

SRSOs' Immediate Emergency Response to Fire Incidents April-June 2022

During the last few months of the year, 2022 Sindh's different districts have experienced unprecedented fire incidents. Images of immense burnt areas or dead animals that failed to escape the hundreds of houses and animals have shocked the local community.

An extreme weather event is defined as a phenomenon that leads to Fire, loss of all possessions, food security issues, human injuries, health disparities, or loss of human lives. Besides this, the fire incidents also cause damage to the properties, economy, and ecosystem. These losses are such that the community cannot cope with them using their present resources available at their and Sindh's different districts have

suffered different natural hazards, which cost numerous lives and have a considerable effect on the economy.

SRSO is mainly responding to the emergency relief work and strengthening the resilience to prevent or minimize further similar fire incidents to these catastrophic events. SRSO in emergency response has ensured that vulnerable communities can recover during and after the fire. The SRSO field team reached the village level within hours after the Fire incidents. They coordinated with concerned authorities, visited locations, assessed the situation and affected families, and provided relief support immediately.



During April 2022, 06 different fire incidents occurred at different locations of the district Khairpur and affected severely houses and valuable property, including livestock and grain. SRSO responded immediately to the affected and needy 70 families by providing relief food Items of a daily consumable products like; Chaki Aata, Cooking oil, Sugar, lodized Salt, Soaps, and Vital Tea somehow other consumables products are given per family after an assessment of incidents and affected families.



On April 20, 2022, Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) responded to provide relief to the fire-affected village Faiz Muhammad Chandio Khairpur Nathan Shah District Dadu. In this regard, the SRSO team visited the affected village and assessed the situation and needs. Initially, 15 temporary toilets have been established to provide safe sanitary facilities to 79 households especially women in the affected village.



On 22nd April 2022, a sudden fire incident took place at Hajam Mohalla Village Salik Bajeer UC Kharoro Syed, district Umerkot where 07 houses were fully burned to ashes along with all goods and furniture. SRSO team visited the village and community members and got the details about the fire incident and supported the 07 affected families by providing the cheque of PKR 10,000 per family in the presence of Deputy Director-Social Welfare Department-Umerkot.



On April29, 2022, a fire incident occurred at village Luwari Sharif District Badin. 26 households were severely affected by the fire incident which cause the loss of home accessories, shelter, furniture, and 01 buffalo and goats. SRSO provided ration (flour, rice, oil, vermicilli, lentils, and clothes for elders and children) to 26 affected families in the presence of Mr. Najeeb-u-Rehman Jamali ADC-I Badin and RGM-SRSO.





On May 6, 2022, a fire incident occurred at village Kalery Mughari UC Jain Abro Taluka Kamber District Kamber-Shahdadkot. According to villagers, the cause of the incident was a fire from the stove that destroyed 4 houses in the village and lost their 10 sheep, 4 goats, one motorbike, 40 Munds of stored wheat, and dowery of her daughter due to a damasked house in this incident. SRSO visited the village, assessed the actual situation and responded. Rs. 25,000 cheques of IGG to 3 Households and Rs. 25,000 grant support to one family were provided to the most affected 4 families in the presence of Deputy Commissioner Kamber-Shahdadkot. Provide treatment of burnt sheep and goats, and two times cooked food with drinking water was provided to 10 affected households of the village.



23 May 2022, an unfortunate fire incident took place at village Faraqpur Union Council Hingoro Taluka Pano Akil District Sukkur, and as a result 15Katcha houses/huts were burnt down and all valuables and household items went up in ashes. 28th May 2022 SRSO distributed ration bags among the 15 affected Families.



On 24 May 2022, at village Jam Samano Union Council Mehmoodabad Taluka Lakhi District Shikarpur, a fire incident took place from the smoke of ashes prepared for cooking and that smoke engulfed the O9Katcha house/hut was burnt down. On 27th May 2022, the SRSO team led by RGM distributed Food Rashan bags among the O9 affected households for their survival. Food Package included for one household such as 50 kg Wheat flour, 25 kg Rice, 5kg Sugar, 3kg Cooking Oil, One Tea Box, O1 kg Daal Chana and Daal Mung, Salt, Surf Packet, Soap, Red Chilli.



A fire incident broke out on 22-May-2022 from a transformer in the village of Pir Bux Jarwar, union council Chitori and Taluka Sindhri district Mirpurkhas where 14 houses of the Meghwar community became affected severely. The fire destroyed their food items, livestock shade, livestock fodder, clothes, ornaments/jewelry, and money, and five houses were completely burnt to ashes and a four-year child-(Rahul) of a family also injured his legs burned in the fire incident. The SRSO assessed the situation and immediate needs of the affected families. The ration bags and ladies' dresses were distributed to the affected 14 families in the presence of Assistant Commissioner Sindhri.



On dated 3rd June 2022 a horrified Fire incident happened in the village of Mir Muhammad Talpur, Union Council Soofan Shah Taluka Digri District Mirpurkhas, 19 houses fully burned their clothes, food items, and livestock fodder, and 20 goats and 03 Cows also were dead which their main livelihood sources were. SRSO team visited a village and assessed the damages and immediate needs. on June 6, 2022, SRSO distributed ration bags and ladies' dresses among the affected 19 families in the presence of Assistant Commissioner Digri.
