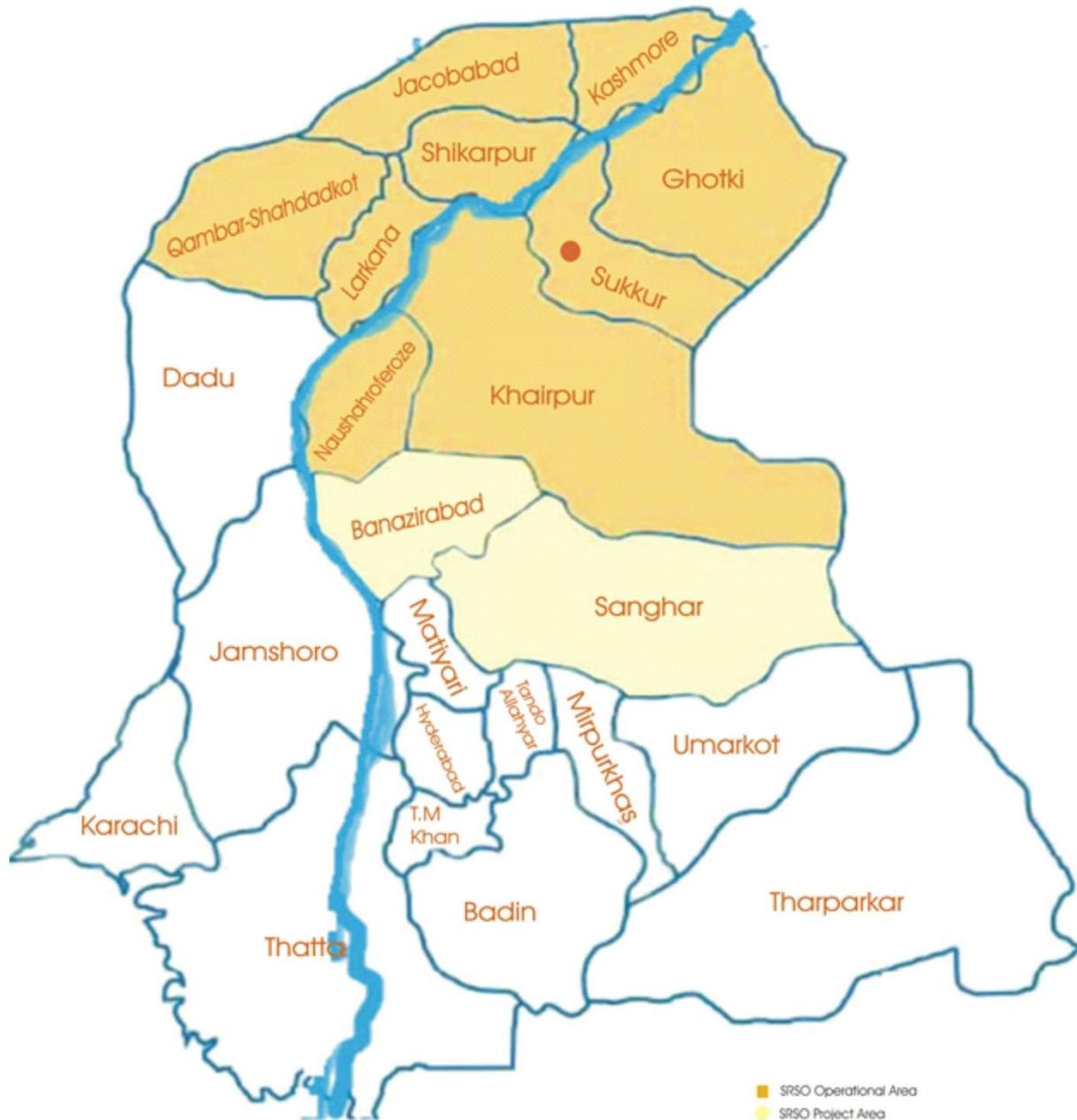

During year 2015-16 a number of projects i.e. LEP phase-II, SM phase-III, and ISDP-CDP have successfully been completed and achieved the set objectives qualitatively. Brief highlights on achievements on above projects revealed as follows:

### Livelihood Enhancement & Protection (LEP) project Funded by: PPAF



SRSO entered into an agreement with the PPAF in March-2011 to execute the LEP project in District Ghotki. The objective of LEP project was to develop the capacities, opportunities, assets and productivity of community members to reduce their vulnerability to shocks, improve their livelihood initiatives and strengthen their business operations on sustainable basis. In August 2013, the LEP-I was completed and LEP-II was started with slight change in asset transfer activity. In year 2015, LEP-II project has also been completed and achieved the following results:

- **1,196** cross breed heifers have been distributed in poor women of district Ghotki.
- **513** local breed cows have been distributed among the poor women.
- **178** other eligible women have been provided assets of karyana shops, puncture shops and other assets of their choice as per their LIPs.
- **8,638** Female members have been provided trainings on livestock management, agriculture management and enterprise development.
- **878** youth have been provided vocational trainings under various trades of their choice through well reputable institutions.
- **22** willing youth members from poor households have been imparted technical training on artificial insemination (AI) technology from well reputable institution of Lahore.
- **133** Common Interest Groups (CIGs) of poor women are formed.
- **1,897** animals have been treated and 1831 animals vaccinated through mobile clinic.
- **71** animals are provided A.I facility by SRSO trained technicians.

