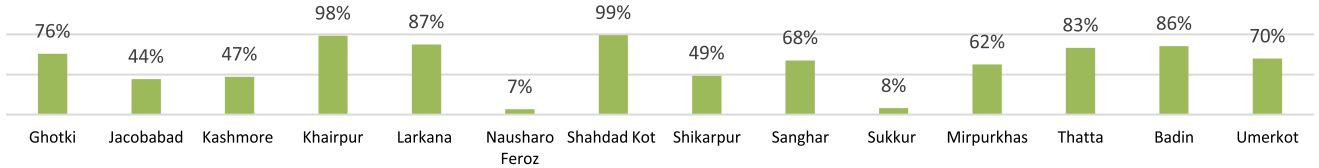
### DISTRICT WISE UNION COUNCIL COVERAGE AS OF DECEMBER 2020



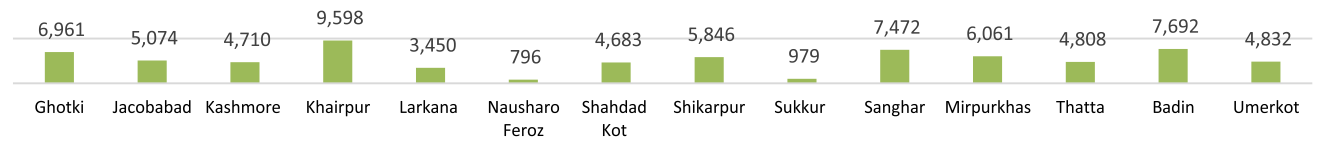
### DISTRICT WISE VILLAGE COVERAGE AS OF DECEMBER 2020



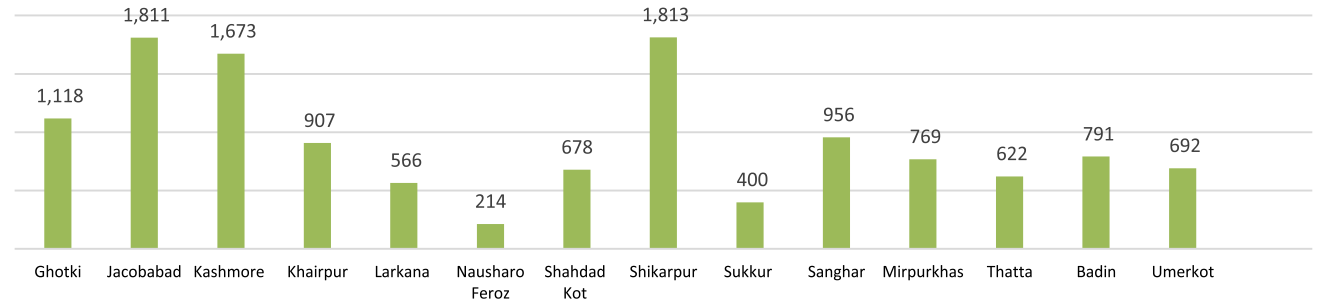
### DISTRICT WISE VILLAGE COVERAGE AS OF DECEMBER 2020



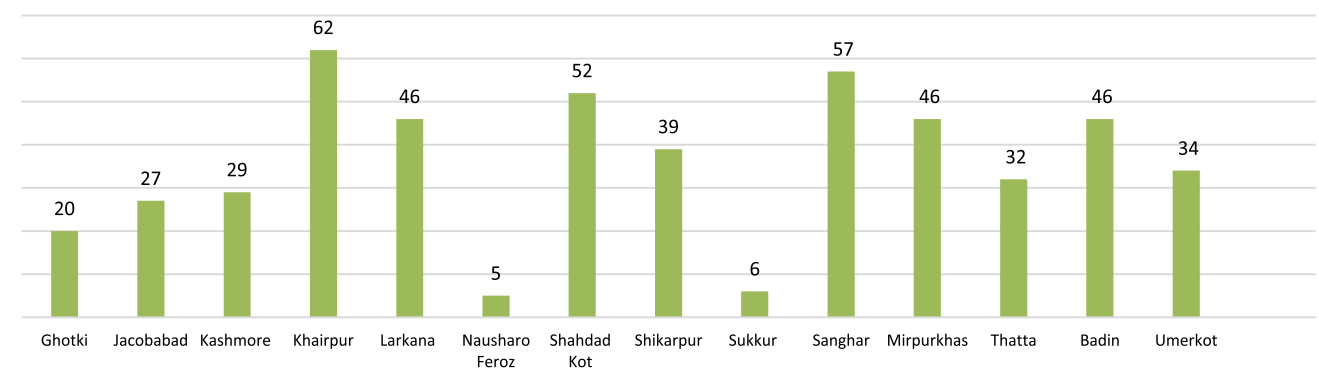
### DISTRICT WISE BREAKUP OF COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION (COs) AS OF DECEMBER 2020



