Executive Summary

Sindh is the worst-affected province with 19 out of 23 districts ravaged as flood waters swell the ranging Indus River to 40 times of its usual volume. The region's worst flooding has displaced more than 2 million people in the operational area of SRSO (i.e. Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Qamber Shahdad Kot, Ghotki, Sukkur, Larkana, Khairpur and N'Feroze) the livestock affected in this disaster is 15 million animals, the basic source of income and main asset of the affectees except the agricultural crops which has already been inundated. Half of the population affected is children and vast majority displaced from their homes and villages are struggling to find secure shelter on a water- and mud-choked landscape. The latest hit district is the Qambar/Shahdadkot. The water, which left Thori breach 25 day ago had reached to this district devastating 20 UCs and small towns. The people have started moving to safer places towards Larkana, Dadu, and hilly tracks of Kacho area. The population migrated to hilly tracks have been cut from land road access and have become more vulnerable to food, shelter, water, and health. WFP is trying to reach them with food dropping through *helis*. However, the scale of support required is too large than the dropping of the *helis*.

As of **Sep 2, 2010** SRSO has provided cooked food to **507,782** individuals (funded by SRSO, Engro & GoS) and dry ration to **312,466** individuals (**44,638 families**) supported by WFP, District Government Khairpur, Individuals, groups, and Engro Foundation. The total number of animals provided treatment and fodder is **85,570 and 194,000** respectively, the total quantity of fodder distribution is **124 MTs**.

Besides this, SRSO is also working on provisions for safe drinking water through tankers and installations of critical infrastructure. (i. e. hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps. For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO has installed so far **196 hand pumps** and **544 latrines** in district Khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot and Sukkur relief camps established by the District Governments in collaboration with UNICEF, PPAF/ENGRO and from its own resources. **SRSO is in the process of finalizing the large scale response in WASH sector with the funding and technical support from UNICEF to cover 6 worse affected districts. 80000 households will be focused with financial support of Rs.194 million from UNICEF.**

SRSO has been facilitating PPHI "mobile medical camps" where the number of patients treated till date is **238,000 (OPD)**. PPHI is working through its established medical camps on every point of the flood area with the qualified doctors and other support staff and sufficient stock of medicines. PPHI is producing separate full report on daily basis and is available for public information.



SRSO under its regular programme and Union Council Base Poverty Reduction Programme (UCBPRP) had provided microhealth insurance to more than 70000 households. 60% of them are affected and displaced. SRSO Social Mobilization teams have been trying to reach the IDPs through providing information and facilitating the insured IDPs to reach dedicated hospitals for proper treatment. Till to date SRSO has facilitated **218** patients of different diseases by the Sehat Salamt Card in panel hospitals duly recognized by the Adamjee Insurance Company limited. These flood affectees are the members of Cos and VOs formed under UCBPRP programme funded by Government of Sindh.

SRSO through female staff members is conducting health & hygiene sessions with the affected communities in the relief camps of Sukkur.

The flood has severely affected livestock along with human beings; therefore, SRSO started supporting livestock from its own resources. It has started providing vaccination, treatment, de-worming, and fodder.

SRSO has signed LFA on August 10, 2010 (one month plan) with WFP for the distribution of **2,432.142** MTs food items (wheat flour, oil, and High energy biscuits) under “food for flood affectees’ programme” to **42,857** households in the five districts and up to September 02, 2010 we have distributed to **38,067** households.

The WFP and SRSO have also approved the proposal of food supply for **10,000** households for district Larkana. The third proposal of more than **31,000** families’ food facility provision is under consideration for **5,600** Metric tonnages of food items. (Wheat flour, edible oil and HEBs).

SRSO in partnership with the PPAF and Engro Foundation has provided Dry food, hygiene kits, hand pumps and Latrines for **2,000** household and fodder for **10,000** animals. The distribution of food items, hygiene kits and installation of the hand pumps and latrines had been completed.

A project of UNICEF “WASH for flood affectees” had started where Latrines, Hand Pumps and **1,800** Hygiene kits had been provided and sessions of the affected communities are being conducted in order to aware them regarding health and hygiene issues in Khairpur, kashmore and Shikarpur districts.

SRSO has been providing two time cooked food to the IDPs in the three districts Sukkur (25,000), Kashmore-Kandhkot (6,000) and Shikarpur (8,000) on daily basis in the IDPs camps established by each district government. The above distribution has been in its

final touches and the government of Sindh has asked to continue the support till further relief intervention is being provided to the affectees.

A. SRSO flood relief project progress

WFP food for flood affectees

This program is planned to supply 42,857 household with food for thirty days comprising wheat and cooking oil (50kg 4.5 kg respectively) per household. Flood affectees of the five districts in the camps registered with the District Government are being provided the relief package. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

Cooked Food distribution (Sindh Government)

This food has been distributed under an MoU signed between the SRSO and Relief Commissioner upon commitment the Government will fund the programme to the tune of Rs.11.00 Million as a first tranche of the food support and it has been reviewed and requested by the GoS to continue till other support is provided and the MoU is in a process of signing.

SRSO has been providing two time cooked food to the IDPs in the three districts Sukkur (25,000), Kashmore-Kandhkot (6,000) and Shikarpur (8,000) for six days in the IDPs camps established by each district government. However the number of IDPs in Sukkur is increasing due to consistent supply of food, hence the SRSO management has decided to supply food to all the people available in the camps without demanding further funds from the government or limiting the supply to the numbers provided by the district government. For Sukkur the distribution is executed by NIRM staff with the support of SRSO.

