## Introduction

As a consequence of the 2010 monsoon season, Pakistan experienced the worst floods in its history. The floods have affected 78 districts out of a total of 141 districts in Pakistan, and more than 20 million people – one-tenth of Pakistan’s population – devastating villages from the Himalayas to the Arabian Sea. More than 1,700 men, women and children have lost their lives, and at least 1.8 million homes have been damaged or destroyed. The sheer scale of the disaster and the unprecedented number of vulnerable people requires collaboration between multiple stakeholders to counter the situation.

As the flood waters have receded in many parts of the country, the affected people have started to go back to their homes. Upon return they need support in restoring their lives and livelihoods.

**The utmost priorities for early recovery phase shall be the food, on-form livelihoods, shelter, community restoration, education, health and of course the basic infrastructure.**

### SRSO-Relief operation progress

As of October 31, 2010 SRSO has provided cooked food to **1,351,372** individuals (funded by SRSO, Engro & GoS and district governments of Khairpur & Jacobabad) and dry ration of different packages to **1,790,047 individuals (255,721 families** in total) supported by WFP (**241,221 HH**), USAID (RSPN) (**7,500HH**) PPAF and Engro foundation (2000 HHs) District Govt. Khairpur, Individuals, Corporate groups,. SRSO is also distributing WFP food with the support of NRSP in Districts Ghotki and Qamber-Shehdadkot. (Ref: the distribution figures as separate line item in distribution summary)

SRSO and UNWFP partnership for the flood affected people have planned to distribute food to 252,000 and it is expected that this number will be extended very soon considering the condition of the affected people and their needs.

SRSO has obtained support of food and non food items from USAID through RSPN for 7,500 households where food and non food items including flour, cooking oil, sugar, tea, pulses, dates, spices hygiene kits and utensils and distribution of the same has been successfully completed.

SRSO is also working for the livestock affected by the flood and the total number of animals vaccinated/ treated is **105,003 and 170 MTs** of fodder has been distributed with the support of ENGRO-PPAF and SRSO. SRSO in its KOMAK project has distributed 10000 bags of pellet (animal fodder). SRSO carried out, in the initial days of flood, livestock support i.e. vaccination, treatment, de-worming, and fodder expenditures have subsequently been reimbursed by GOAL Ireland.

SRSO is also working on provisions for safe drinking water through tankers and installations of critical infrastructure. (i.e. hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps. For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO has installed so far **476 hand pumps and 3,987 latrines** in district Khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur, Qamber Shehdadkot, Jacobabad and Sukkur in the water receding villages and relief camps established by the District Governments in collaboration with UNICEF, PPAF/ENGRO and from its own resources.

In UNICEF WASH project 53,643 hygiene kits have been distributed along with the 1000 hygiene sessions being conducted with those families where distribution has been made in order to make them aware about health issues and usage of the items provided and their importance. This project will cover 6 worse affected

districts where total 80,000 households will be focused with project cost of Rs.198 million. This project aims to install Hand pumps, Pit latrines; provide hygiene kits and conduct hygiene sessions for the four months.

SRSO has facilitated PPHI “mobile medical camps” where the number of patients treated was 238,000 (OPD). SRSO has also supported 24 patients in surgeries and delivery cases having severe diseases through its medical pool.

SRSO under its regular programme and Union Council Base Poverty Reduction Programme (UCBPRP) had provided micro health insurance to more than **70,000 households**. 60% of them are affected and displaced. SRSO Social Mobilization teams have been trying to reach the IDPs through providing information and facilitating the insured IDPs to reach penal hospitals for proper treatment. Till date SRSO has facilitated **596 patients** of different diseases by the Sehat Salamat Card in panel hospitals duly recognized by the **Adamjee Insurance Company Limited**. These flood affectees are the members of COs and VOs organized under UCBPRP programme funded by Government of Sindh.

SRSO has provided cooked food to the IDPs in the four districts - Sukkur, Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Jacobabad – twice a day, for more than fifty thousand families on daily basis in the IDPs camps established by each district government from August 22, 2010 to September 18, 2010.

SRSO with GOAL Ireland and the project is aimed to provide shelter, hygiene (hygiene kits, hand pumps and pit latrines) and NFIs (including kitchen sets) for the **3,800** flood affected families in the worst hit districts in SRSO operational area i.e. (Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Larkana). The MoU of the project has been signed and the proposed completion period is two months. The relief material has been procured by the funding partner and till now we have distributed 2000 shelter and Jerry Kanes and started distribution of NFIs and Kitchen sets.

### SRSO flood relief projects progress

#### WFP food for flood affectees

The World Food Programme under the programme “food for flood affectees” is providing dry Ration to the affected families of flood affected area as a quick relief and food security. Under this programme the Ration is supplied through FLAs with SRSO and SRSO-NRSP in the SRSO operational area comprising wheat 40-80 Kgs, cooking oil 4.5 Kgs, HEBs 2.25 Kgs, Sugar 4 Kgs, tea 0.3 Kgs, pulses 8 Kgs and spices 1 Kg and RUSF 1.5 Kgs per household. Flood affectees of the eight districts in the camps registered with the District Government are being provided this relief package. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

## Engro- SRSO Flood Relief Partnership:

### Engro cooked food

SRSO has distributed the Engro funded cooked food to 300 households (2500 beneficiaries). These families were identified and registered with Engro foundation in Obavro Tehsil, Ghotki. This activity has now been withdrawn after provision of Dry Ration for 30 days duly financed by Engro foundation for Two thousand households.

