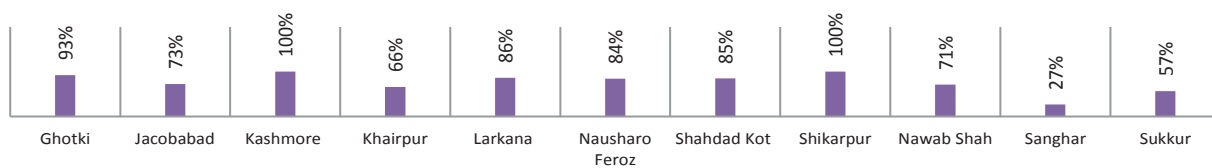

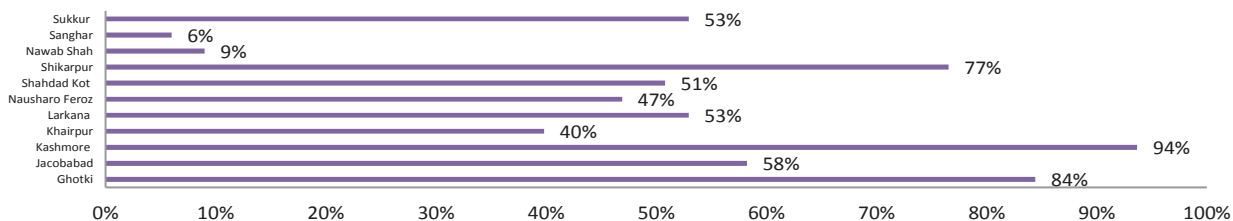

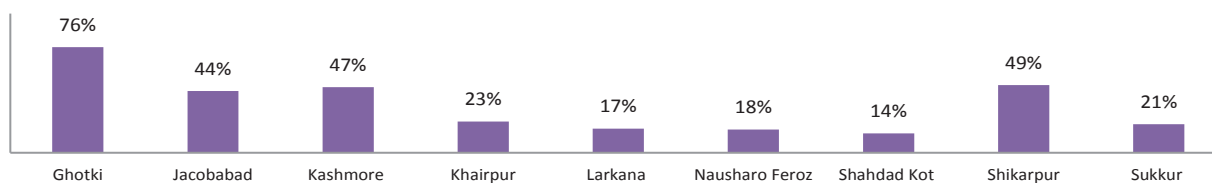
DISTRICT WISE UNION COUNCIL COVERAGE AS OF JUNE 2016



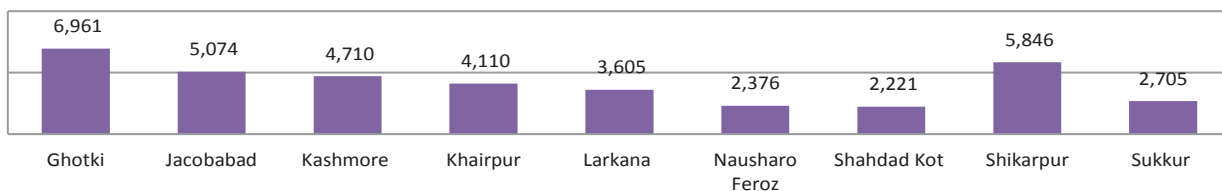
DISTRICT WISE VILLAGE COVERAGE AS OF JUNE 2016



