


Situation Report # 2 on Flood (2015) affected areas of Northern-Sindh



(July 31, 2015)

1. Introduction:

Monsoon in Pakistan generally penetrates from July to September (One Quarter) and produces widespread rains. While on the other side, early melting of snow and out-burst of glacial lakes have caused the riverine flooding in Sindh through Indus River and widespread rains with thunderstorms producing rainfall flooding in many areas of Sindh Province. At the present, the northern districts of Sindh province experiencing high level of flooding in Indus River and the projected rainfalls. Regarding recent rainfall & flood the PMD and PDMA has already issued alerts/warning to make required arrangements before any unforeseen situation.




The current flood/rainfall situation report of northern districts of Sindh province where SRSO have been working over the period of 12 years, briefly describes the initial rapid information with respect to the conditions prevailing in these northern districts during the existing floods and rainfalls respectively. Report also provides a quick view of possible support and threats could be attributed to each districts in recent perspectives and arrangements made under present-day context. The district wise brief overview of current situation prevailing given as under:

2. Flood and Rainfall Situation in Northern Districts of Sindh Province:

Flood situation in Sukkur:

- At present District Sukkur observes high level of floods in Indus River causing/reporting no such damages initially. Current crossing 539,000 cusec water from Sukkur Barrage
- The Situation of protective Band in district Sukkur reported controlable, yet all precautionary arrangements are being under-going to make it adequately safe.
- The District Govt has devised complete plan in order to rescue any situation emerges in result of floods/rainfalls in the district.



Flood Stages

Sukkur Barrage is expecting
735,000 cusec crossing from 2nd august to 8th August which is a High alert level of Flood.

Relief activities in Sukkur:

- With support of Sindh Govt the livestock department established 8 medical camps for animals at the different locations of Sukkur District.
- District Govt also established medical camp at Ali Wahan band for flood affected people and established a tent city for the population who have been successfully evacuated from flood affected areas.
- From 1st August SRSO is going to start livestock Mobile camp at different Band Locations.

Flood situation in Ghotki:

- It has been consistently reported through the local govt and the media that the (Shank) protective Band has started to over-flow the flood water and the local govt have got immediate support from arm forces (Pak Army) in order to take precautionary measures to avoid any massive devastation.
- Currently 700,000 Cusec is crossing and High alert is declared.
- The population living in the kacha area of District Ghotki are evacuated to the Pakka areas at protective band and nearby, suffering with need of shelters, drinking water, food and fodder for their livestock/animals.
- In result of current riverine flood, 06 different union councils and 223 villages have been affected in district Ghotki.

Relief activities in Ghotki:

- The district govt along with local persons have successfully **evacuated the 33,772 person** from flooded areas to safe places in tents.
- Established 7 different camps for flood affected population, which has capacity to accommodate 16,605 IDPs at the same time. PDMA distributed 1 Tent for each family says local community.
- District Govt has successfully ensured the evacuation of livestock, being managed in flood affected areas with the support of respective owners. Reported figure is 7,220
 Animal
- Also established one medical camp for flood affected population at the location Band.
- PPHI also established medical camp in order to provide services to the flood affected people in emergency situation.
- SRSO started Mobile Veterinary Camp at BAND from 27July, by covering area of around 30km at Band. Total 1700 Animals have been Vaccinated and dewarmed till 31st July



. Flood situation in Kashmore-Kandhkot:

- In Indus River, at District Kashmore high level flood being observed inside the protective band in nine union councils of the district. The population belongs to the inside of band areas have been evacuated from their villages and shifted at protective band at different locations.
- In result of current flash flooding of Indus River, 9 union councils and 147 villages have been affected in the district.
- From any of the areas lying in kacha belt have not reported any incidents in result of ongoing flash flooding in Indus River in the district.
- Due to high level of floods at **Tori Band**, the condition of band is declared partially severe and the surrounded population including Ghouspur city and UC Dari are served alert to make possible evacuation.



- As far as the rainfalls are concerned in district, it has been observed very normal and caused no any unwanted situation in any part of the district.
- The District Govt has made precautionary measures to face any sudden situation appears in result of flood and rainfall in the district.

Relief activities in Kashmore:

- The District Govt Kashmore have provided one boat at Tori band in order to rescue and evacuate the people from flooded areas.
- The PPHI Kashmore have established their one medical camp at Tori band and also constituted one mobile team to provide emergency support in flooded areas.

- Livestock Department Kashmore have established 08 veterinary camps at various locations in order to deal with the flood situation and 2 additional mobile units have also constituted to provide emergency services.
- Different local support organizations (LSOs) of respective flood affected UCs/areas have supported the many households in safe evacuation at safer places and also disseminated the messages regarding the current situation of flood in the context of their UCs. SRSO Kashmore-Kandh Team of SMU Buxapur with support of LSO Bukhari UC Rasool Bux Chachar distributed three (03) Tents (Large Size) on dated July 28, 2015 to Flood / Rain affected households of Village Bakho Chachar of UC RBC LSO Bukhari, Taluka & District Kashmore.
- DC Kandhkot supported SRSO by providing 2 Boats which will be used to deal any emergency situation for flood affected community.
- DM Asad Jatoi also briefed ADC Kandhkot on the recent initiatives by SRSO.
- At some of the areas the LSO members have financially supported the local population to arrange transportation for their easy evacuations.
- In some of the villages, the LSO have assigned the responsibility to the respective VOs to assist the masses in safer evacuations at safe places.



