## Executive Summary

The worst flood since 1929 have devastated the lives of many people, who have lost their family members homes, livestock and standing crops in the 19 district of Sindh. Millions of the people have been displaced. This poor rural population is incapable of surviving without the relief support.

The worst affected districts in SRSO operational area are Kashmore, Shikarpur, Larkana, Jacobabad and Qamber-Shehdadkot and less affected are Khairpur, Sukkur, Ghotki, Larkana and N'Feroze. The IDPs settlements are in huge numbers in Larkana (its' increasing due to more inundation in Dadu), Sukkur, Shikarpur, Khairpur, Shehdadkot and Kashmore.

The relief support is being provided by the national international relief agencies up to the commendable scale in the shape of shelter, food (raw and cooked) water and sanitation, health and hygiene and other NFIs, however, the scale of the disaster is so huge that the relief work being done of that extent is seeming insufficient.

The funds for the relief work, so far allocated, by the government and non government organizations and international donors doesn't seem to be sufficient for the affectees which are living in the established relief camps.

The post flood scenario is threatening because there are shortages of food, milk, pulses, shelter, water and sanitation. The health and nutrition issues are at its high and the reported cases of births in relief camps and the health and diet issues of the pregnant women are of great concern for all of us. The increasing ratio of death cases due to hunger, diarrhea, gastro and other diseases needs immediate attention of the authorities and relief workers. The hospitals of Sukkur, khairpur and Larkana are overcrowded and do not have capacity and the number of cases reported for severe dehydration, gastro and malnutrition are in hundreds in a day in each district. The space of hospitals has become insufficient and this section also needs to be focused more to save the children and weak portion of the IDPs which is around fifty percent and situation needs more medicines, expert doctors, support staff and emergency hospitals for the IDP packed districts Khairpur, Sukkur and Larkana.

The overall economical loss incurred due to this disaster is uncountable and thus has still not been estimated and reported. This area has been considered very much rich in fisheries and rice crop, sugar cane and other miscellaneous cash crops which has been completely inundated and it is forecasted that the major part of the agricultural land due to flood water can remain uncultivable for many months and from the water will recede it will be very much difficult for the poor Harees to level the land bring it in the cultivable position. This will be requiring support in shape of cash and in kind grants i.e. seed and equipments. Along with this the affectees will need support for the livestock, building house, provision of utilities.

The planning for the recovery and rehabilitation phase of the flood affected people by the Provincial and Federal Government and International agencies is in the process and for this

a property damages assessment survey has been planned where NDMA with the support of Pak Army will be performing this job and on the basis of which the financial assistance of Rs. 100,000 per affected household as announced will be provided.

The WATAN card provision has been started by the Government Authorities and for this, centers in each district has been established, for the initial financial assistance in first phase of Rs. 20,000. However the process is too slow and IDPs are in millions.

The recovery and rehabilitations process will probably take months or years and may add difficulties to the lives of the affectees therefore rapid actions are needed in this regard along with the comprehensive and reasonable planning.

As of Sep 22, 2010 SRSO has provided cooked food to **1,178,089** individuals (funded by SRSO, Engro & GoS and district governments of Khairpur & Jacobabad) and dry ration of different packages to **753,788 individuals (107,684 families)** supported by WFP, USAID (RSPN) District Govt. Khairpur, Individuals, Corporate groups, and Engro Foundation/PPAF and also distributing WFP food with the support of NRSP in Districts Ghotki and Qamber-Shehdadkot.(see the distribution figures as separate line item in distribution summary)

SRSO has signed three LFAs with WFP since August 10, 2010 under WFP food for flood affectees of **9,865** Metric Tonnes for **98,658** households (Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Larkana, Shehdadkot, Sukkur, khairpur, Ghotki and khairpur). SRSO has been implementing the WFP-NRSP partnership on food for flood affectees in Shehdadkot and Ghotki of **6,335** Metric Tonnes for **35, 000** households. The total food distributions will be of **16,200** Matric tonnes for **118,630** households out of which **82%** has been distributed in 45 days.

