Launching of Moringa Tree Plantation Campaign under EU supported PINS-ER III



SRSO under EU supported Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS-ER-III) has initiated a Moringa Plantation Campaign for improved nutrition situation in the 3 out-reach districts of Larkana, Kamber-Shahdadkot, and Shikarpur.

Under this campaign, about 300,000 Moringa Trees plants have

been provided and planted by the communities to fulfill their future nutrition needs and challenges of women, children, and other family members. 656 Nurseries were developed where Moringa trees were planted in Farmer Field Schools (FFSs) in districts of Shikarpur, Larkana & Kamber Shahdadkot. Community Institutions, Farmers Field Schools, Agriculture entrepreneurs CRPs, District Administration, and other relevant stakeholders were engaged in the Moringa Plantation Campaign. SRSO has received the huge support in the campaign from the community institutions.

The drip irrigation tool kits were distributed among the Agriculture Entrepreneurs (AEs) and Field Farmer Schools (FFSs) at district Kamber-Shahdadkot through World Bank supported OFWM-GoS-SIAPEP implemented by SRSO. CEO-SRSO visited rain-affected districts and joined SRSO teams in relief work


September, 2020

Community Awareness Campaigns



3,732 community awareness campaigns were conducted on COVID -19 through 1,080 community volunteers (community leaders, CRPs, etc.) and 832 community institutions (COs, VOs, and LSOs) engaged in public awareness campaigns in all 14 out-reach districts

Social-Distancing Sessions



99 Social-Distancing sessions aiming at behavioral changes were conducted at the community level where 1,925 community members have participated and made aware in 14 out-reach districts.

IEC Material Dissemination



332 IEC Material i.e. standees and Pena flex on COVID-19 were developed, printed, and displayed at social welfare and local govt. departments, social welfare institutes, Old People's Associations (OPAs) and community places under HelpAge Project in 3 districts of Malir (Karachi), Shikarpur and Jacobabad.

Personal Protection Equipments Distribution



36,430 PPEs (11,880 facemasks, 10,385 hand-gloves, and 14,165 soaps) were distributed among Agriculture Entrepreneurs, CRPs, and Communities under EU-supported PINS-ER-III and **62,838** PPEs (16,398 surgical facemasks, 43,200 surgical hand gloves, 2,160 anti-septic soaps, and 1,080 sanitizers) were distributed among CRPs and community members under PSI-RSPN-DAFPAK.

Total 3,732 community awareness campaigns were organized on COVID -19 through engaging 1,080 community volunteers (community leaders, CRPs, etc.) and 832 community institutions (COs, VOs, and LSOs) engaged in all 14 out-reach districts. COVID-19 Community Sessions and Activity on social distancing for behavioral change.

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) conducted 99 community based social-distancing sessions aiming with the behavioral change were conducted under the community led-COVID-19 Emergency Response. These awareness-raising sessions were attended by 1,925 community members. SRSO Team and Community Institutions (CIs) are conducting these

sessions on regular basis during routine visits, training sessions and other activities in order to make aware and sensitize communities for behavioral change to maintaining social-distancing and taking preventing measures in their daily life.



332, COVID-109 Key messages regarding SOPs Standees, and Pen flex were developed and displayed at Government Offices and OPAs under the Promoting Rights of Older People in 3 Districts

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) has developed, disseminated, and displayed 332 COVID-19 specific banners, and standees on the usage of facemask, social distancing, and

standard operating procedures under the HelpAge International supported Project Promoting Rights of Older People. This material was designed for social welfare department



(50 standees), local government department (137 standees), and Old People Associations (145 Pena flex banners) with the key message of taking care old age persons at meeting places during the COVID-19 pandemic. Meanwhile, IEC the material was also displayed at the social welfare department, social welfare institutes, public and prominent places in communities of Karachi 167, Shikarpur 91, and Jacobabad 74 districts, who are

working for the welfare of women, children, persons with disabilities, and Old Age People. These standees displayed especially at provincial Ministers and Secretaries of Social welfare, local government, Jinnah hospital Karachi JPMC, Training Institute of Social Welfare department, Child Protection Unit, and Orphanage center, OPAs other important offices and places of project's three out-reach districts.



Distribution of PPEs among the communities under PINS-ER-III to combat with COVID-19

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) is implementing Programme for Improved Nutrition In Sindh (PINS-ER-III) with the support of the European Union (EU) in three districts i.e.; Larkana, Kamber-Shahdadkot, and Shikarpur. Under this Programme personal protection equipment's (PPEs) have been distributed to respond to COVID-19 emergency in the targeted

districts. Total 36,430 PPEs (soaps 14,165, gloves 10,385, and masks 11,880) were distributed among the CRPs, Agriculture Entrepreneurs, and Community members in targeted these three-targeted districts i.e. Larkana (total PPEs 11,170), Kamber-Shahdadkot (total PPEs 10,260), and Shikarpur (total PPEs 15000).

COVID-19 Response under PSI-RSPN-DAFPAK Project in Targeted 3 Districts

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) under the partnership of Rural Support Programme Network (RSPN) under the Project "Delivering Accelerated Family Planning in Pakistan (DAFPAK)" supported by Population Services International (PSI) has started different initiatives to combat the COVID-19 pandemic. In this regard, 126,030 community members have been supported through CRPs training, awareness-raising sessions with village health committees, public announcements, client screening and PPEs distribution initiatives in three project districts of Shikarpur, Jacobabad, and Kamber-Shahdadkot. CRPs are playing an effective role in mobilizing the rural communities, therefore 1,080 (360 from each district) have been trained through one-day training that was designed with the objective to sensitize and orientate as 'change agents' for prevention, control, and mitigation of the risks associated with the transmission of the COVID-19. During the training, CRPs were equipped with facemasks, hand-gloves, soaps, and IEC material for conducting sessions in the rural communities.