Flood situation in Shikarpur:

- Normal rainfall experienced in the District, and no any severe situation reported from any part of the district.
- In result of current flood 2015, 3 talukas, 7 union councils and 45 villages have been affected in kacha areas of District Shikarpur.

Relief activities in Shikarpur:

• At evening July 29, 2015, the district administration with coordination of LSO members

and tapidars established base camp 20 mile band UC Mirzapur and established the flood relief camp for those who have evacuated form kacha area. The District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) provided/ arranged two boat so taulka Garhi Yaseen for this cause. The LSO chairperson and BoD members are also engage to motivate people for timely move to words safer places where government have established the relief camps. The



DDMA is also established the process of registration of internal displaced people (IDPS) at 20 mile band under supervision of assistant commissnor of taulka Garhi Yaseen. In initial stage the 307 households HH/ Families have registered.

- The District Govt has established 2 medical camps and 01 mobile clinic in order to provide immediate necessary support to the flood affected population.
- Livestock department has established 07 veterinary camps for the treatment and vaccination of livestock evacuated from flood affected areas.
- In DC office, an emergency cell has been established by the district Govt to ensure the proper and timely rescue and support to the affected people as to minimize the flood loses in the district. (Emergency flood cell number of Shikarpur-0726-540334).



District Jacobabad has also established an emergency cell to provide real time support to affected people in case of any certain emergency arises in district. (Emergency flood cell number of Jacobabad-0722-652020)

Flood situation in Naushehro Feroz:

- Initially normal rainfall experienced, caused no any major incident in the district during the course of rainfall spells.
- As far as the flood in Indus River is concerned, it has covered most of the kacha areas of the district, but no any incident have been reported.
- 72 Camps are established where 1500 people are living there.
- 110 Villages in 11 UCs are under flood Watr and 8000 population is shifted to Pakka area. Says: District Government. (Emergency flood cell number of Noshero Feroze-024-2448286).

Flood situation in Larkana:

• Regarding the riverine flood, it has covered majority of the areas of kacha with minimum level. And the flood water has mostly touched/reached the populated areas in kacha, hence reported no any severe situation in the district.

Relief activities in District Larkana:

- In form of precautionary measures, the District Govt Larkana have established 11 medical camps and 2 mobile camps in order to tackle any emergency situation in the districts.
- Commissioner Larkana and his team visited Band and participated in Rescue operation however he said it as transportation to safer place rather to call as rescue. Most of people are not leave their homes at this stage and are ready to deal with emergency

situation by shifting to safe areas by their own boats however District Government is available to provide any kind of support where needed: said Commissioner to KTN news on 1st Aug 2015.

Flood situation in Khairpur:

- Normal rainfall experienced in the district, meanwhile no any severe situation reported in result of rains.
- As far as the flood 2015 is concerned, mainly the kacha area of the district are covered under the water of flood. The population of the affected areas have been reported safely evacuated at safe places nearby protection Band with support of district Govt.
- Pak NAVY reached to evacuate people from Kacha area.

Flood situation in Jacobabad:

- In district Jacobabad, the normal slightly heavy rainfall experienced which caused one breech in Saifullah Magsi Canal, resulted more than the 10 villages affected with its water. Medical treatment and shelters are provided by District Government.
- Regarding the flash flooding, no any incident reported during the course of flood days throughout the district.
- Yet the district Govt have taken initial necessary steps to tackle any sudden situation takes place in result of rainfalls or flood.

Flood situation in Qamber-Shahdadkot:

- Normal rainfall experienced in whole district, and no any incident has been reported in result of rainfalls.
- The District Govt have taken all basic arrangements to avoid any situation takes place in result of predicted rains in upcoming days.

2 Relief activities in affected areas:

- 1. Pakistan NAVY is currently engaged to evacuate people of Kacha area from Sukkur, Ghotki, Larkana, Kashmore and Khairpur Districts.
- 2. DDMA and PDMA is currently engaged to shift people at safe places and provide temporary shelter near Band.

- 3. Veterinary Clinics are also provided at District Ghorki, Shikarpur, Kashmore and Sukkur Districts for Vaccination and treatment.
- 4. PPHI and Government Health department also established their Medical Camps at different locations of Sukkur, Ghotki and Kashmore Districts.

3 Relief activities by SRSO:

- SRSO established a veterinary mobile clinic in order to treat and vaccinate animals evacuated from flood affected areas in district Ghotki, Sukkur and Shikarpur..
- Maintaining close coordination with district Govt in various districts in order to assist in implementation of contingency plans.
- Started the initial assessment at various camps for data collection.
- SRSO have started to chalk out a plan with respective LSOs to determine the needs of flood affected people in various union councils.

4 Immediate Support Needed/Required in flood affected areas:

- 1. The population recently shifted from their native villages to Protective band are genuinely requiring the safe drinking water.
- 2. The households shifted at Protective band are also lacking with food items hence requiring food for their families in order to supplement the need on immediate basis, particularly in district Ghotki and Kashmore-Kandhkot.
- 3. Transportation facility to be provided chiefly in district Ghotki to ensure the 100% proper evacuation from flood affected areas.
- 4. More shelters/tents need to be provided to the households who have evacuated recently and don't have any tent/shelter at protective bands in district Ghotki and Kashmore-Kandhkot.