SRSO has obtained support of food and Non Food Items from **USAID** through **RSPN** for **7,500** households where food and non food items including flour, cooking oil, sugar, tea, pulses, dates, spices hygiene kits and utensils and distribution of the same has been started from September 08, 2010 and till now the 6,820 households has been provided the above support.

SRSO is also working for the livestock affected by the flood and the total number of animals vaccinated/ treated is **105,003** and **170** MTs of fodder has been distributed with the support of ENGRO-PPAF and SRSO. SRSO livestock support i.e. vaccination, treatment, de-worming, and fodder expenditures has subsequently been reimbursed by GOAL Ireland.

SRSO is also working on provisions for safe drinking water through tankers and installations of critical infrastructure. (i.e. hand pumps, pit latrines and shelters) at relief camps. For safe drinking water and sanitation SRSO has installed so far **231 hand pumps** and **865 latrines** in district Khairpur, Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur, Jacobabad and Sukkur relief camps established by the District Governments in collaboration with UNICEF, PPAF/ENGRO and from its own resources.

A project of UNICEF "WASH for flood affectees" has been started where Latrines, Hand Pumps and **1,800** Hygiene kits had been provided and sessions of the affected people being conducted in order to aware them regarding health and hygiene issues in Khairpur, kashmore and Shikarpur districts.



SRSO with the support / funding **UNICEF** have started large scale response in WASH sector with the funding and technical support from UNICEF to cover 6 worse affected districts where **80,000** households will be focused with financial support of **Rs.194 million**. This project aims to install Hand pumps, Pit latrines; provide hygiene kits and conduct hygiene sessions and this project will continue for the four months.

SRSO has facilitated PPHI “**mobile medical camps**” where the number of patients treated was **238,000 (OPD)**. SRSO has also supported **24** patients having severe diseases including surgeries and delivery cases through its medical pool.

SRSO under its regular programme and Union Council Base Poverty Reduction Programme (UCBPRP) had provided micro health insurance to more than 70,000 households. 60% of them are affected and displaced. SRSO Social Mobilization teams have been trying to reach the IDPs through providing information and facilitating the insured IDPs to reach penal hospitals for proper treatment. Till to date SRSO has facilitated **373** patients of different diseases by the Sehat Salamt Card in panel hospitals duly recognized by the Adamjee Insurance Company limited. These flood affectees are the members of COs and VOs organized under UCBPRP programme funded by Government of Sindh.

SRSO through the female staff and NIRM (under UNICEF wash project) is conducting health & hygiene sessions with the affected communities in the relief camps of Sukkur and conducted **142** awareness sessions for the flood affectees where **6,556** participants were made aware of the health and hygiene issues specifically in relief camps.

SRSO in partnership with the PPAF and Engro Foundation has provided Dry food, hygiene kits, hand pumps and Latrines for 2,000 household and fodder for 10,000 animals. The distribution of food items, hygiene kits and installation of the hand pumps and latrines had been completed.

SRSO has provided two time cooked food to the IDPs in the four districts - Sukkur, Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Jacobabad for more than fifty thousand families on daily basis in the IDPs camps established by each district government from August 22, 2010 to September 18, 2010.

SRSO with GOAL Ireland and the project is aimed to provide shelter, hygiene (hygiene kits, hand pumps and pit latrines) and NFIs (including kitchen sets) for the **3,800** flood affected families in the worst hit districts in SRSO operational area i.e. (Kashmore-Kandhkot, Shikarpur and Larkana). The MoU of the project has been signed and the proposed completion period is two months. The relief material has been procured by the funding

partner and till now we have distributed 2000 shelter and Jerry Kanes and started distribution of NFIs and Kitchen sets.

Further that SRSO's relief activities except the above supported families are also funded by the GOAL Ireland up to the extent of Rs. 6.5 Million.

## SRSO flood relief project progress

### WFP food for flood affectees

This program is planned to supply dry Ration to **118,630** household for thirty days through FLAs with SRSO and NRSP in the SRSO operational area comprising wheat, cooking oil and high energy biscuits (50kg-80 Kgs 4.5 Kgs & 2.25 Kgs respectively and in some cases 100 Kg Rice in replacement of flour) per household. Flood affectees of the eight districts in the camps registered with the District Government are being provided this relief package. The distribution is being made according to the approved plan from World Food Program (WFP).