### DISTRICT WISE BREAKUP OF VILLAGE ORGANIZATION (VOs) FORMATION AS OF DECEMBER 2020

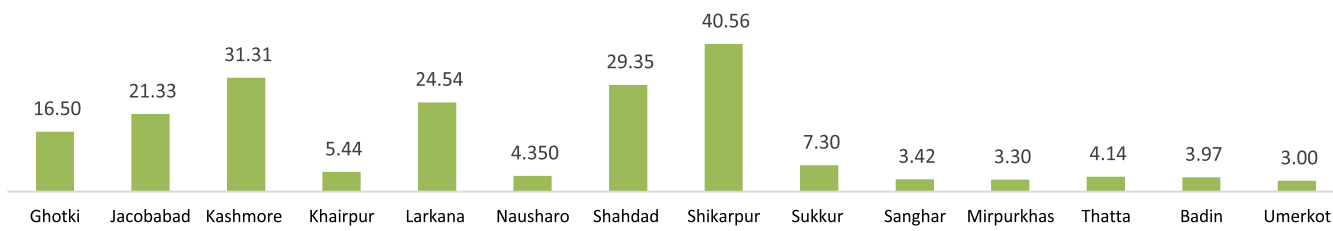


### DISTRICT WISE BREAKUP OF (LSOs) AS OF DECEMBER 2020

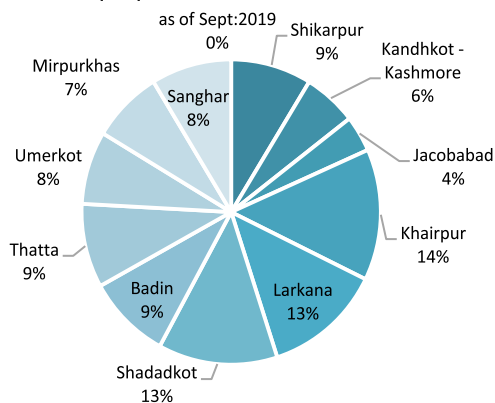




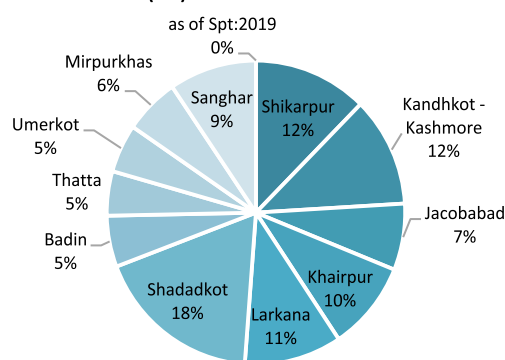
### DISTRICT WISE BREAKUP OF COMMUNITY SAVING AS OF DECEMBER 2020 (IN MILLION)



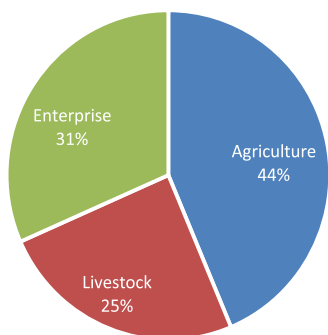
### DISTRICT WISE BREAK UP OF INCOME GENERATION GRANTS (IGG) AS OF DECEMBER 2020