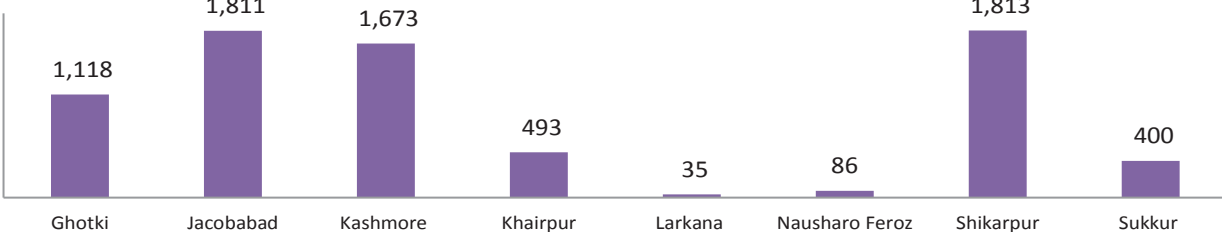
DISTRICT WISE HOUSEHOLD COVERAGE AS OF JUNE 2016



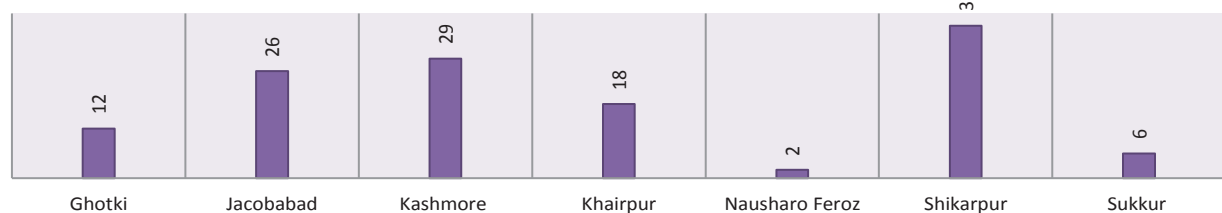
District wise break up of Community Organization (COs) as of June 2016

