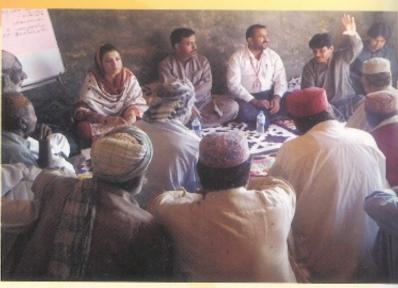
### SRSO Highlights of Two Quarters (July 2013 to Dec: 2013)

- IHSAS (Integrated Health System Strengthening Alliance), comprising of Integrated Health Services (IHS) and Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) as partners, awarded joint project by Government of Sindh & one by UN with financial assistance of Norwegian Government, under Norwegian Pakistan Partnership Initiative (NPPI). The prime objective of this project is to ensure quality of Maternal & Newborn Child Health and Family Planning services under Pay for Performance contract in two districts of Sindh; Shaheed Benazirbad and Larkana. Under IHSAS-BCC component SRSO organized Health Melas, Community Theaters, 6 day trainings of Family Focals, Training of Ulemas on importance of MNCH in the light of Quran & Hadees and orientation for Journalist and media anchors for media coverage.
- SRSO and HelpAge International jointly support more than 2,778 older people by providing benefits from Community Revolving Fund (CRF) to secure their livelihood including 1,220 females. 850 older people provided poultry units to increase their livelihood.1,038 community persons were trained on CBDRM. 30 Villages have developed Disaster Risk Management plans, while 51 Villages plans were reviewed and endorsed from District Disaster Management Authority. Assistive devices were provided to 507 older peoples for ensuring their mobility and socialization. More than 750 older people and members of their families were trained on Care of Careers and Noommunicable Diseases. 39 Health professionals from 39 BHUs were trained on Primary Eye Care. Older peoples of Shikarpur & Jacobabad initiated tree plantation campaign and planted more than 8000 plants in their villages.
- SRSO-Crafts Enterprise Development Section participated in Si• Days Asia level E•hibition (from 24th Aug to 31st Aug 2013) at Delhi Hut India, funded by Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF). All SAARC countries e•hibited handmade crafts under one roof re cognized internationally and ultimately providing opportunities for e•port market.
- → 102 Govt. Schools of District Shikarpur and Kashmore @ kandhot to insure the enrollment of students and presence of teachers, along with 3 Cluster schools have been initiated and renovated with recruitment of desired teachers.
- Livelihood Enhancement and Protection project (LEP) the aims to enhance the capacity and skills, create more opportunities, transfer of income generating assets and improving the productivity of community members to reduce their vulnerability to shocks, improve their livelihoods initiatives and strengthen their business operations. In this regard 669 different kinds of assets have been distributed for income generating and raise their standard of living. Skill trainings were provided among 4306 Beneficiaries.
- Local Support Organization (LSO), Kainat distributed Community Investment Fund (CIF) cheques among 19 beneficiaries in village Karampur Thaheem, UC Muhammadpur, District Jacobabad having planned to invest in Livestock. The investment meant to target poverty by building assets through Union Council Based Poverty Reduction Program (UCBPRP) funded by Govt. of Sindh. The investment cycle will go on with the strategy to revolve funds at village level with the concept of saving by each beneficiary as per investment plan shared at VO level. In addition SRSO is also supporting to VOs in their capacity building, VO Management, CIF management and book keeping.
- Micro Health Insurance (MHI) is a principle feature of the poverty reduction agenda of SRSO. MHI in collaboration with Adamjee Insurance Company Ltd provided MHI to the poorest HHs treated 762,376 patients at 7,198 panel hospitals covering the cost of hospitalization, accidental injuries, disabilities, and compensation in cases of accidental death services since October 2005, covers almost all family members irrespective of family size.
- Brooke Pakistan and SRSO jointly deliver veterinary health and welfare services to working equines by the funding of Brooke UK. The main objective of project is to improve health and welfare of working equine animals through capacity building of equine owners/users, farers, saddlers, vets in Partnership districts i.e. Jacobabad, Sukkur, Shikarpur & Larkana. Provided vaccination & emergency treatment to over 20990 equines in targeted 4 districts, provided the trainings to over 32 local service providers, provided 13 shed/shelters in districts, constructed 77 water troughs for equines, mentoring up to 112 VSPs.
- NRM Sector is engaged in capacity building of Poor HHs by providing them 1050 units of Egyptian poultry layers, 600 bags of seeds for kitchen gardening & 2400 fruit plants to increase their livelihood and income generation. 30 Agriculture awareness workshops being conducted at COs/VOs levels.