### Social Mobilization III (SM) Project Funded by: PPAF



Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) and Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) had entered into an agreement and executed the SM project in District Ghotki in July 2008. The objective of the SM project was to Increase the footprint of social mobilization by organizing the poor and poorest rural households (women and men) in program districts. In June 2013, the project had completed the initial phases and expanded in further phases, and finally completed in year 2015 with following achievements:

- A total of **123,032** households organized in district Ghotki.
- **7,371** Community Organizations (COs) have been formed at para level in rural areas.
- **1,136** Village Organizations (VOs) have been formed at village level.
- **11** Local Support Organizations have been formed at union council level.
- A total of **12,258** CO members, **1,702** VO members and **49** LSO members are trained on Institution management and planning.
- **120** Village Development Plan (VDPs) prepared in various villages.
- **600** activists have been trained on basic civic and constitutional rights.
- **40** issue based workshops organized on girl's education, functioning of schools in which more than **600** people participated.
- **196** members have been trained on disaster response management in the district.
- **450** members have been trained on linkages development and resource mobilization.

### Integrated Skill Development Project (ISDP) Funded by: CDP-GoS



Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) with financial assistance of CDP-Govt of Sindh had executed the ISDP project in three UCs of district Qamber-Shahdadkot in 2012. Project aimed to alleviate extreme poverty by providing the vocational training to the siblings of poor and destitute households who lacking far behind for livelihood options. Project has been successfully completed and achieved the set plan as under:

- **94** villages have been covered under the project.
- **114** village organizations (VOs) are formed in three UCs.
- **1,002** including (**452 males & 550 female**) youth members have been provided vocational trainings under the trade of their choice.
- **10** various trades i.e. (mobile repairing, motor cycle repairing, generator repairing, tailoring, building electrician, welding, applique work, beautician, value addition of local crafts & product development) were introduced to trained the local willing youth members.





## A CONTRIBUTION TO OVERCOME POLIO REFUSAL



In rural areas, awareness with respect to the complications and effects of Polio is very less. It is mainly caused by the predominant factors of religion and wrong interpretation of polio eradication campaigns and immunizations. This has been leading rural communities to refuse the availing of immunization of polio vaccine for their children against the polio. In district Shikarpur, all possible actions have been taken to address the refusal issues in various villages/areas of UC Mughrani, but failed, to make realize the rural masses on the significance of polio immunization for their children. As a second and sound option, the district management through

SRSO has approached the COs/VOs and LSOs and engaged them to address the issues of refusals, outreach and trainings. These community institutions were asked to address these issues on their ease, as the 100% coverage of polio immunizations can be achieved in their respective areas/villages.

LSO Awaz of UC Mughrani, called a detailed meeting of all respective VOs and discussed the issue of refusal in great detail and pointed out the 11 villages from where the consistent refusals were reported to the health department in past period. It was decided that these all villages to be visited and those parents will be contacted. Very second day, the BoD members of LSO Awaz along with the women of various VOs visited the seven villages and conducted meaningful meetings with those all parents on the subject of polio vaccines and tried their level best to eliminate their fears and misconception being found in their minds. In the meantime, LSO also selected two members i.e. **Ms. Zareena and Mr. Abdul Ghaffar from VO Mithal** for the whole task of polio vaccination in these villages. District health department provided all relevant trainings to both individuals on the preservation method of polio vaccines, record keeping and documentation during the polio eradication campaigns and the standard way to vaccinate the children.



It was a hard task for all respective VOs where the refusals being reported. LSO Awaz gives responsibility to each VO to sensitize their people in order to ensure that all the children are vaccinated during the campaigns. VO members of these 11 villages (located around the both banks of Indus River) have started the sensitization efforts with their rural communities. There were misconceptions in the minds of rural people that by taking



these vaccines the growth of their children would cease and the reproduction system equally disturbs and affected. VO members possibly removed their fears and make them realized that these vaccines are completely safe and has got no any harm as being propagated in these areas. Gradually the masses of 11 villages realized and started to think for the future of their children which directly inclined them to prefer the vaccination instead of making refusals. Now after the sensitization of parents in all 11 villages, **Ms. Zareena and Mr. Abdul Gaffar** started to cover all villages during the polio eradication campaigns and provided vaccinations to all children in assigned villages and ensured that all the children of under five years of age are completely immunized. Both (Ms. Zareena & Mr.