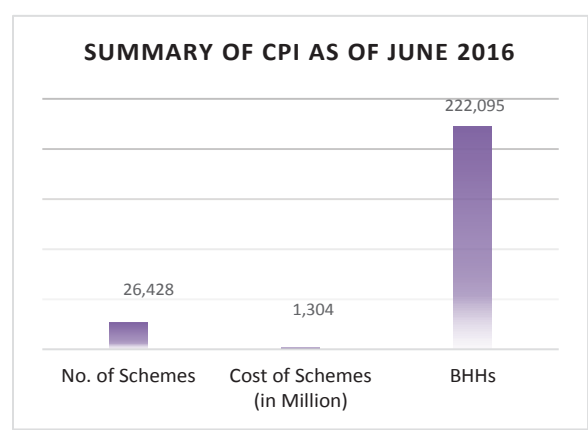
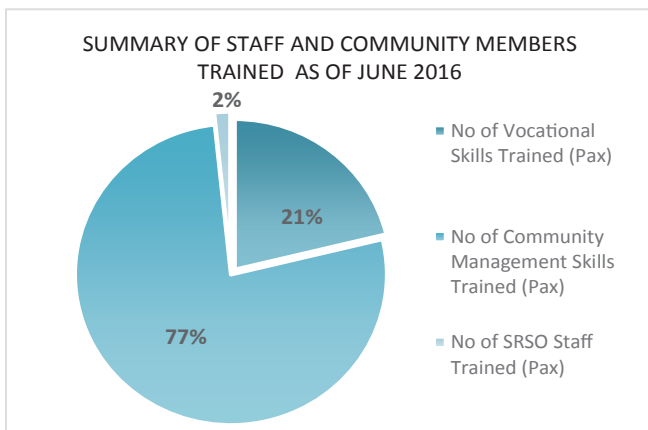
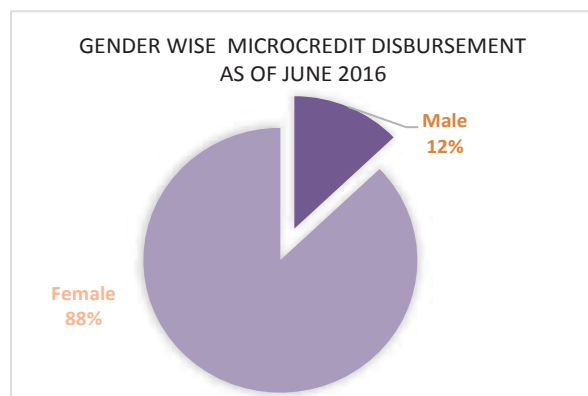
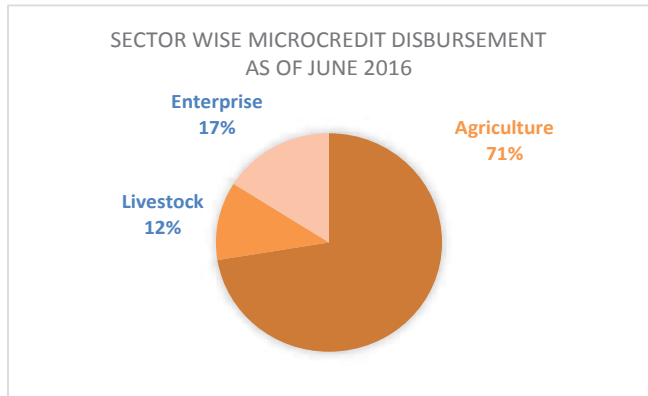
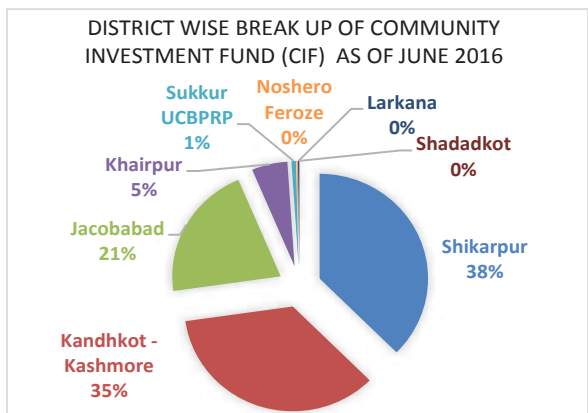
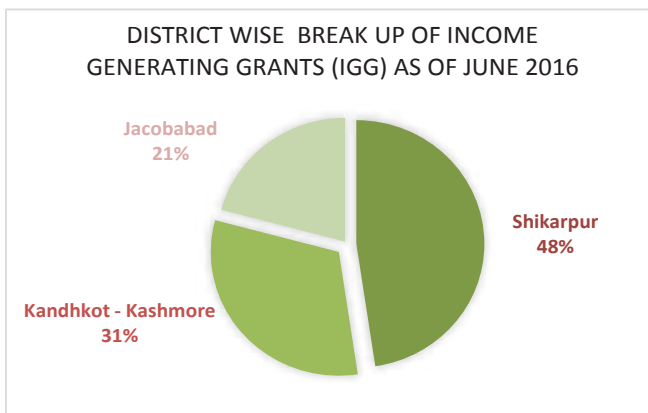
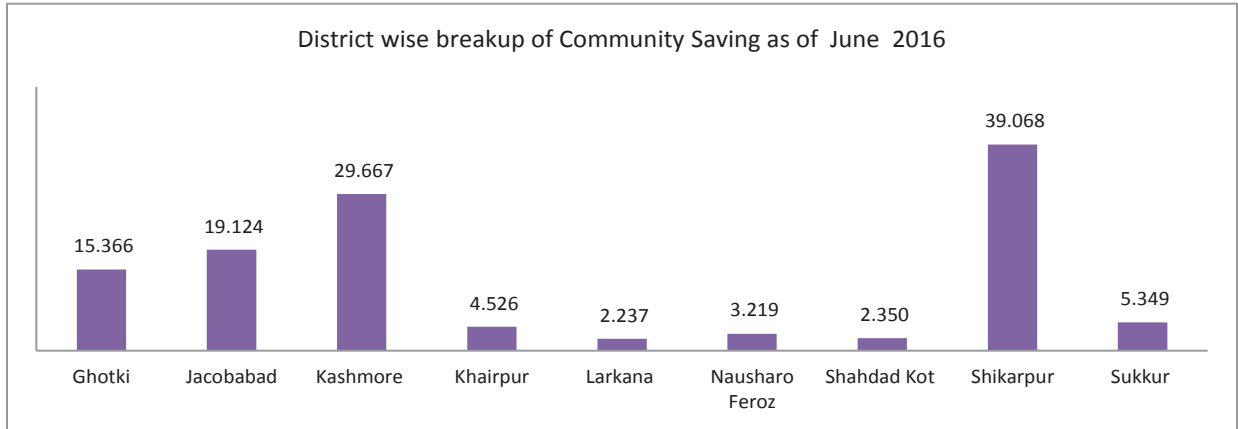


District wise break up of Village Organization (VOs) formation as of June 2016

The main goal of the world health day campaign was to spread awareness among people about increasing health problems through highlighting the theme of the year 'Beat Diabetes and its consequences including steps to prevent diabetes and diagnose, treat and care for people with diabetes. At the conclusion of each event, a joint signatory campaign was also held where participants - government officials, NGOs' representatives, members of civil society, media persons, and community members – signed a pledge stating that they will ensure better maternal and child health services in their full capacity and will promote the best practices regarding maternal and child health .