### UNICEF- SRSO Flood Relief Project

SRSO with the support of UNICEF is implementing the WASH project for flood affectees in the relief camps of Kashmore, Khairpur and Sukkur districts in Phase I. In addition to this UNICEF continued support with Phase II in Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Kashmore, Sukkur and Qamber-Shehdadkot in Phase II. Under this project SRSO creating awareness in the IDPs regarding Personal Hygiene, hand wash and use of soap. SRSO is also providing a Jerrycan and hygiene kits containing (tooth powder, cotton, sanitary pad, soap and detergent soap) provisions of water through tankers, emergency latrines bath soaps and cubicles, jerrycans, water purification tabs material in these districts.

### Food distribution Government of Sindh (Relief Commissioner)

Cooked food was provided under the MoU signed between the SRSO and Relief Commissioner Sindh and the food facility was continued for 27 days. The Government of Sindh provided/ committed funds amounting to Rs. 45.3 Million for this project. Under this agreement SRSO has provided cooked food to more than 50,000 flood affectees of Kashmore-Kandhkot, Jacobabad, Sukkur and Shikarpur districts in the IDPs camps established by each district government. For Sukkur the distribution was executed by NIRM staff with the support of SRSO.

SRSO and PPHI have provided a mobile medical facility for the flood affectees in order to provide the medical services to the sick, injured and snake bitten and preventive vaccination for different viral, bacterial and other diseases.

### SRSO- USAID. Food and Non-food Items

The programme was designed to provide emergency relief items to 7,500 households in the below mentioned districts of Sindh which have been the worst flood affected districts. The relief items were packaged into food and non food items that sustain immediate needs of household comprising 6-7 members.

The food items included Flour 30 Kg, Oil 3 liters, Spices 1 Kg, Pulses 3 Kgs, Rice 4 Kgs, Sugar 4 Kgs, Mineral water 6 liters, Salt, Energy Biscuits and dates 1 kg.

The non food items package included kitchen items (plates, cooking pots, Tawa) bath soaps, detergent soaps, cotton wool, bucket, tooth brushes, dentonic powder, comb and pot and mug.

In addition to this, SRSO had also purchased fodder of more than Rs. One million and distributed it in Sukkur, Shikarpur and Khairpur Districts.

### SRSO Clean Camps Campaign:

SRSO has started “the clean camp campaign” through its senior female staff and until now six camps of Sukkur city accommodating 546 IDPs have been brought into this program where cleaning material including Finis, spray pumps and nail cutters and combs have been provided by SRSO and hygiene sessions are being conducted to make the camp environment conducive and free of diseases. This campaign is aimed to be extended in the whole district. This activity will enable to develop the linkages of the IDP with the government departments such as health and civic services. This campaign is further supported and extended by the NIRM staff.

### Malaria Prevention Project

SRSO & GFATM has worked on malaria prevention since last one year in District Khairpur and after the flood it has provided 1,750 nets to the flood affected people and priority was given to families with children below 10 years of age and pregnant women. Further provisions are being considered to save the affected community from Malaria. SRSO has been in close coordination with the donor and we are expecting that the said donor will be extending the project and specific attention will be paid to the Malaria situation after the floods.

### Health Facility under Sehat Salamat Package of UCBPRP

SRSO's insurance division has been working to facilitate the flood affectees with health insurance cover which was provided under Sehat Salamat scheme of Government of Sindh. We are also providing guidance and support in issuance of duplicate identification documents, confirmation of the memberships, facilitating the panel hospitals. The overall insured families are 56,000 in district Shikarpur and Kashmore-Kandhkot and 20,000 families covered under SRSO regular programme and till September 03, 2010 the CO, VO members treated were as follows.

SRSO has held a meeting with Planning and Development department for installation of Water Filtration Plants for flood affected. These water filtration plants can be moved on vehicle from where there are less

number of affectees and installed where huge numbers of flood affectees are settled in relief camp. The water filtration plant will benefit a population of about 10,000 per day.

### **Water Filter plants project- Government of Sindh**

SRSO with the support of GoS is installing 40 filter plants having capacity to filter 10,000 liters per day which will provide sufficient drinking water to the flood affected families of Khairpur, Sukkur, Shikarpur, Jacobabad and Qamber Shehdadkot districts.

Ten plants have been installed and have started working. The overall project cost is Rs 37.00 million.





**UNICEF Education Project:**

SRSO in partnership with UNICEF is working on “School in a box” project. The objective of the project is to help to re-established learning as the first step towards the restoration of normal schooling following an emergency.

**DFID-KOMAK Early recovery project.**

SRSO with the support of DFID (through RSPN), funded by USAID, will be implementing the Early Recovery Project. The estimated cost of the project is Rs.148 million. The DFID-RSPN KOMAK project aims to provide emergency shelter, health care and safe WASH services and support for early recovery needs to a total of 153,360 households across Pakistan and for Sindh the twelve worst floods hit districts have been selected. The project aims to provide, in relief activities, the emergency shelter, hygiene and clean drinking water.

For the early recovery it is aiming to provide support in WASH, shelter and food security.

The project activities include provision of clean water kits, Hand pumps, hygiene kits, pit latrines, medicated mosquito nets, emergency shelters, animal food supplements and conducting hygiene promoting awareness sessions. The said activities shall be targeting some 55,744 households (all interventions separately counted) in SRSO operational area. The project covers twelve districts of Sindh whereas SRSO will be implementing project activities in eight Districts namely Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Larkana, Qamber Shehdadkot, Khairpur, Sukkur and Ghotki.
