricultural output per unit of water used. The project also provides increased nutrition values to the beneficiary household and increases income generation opportunities by selling vegetables other than household consumption.