She inspected the center's facilities, student strength, student per day enrolment, teachers teaching methodology and students learning capacity by asking random questions from different students in the classes. He interacted with the women members of LSO Shaheen in Jacobabad District and VO Baijlo in Shikarpur district. The members of CIs gave detailed presentations describing the initiatives undertaken, and the progress and achievements made so far by these community institutions on self-help basis under the UCBPRP programme. The members also shared details about their current activities and the linkages that

they have developed with the Govt of Sindh's Departments and other organisations. Mr. Georges visited the kitchen gardening and tree plantations projects by VO Baijlo in their village. He admired the role of rural women and thanked them for their active participation. During the visits, the district Govt officials and SRSO-SUCCESS team members were also present. The visit of Mr. Georges at SRSO was scheduled for three days from 26-28th May 2016. On the last two days, he will visit the Larkana and Kamber-Shahdadkot districts, where SRSO is implementing the European Union funded SUCCESS Programme.

On day two, Mr. Georges visited village Umeed Ali Junejo in District Qambar-Shahdadkot and village Zakrio Mahessar in District Larkana. At both the locations, he participated in Programme Introduction (PI) dialogues conducted under the SUCCESS programme of SRSO component. During the PI dialogues, Mr. Georges interacted with the rural women and said that he has come here to see them and that he will visit again after four years to see the change achieved. Followed by the PI events, Mr. Georges Dehoux also observed the ongoing activity of Poverty Score Card (PSC) data collection in District Larkana. He observed the process of data collection and asked few basic questions pertaining to the methods of data collection, and the purpose of marking at the household level. SOS (Save Our Soul) Children Village Awareness Meeting Lead by Commissioner Sukkur



Commissioner Sukkur Mr. Mohammad Abbass Baloch called an official meeting at SOS (Save our Soul) children village office Khairpur. Deputy Commissioner Khairpur Mr. Fayaz Ahmed Jatoi, Muhammad Abbass Assistant commissioner Khairpur, notable citizens, and focal persons of IRC, Nova Pirbhat, Media persons and SRSO District Management participated. SOS children village administration briefed that SOS children village is a private social welfare organization dedicated to the care of orphans and abandoned children working for 40 years and currently operates 45 centers of education and child care throughout the Pakistan. In

Khairpur district, the SOS children village is established recently with targets of 150 children from 15 homes, consisting of ten children with one mother in each home. Commissioner Sukkur emphasized on all stakeholders to enhance the awareness for destitute who may get some benefit from this immense opportunity especially for source fewer children with following criteria that whose mother father are not alive, only mother is not alive, mothers have availed dissolution and have married in another place, mother suffering with chronic disease and homeless/source fewer children.

Signing of MoU between SRSO & IHT



Indus Heritage Trust (IHT) and Sindh Rural Support Organization signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for promoting Entrepreneurship and Support in establishing Common facility Centers (CFCs) in rural areas of Sindh. On the occasion, Chairperson of Indus Heritage Trust (IHT) Ms. Siddiqa Malik and Chief Executive Officer of SRSO Mr. Mohammad Dittal Kalhoro were present with their team Members. The main objective is to provide a sustainable solution to female artisans for enterprise development. This collaboration will enable women artisans of rural areas to establish CFS, a platform which will provide a potential opportunity to scaling up the production

capacity of poor artisans and will strengthen the market linkages in the country as well as abroad. These CFCs will be equipped with necessary infrastructure and will serve as one stop facilitating contacts for artisans to display their products, for business development services and provide linkages with input suppliers and nationwide retail chain stores and designers.