SRSO has started through its senior female staff “**the clean camp campaign**” and until now six camps of Sukkur city accommodating 546 IDPs have been brought into this program where **cleaning material** including Finis, spray pumps and nail cutters and combs have been provided by SRSO and hygiene sessions are being conducted to make the camp environment conducive and free of diseases. This campaign is aimed to be extended in the whole district. This activity will enable to develop the linkages of the IDP with the government departments such as health and civic services. This campaign is further supported and extended by the NIRM staff.

### Malaria Prevention Project

### OTHER PROJECTS

1. SRSO with the support of DFID (through RSPN) will be implementing the KOMAK project targeting 6500 new families. The estimated cost of the project is Rs.148 million.

The DFID-RSPN KOMAK project aims to provide emergency shelter, health care and safe WASH services and support for early recovery needs to a total of 153,360 households across Pakistan and for Sindh the twelve worst flood hit districts have been selected.



The project is aimed to support in relief activities by providing emergency shelter, hygiene and clean water.

For the early recovery it is aiming to provide support in WASH, shelter and food security.

The project activities include provision of clean water kits, Hand pumps, hygiene kits, pit latrines, medicated mosquito nets, emergency shelters, animal food supplements and conducting hygiene promoting awareness sessions. The said activities shall be targeting some 55,744 households in SRSO operational area.

The project covers twelve districts of Sindh where SRSO will be conducting project activities in eight Districts namely Kashmore, Shikarpur, Jacobabad, Larkana, Qamber Shehdadkot, Khairpur, Sukkur and Ghotki.

2. There is another project at signing level in the name of BAHAL with the support of the preceding project which along with the other supports to the affectees will also focus on Agriculture support to the affectees in the shape of fertilizer, seeds and cash grants, health and hygiene sector, mosquito nets and emergency shelter for 34,000 households of Kashmore, Shikarpur, Qamber- Shehdadkot, Jacobabad and Jamshoro (6800 households in each districts).
3. We are thank full to Mr. Humayun who has extended his support for the flood affectees and distributed **250** utensils kits and has shown interest for the further assistance.
4. Federal Minister Mr Fazul Shah Jelani held a meeting SRSO Ranipur team appreciated the work done by the SRSO for the flood affectees in Ranipur.
5. We have received Food and non food items (weighing 3,550 Kgs including energy food supplements, clothes, shelter and rice) from Al-Huda Welfare Trust Frankfurt Germany and we are thankful to Mr. Ashfaq Mehar for the reference and his continued support for the flood affected people.
6. We are thankful to Ms. Zeba from UNICEF for donating 100,000 for the support of flood affectees in the health and hygiene sector.

## OTHER NEWS

SRSO and PDMA are in close coordination where daily updates and day to day situations are discussed.

SRSO has been hosting cluster meetings of the Donors and implementation partners and monitoring agencies on daily basis where upcoming situations, issues are discussed and planning is being made to handle horrible situation after flood.



SRSO has held a meeting with Planning and Development department for installation of Water Filtration Plants for flood affected. These water filtration plants are portable on vehicle where there is less number of affectees and install where huge numbers of flood affectees are settled in relief camp. The water filtration plant will benefit a population of about 10,000 per day.

Food Distribution on August 30, 2010 at Government Degree Collage Sukkur was visited by the delegation from CNN and BBC along with Mr. Nisar Ahmed Pathan (Operational Manager) Emergency Unit SRSO.

UNICEF team visited the school inbox and shared their views with the children from the flood affected families present in the school.

GOAL Ireland has been involved in survey for the nutrition needs of the children of below ten years and for this purpose the hospitals of the Sukkur, khairpur and Larkana has been visited.

### **New situation:**

Since water is receding fast. IDPs will soon return to their homes and the relief work will be slowing down. Would the IDPs get proper support. What will happen to the infrastructure (water, electricity, houses, etc), which had been damaged already in all the flood affected villages. How all the Aid and Government Agencies will ensure that the people are not abandoned and the support continues (health, food, fodder, shelter, water, etc).

Early recovery and rehabilitation process needs to be planned and implemented immediately for the areas where the IDPS are returning back.