District Government Khairpur has also provided food items to SRSO for the flood affectees. The package consists of: (Sugar 1kg Tea 100gm, Dall 1 kg, Salt 1 kg, Channa 1 kg, Rice 2 Kgs, Bath Soap 02, Detergent soap 02)

Affected families are assessed and provided a food token and then food supplies the following day. The contents of the supplies are 1 Kg cooked rice and 15 liter water per household.

Hope Still Glints in the Eyes of Affectees

Floods and heavy rains in different parts of the country have wrought havoc in lives of people in all provinces of Pakistan. Many human lives and livestock have been lost while the thousands are displaced due to floods. Bridges have been washed away in different locations, communication channels lost, crops destroyed and the livelihood badly affected. The socio-economic and environmental implications are both severe and long term. It is difficult to access affected areas due to damaged roads and bridges. The destruction of homes and flooding of fields has led to mass migration for thousands from Shikarpur, Kashmore-Kandkot & Jacobabad to safer & drier regions.



A large number of people from the above districts have found sanctuary in Sukkur and Shikarpur, settling into transient camps set up at government primary, higher secondary & degree colleges. Under the union council based poverty reduction programme UCBPRP, SRSO-NIRM trained more than five thousand women have received vocational training in different trades. There are also those who



have received Vocational Training as part of Business Development Groups (BDGs) in their respective Union Councils. These women are now in camps and have lost their means of income, which they had increased substantially due to their training in the above mentioned programs. The majority of these women and their children are facing psychological trauma and are in a state of shock over their losses.



NIRM felt that if the women could be engaged in different activities it would help them recover faster from these traumatic events. NIRM was able to obtain a contract from the Sukkur government for stitching 3,000 suits. Two thousand suits were stitched by different BDGs & one thousand suits were stitched at different camps in Shikarpur by women who still had their sewing machine, and had previously received skill enhancement training from SRSO-NIRM under UCBPRP. The trained participants were engaged for one week in stitching the suits and were able to earn PKR 55,000. One thousand suits were distributed amongst 1000 women in GPS Kazi Khalifa relief camp at Shikarpur. The majority of women shared that during this activity not only helped earn money in their time of need but helped them feel empowered and better about their situation. It is felt that in emergencies and traumatic event, activities which can engage the affected can make them feel productive and helps alleviate some of the pain due to their unfortunate circumstances.

OMV Pakistan feeling the corporate social responsibility has joined the hands with SRSO to help out the flood affected people in Khairpur and Sukkur and initially has allocated **Rs. 11 Million** for the relief work. OMV will provide Food for two thousand families that covers around **14,000** people currently positioned in relief camps in Sukkur district. Considering the need of shelter the Company will also provide 60 tents (shelter) for **500** people. Further that the organization has established an employee contributed fund for flood affectees which has reached to **Rs. 700,000** which will be spent on special feeding requirements of the children of the affected families.
2. Brookes Pakistan and SRSO in partnership agreed to distribute fodder for flood affected animals in Sukkur District.
3. Mr. Irfan Ahmed Shaikh a representative of Science Caravan inducted seven volunteers and a cargo vehicle to SRSO for relief work.



4. SRSO is planning to distribute **5,000** female dresses from its own resources in the flood affectees on the eve of Eid ul fitr. The material for the same has been purchased and handed over for stitching to the female community workers which were trained in VTECs during vocational skills development package under Union Council Based Poverty Reduction Programme funded by government of Sindh in Shikarpur and Kashmore Kandhkot districts. In addition to this 350 dresses have been distributed in district Khairpur and Sukkur relief camps.
5. We are thank full to Mr. Humayun who has extended his support for the flood affectees and distributed 250 utensils kits and his shown interest in the further assistance.
6. Federal Minister Mr Fazul Shah Jelani held a meeting SRSO Ranipur team appreciated the work done by the SRSO for the flood affectees in Ranipur.

C. OTHER NEWS

SRSO and PDMA are in close coordination where daily updates and day to day situations are discussed.

SRSO has been hosting cluster meetings of the Donors and implementation partners and monitoring agencies on daily basis where upcoming situations, issues are discussed and planning is being made to handle horrible situation after flood.

SRSO has held a meeting with Planning and Development department for installation of Water Filtration Plants for flood affected. These water filtration plants are portable on vehicle where there is less number of affectees and install where huge numbers of flood affectees are settled in relief camp. The water filtration plant will benefit a population of about 10,000 per day.

SRSO GOAL Ireland-Emergency response:

SRSO signed an agreement with GOAL Ireland and the project is aimed to provide shelter, safe drinking water, sanitation and fodder & vaccination for livestock for the flood affectees in the worst hit districts in SRSO operational area i.e. (Kashmore-kandhkot, Shikarpur, and Larkana). The MoU of the project has been signed and the proposed completion period is two months. The relief material has been procured by the funding partner and distribution will be done by the SRSO (IP).The relief material is expected to be delivered soon.

Mr. Ali Jamil has assured his continued support for flood affectees and also donated Rs. 8.00 million.



Food Distribution on August 30, 2010 at Government Degree Collage Sukkur was visited by the delegation from CNN and BBC along with Mr. Nisar Ahmed Pathan (Operational Manager) Emergency Unit SRSO.

UNICEF team visited the school inbox and shared their views with the children from the flood affected families present in the school.

D. New situation:

- Since water is receding fast. IDPs will soon return to their homes as EID is approaching and the relief work will be slowing down. Would the IDPs get proper support while they move back?
- What will happen to the infrastructure (water, electricity, houses, etc), which had been damaged already in all the flood affected villages.
- How all the Aid and Government Agencies will ensure that the people are not abandoned and the support continues (health, food, fodder, shelter, water, etc)