Women Equine Welfare Groups

The Brooke officials paid a visit to two villages, Village Yar Muhammad Bhatti and Baloch Khan Merali on 29th & 30th May 2016. Two Women Equine Welfare groups were selected, organized and mobilized to own the participatory activities for the welfare of working equines. Different activities carried out for the capacity building of the animal owner/users regarding BMPs (Basic management practices). An interactive and open forum for the community was organized to discuss the key related things and also ask any question regarding their queries. The working equines both have poor equine welfare as they are suffering from low body condition score, WRIs, eye, foot problems and poor feeding/watering and stable hygiene practices. The Brooke-SRSO Equine Welfare Project will work with women of Yar Muhammad Bhatti and Baloch Khan Merali communities to bring about sustainable improvements for working equines welfare through capacity building and skill enhancement in BMPs.

UNICEF / IKEA coordinator Ms. Zahida visited project activities especially social fund schemes. she has been facilitated by the CRFA team for possible visits of the schemes at Union council Khanpur and Babarloi of district Khairpur. This was followed by a Progress Review Meeting held at the SRSO Complex, Sukkur, with members from the SRSO SUCCESS team with regard to all completed and planned SUCCESS programme activities.



Mr. Mohammad Ali Azizi visited district Larkana under SUCCESS Programme



Mr. Mohammad Ali Azizi (Social Mobilisation Specialist-RSPN) along with Mr. Muzaffar Hussain Panhwar (Manager M & E-SUCCESS) visited District Larkana on 21-06-2016. They participated in CO formation activity in village Haji Khan Umrani of Union Council Mithodero. Both visitors joined the Social Mobilisation Team-3 in the village and observed the process of CO formation. He urged the women to make the best use of their inherent potentials through MIPs to determine its effective use. Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi asked the OTW participants regarding the quality of training and the sessions delivered by trainers. Participants responded well and said that the training delivery has been remained up to the mark and their understanding is improved now. Based on the response of trainees, Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi, praised the role of SRSO-SUCCESS team for organising such training event. He also urged on newly hired staff to spare maximum time in the



field with rural women to make them realized regarding their role and potentials. Mr. Naseer Memon also interacted with OTW participants and suggested them few very basic things i.e. Always maintain the office decorum with strict punctuality; always observe the proper timing either for office work or chasing targets, maintaining the good habit of reading, particularly English and Sindhi newspapers to remain full of insightful. Always remain dutiful towards your work and organization, adopt the honesty and always be aware of local traditions and culture when you enter into the field. Mr. Idrees Rajput also talked with the participants and appreciated the SRSO and SUCCESS programme for poverty reduction. He also paid thanks to Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi for inviting him to participate in this OTW event. He said this is the first time for him to attending such a good OTW event.

Poverty Score Card Census Survey (PSC) in Larkana and Kamber Shahdadkot Districts



Poverty Scorecard Census survey is a major activity prior to the initiation of social mobilisation process in SUCCESS programme. PSC is a standard, simple, effective and low-cost tool to identify the poor and targeted households for a specific intervention or programme.

MER (Monitoring Evaluation and Research) section based on its previous successful experience of undertaking PSC survey through Computer Assisted Personal Interview (CAPI) method in different union councils, also took the full responsibility and ownership to carry out the PSC survey for the EU-funded SUCCESS programme of SRSO component.

SRSO-MER started the poverty scorecard survey in March 2016 with the hiring of

required field enumerators and supervisors. In SUCCESS programme, the PSC survey first time introduced through computer-assisted personal interviews (CAPI) directly at the household level using the Android Tablets system for real-time reporting. SRSO organised formal orientation training for newly hired enumerators in five different phases, prior to the starting of data collection at household level in the field using the computer-assisted personal interviews (CAPI) method.

These trainings were comprised of two days i.e. day-1 was for indoor sessions covering the various tools and methods of CAPI and day-2 was spared for field demo in order to check the understanding of trained enumerators on methods of data collection. During the reporting period, a total of 81,895 households are surveyed with the support of eight PSC teams including 82 enumerators, 9 supervisors, 8 forward campaigners and 3 monitoring person in both programme districts.

Over 300,000 estimated households are expected to be surveyed in PSC survey by the end of December 2016.