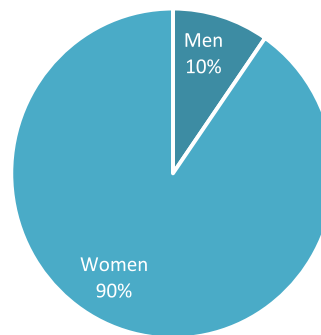
### DISTRICT WISE BREAK UP OF COMMUNITY INVESTMENT FUND (CIF) AS OF DECEMBER 2020



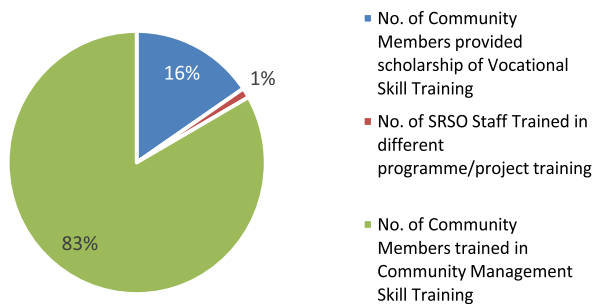
### SECTOR WISE MICROCREDIT DISBURSMENT AS OF DECEMBER 2020

## Speaker Sindh Assembly constituted a Council for the Welfare of Senior Citizens and nominated two members of Sindh Assembly as members of the Council

*Karachi/October 12 and 24, 2020*

SRSO in collaboration with HelpAge International is undertaking awareness-raising and advocacy campaign for the Promotion of Rights of Older People. In the perspective of this, on 12 October 2020, the Speaker of the Provincial Assembly of Sindh Agha Siraj Khan Durrani, constituted a council for the welfare of senior citizens under Section 3(1) of the Sindh Senior Citizen Welfare Act, 2014 and nominated two members of Sindh Assembly as members of the Council.

1. Ms. Shamim Mumtaz (Member Provincial Assembly -Sindh)
2. Mr. Muhammad Qasim Soomro (Member Provincial Assembly- Sindh & Standing Committee on Law, Parliamentary Affairs, and Human Rights) was nominated as a member of council. The Council shall formulate policies for Welfare and improvement for the well-being of senior

Citizens and will take such measures and perform such functions as may be necessary for the welfare of the senior citizens to enable participation of the elderly peoples in the process of welfare in the society. Older people around the world raise their voices for the protection of their rights. Campaigners have made great strides forward to protect older people's rights by becoming agents of change.

Another side, on October 24, 2020, the Committee has also finalized the Rules of Business (RoBs) for the Sindh Senior Citizens Welfare Act 2014 under the chair of Honorable Muhammad Aslam Shaikh, Retired District & Session Judge. The rules of business (RoBs) will be submitted to the Sindh Cabinet through the Law Department for approval.

women that have been served through Programme. CIs & office bearers briefly presented the ongoing and completed activities and activities' impact on their lives. PM-SRSO-PINS briefed about future planning under the PINS ER-II & III and coordination regarding ACF and SRSO. All the visitors appreciated and showed keen interest in initiatives taken by beneficiaries and Community Institutions. These all initiatives were also appreciated by Country Director ACF in his note written in the visitor's book. On the last day, she visited SRSO head office Sukkur and conducted a meeting with SRSO Management and debriefed about three days visits and thanked SRSO for organizing such a wonderful visit and also appreciated the efforts of community institutions, SRSO, and RSPN as well.



## Celebration of International Human Rights Day with Community Institutions under EU-funded SUCCESS Programme

*Larkana and Kamber-Shahdadkot / December 10, 2020*

SRSO under the EU Funded SUCCESS Programme observed 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence in both districts through engaging different stakeholders for raising awareness against gender-based violence. In this regard, two events were organized by IMSD with the collaboration of LSO Noor, UC Yaro Lakhir (Larkana), and LSO Sajawal, UC Sajawal (Kamber-Shahdadkot). Ms. Shama Parveen (Deputy Director Women Development), Mr. Toheedullah Kalhoro (Assistant Director Social Welfare and Child Protection Cell) Larkana, Mr. Waqar Ahmed Soomro (Deputy Director Child Protection Cell), and Ms. Uroosa Khatti were the main speakers of the events. More than 100 participants attended both events hailing from Govt. departments,
