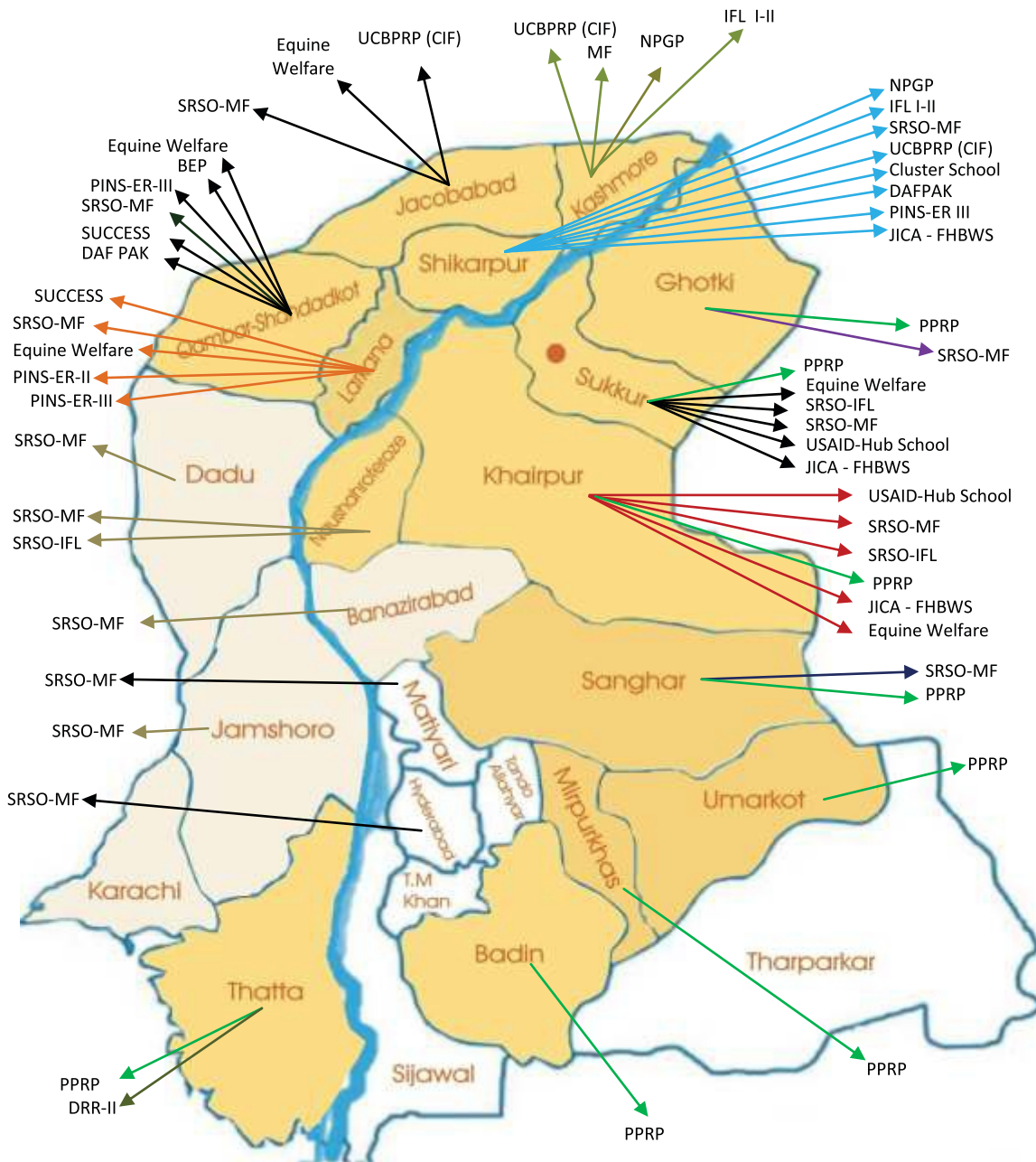

“World Forest Day” celebration in partnership with Forest Department-Govt. of Sindh under the EU funded PINS-ER-III

Larkana, Kamber-Shahdadkot & Shikarpur/March 21, 2022

World Forest Day was celebrated in partnership with the Forest Department (Govt. of Sindh) under the EU-funded Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS-ER-III). The day was celebrated in Shikarpur, Larkana, and Kamber Shahdadkot districts to create awareness about the importance of forests and fruit-bearing trees and to highlight the role of Forests in ensuring sustainable production and consumption.

Representatives of the ACF, Forest, Agriculture Extension, Fisheries, Livestock, and Social Welfare Departments, educationists, school children, community leaders of CIs, civil society activists, electronic and print media and SRSO participated in these events. Participants commended the effort of SRSO and urged the communities to plant a tree and also nurture them to contribute their share for “Clean Green Pakistan and enhanced forest cover and promote a green

environment.

Fruit-bearing plants were also distributed during the events among participants to plant, care and grow a tree in their homes. The main objective of this drive is the promotion of the plantation of fruit-bearing trees at the household level to fulfill the nutrition needs of a family and support a national-level plantation campaign for achieving the goals of sustainable development and climate change. The plantation drive of fruit-bearing trees was started from 1st to 20th March 2022 as part of the Program for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (ER-III nutrition-sensitive component). In this regard, from Sindh Forest Department, SRSO received 50,000 fruit plants, and distributed them among LSOs and rural Communities and planted enthusiastically in the plantation drive.

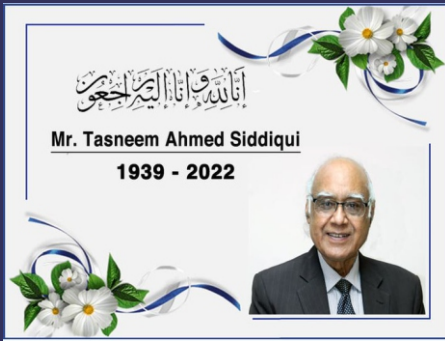

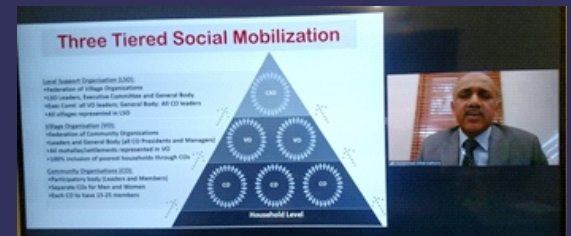