Abdul Ghaffar) claims that in their catchment areas particularly 11 villages, not a single child is left without polio vaccination, 100% children are properly immunized and have their immunization cards as well.

**Ms. Zareena and Mr. Abdul Ghaffar** are working with district health department, and covering all areas during campaigns and health department paying up to Rs. 20,000 to both for each polio eradication campaign for areas assigned to them.





## EFFORTS OF LSO MURK

The third tier of social mobilization completes when federation of various VOs give emergence to the local support organization (LSO) at a union council level. LSO becomes the UC level organization. Likewise, LSO Murk was formed in year 2011 in UC Badani district Kashmore-Kandhkot, which is comprised of 13 board members and 40 general body members at the union council level. In year 2009-10, under GoS funded UCBPRP program, a total of 760 poor eligible women were provided community investment fund (CIF) as revolving fund of Rs. 9,400,000 in UC Badani. By design of the program this amount was supposed to be revolved within the period of one year. But due to the natural disasters of flood 2010 and rain falls, the rural communities had internally displaced and were not in a position to return the amount of CIF from various VOs and therefore, the whole amount remained in pending and overdue.



The continued rain falls of 2011 and 2012 ceased the sources of communities and rural communities became denial for recoveries. Subsequently, SRSO staff in the light of directions of Chairman-SRSO, contacted with all the potential members of LSOs and it was suggested to LSOs to identify their resource persons (CRPs) for the cause of CIF recoveries which was the sheer responsibility of these community institutions to further revolve. After such message LSO Murk took responsibility to recover and revolve the CIF amount in their whole union council Badani.

According to the office bearers (Mai Ladhan & Mai Moran) of LSO Murk that it was not an easy job to recover and revolve the whole amount of CIF in short period of months. Both the office bearers visited each and every VO personally and interacted with all VO members as well as their office bearers and make them realize that this CIF amount was given by Government of Sindh to them as a revolving fund which means we have to revolve the CIF amount at any cost. LSO office bearers further clarify that the CIF amount never deposit in SRSO accounts, it simply deposits in our own VO accounts and we are the custodian of this entire amount, just need is to revolve this amount among other needy and poor members. Their interactive sessions with VOs created a great sense of understanding and responsibility in majority of village organizations and members. Gradually the VOs started to sensitize their respective CIF beneficiaries and things became changed and beneficiaries took their time but started to return their CIF amount in respective VOs.

In the meantime, SRSO announced that such LSOs which recover and revolve their full CIF amount will be



awarded a big prize. A sort of competition emerged in rural areas and LSO Murk worked more passionately and mobilized their VOs and beneficiaries to deposit the maximum recoveries and revolve the same amount or with additional amount in other needy and new members as per their MIPs. With maximum efforts of LSO Murk, more than 70% VOs successfully recovered and revolved their CIF amounts. Yet LSO Murk, placed additional efforts and outreached those VOs which consistently delaying in depositing their recoveries. Again their efforts brought fruitful

results and by year 2015, LSO Murk became the first LSO of district Kashmore-Kandhkot which completely recovered and revolved their 100% CIF amount in whole district. Massive appreciations were made by the SRSO staff and it was the time to announce the big prize which was promised with these LSOs. Chairman-SRSO announced a **CHINCHI (QINGQI) Rakshaa** for LSO Murk as a reward of their splendid efforts and crucial role. LSO Murk arranged a ceremony in village Mehar Samejo in which members from various COs/VOs participated. CEO-SRSO handed over the prize to the LSO Murk and congratulated them for their excellent work





## HIGHLIGHTS

### Organized EU conference on CDD



The second conference on Community Driven Development (CDD) was organized at SRSO complex Sukkur in October-2015 with financial support of European Union Delegation in Pakistan. This event highlighted the work of RSPs and engagement of community members in rural areas of Pakistan. The objective of this conference was to facilitate a dialogue among different stakeholders including policy makers, donors, programme practitioners and researchers working on CDD programmes in Pakistan, in order to identify successful approaches and challenges faced to mainstream and scale up CDD in Pakistan. Community members, elected local bodies, civil society, media, government line departments and other stakeholders were the part of this successful conference. The participants and speakers applauded the work of RSPs across Pakistan and also marveled the role of RSPs and community partnership in CDD context. Before this conference, various teams were formed which visited the different districts of SRSO operations and interacted with rural communities specially with women and discussed their self-based initiatives in great detail.

### EU Delegation visit to Shikarpur for CDD based initiatives



SRSO Shikarpur, organized an event for the delegation of European Commission, at village Mohammad Ibrahim Sommro UC Rustam & village Chaman UC Bhirkar. This visit aimed to explore the community driven development (CDD) in these areas. The delegation was comprised of very senior professionals from civil and development sector i.e. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan (Chairman SRSO), Mr. Giacomo (EU Representative), Mr. Masood-ul-Mulk (CEO SRSP), Mr. Riaz-ud-Din (Ex-Air Marshal & Chairman BBSHRRDB), Mr. Mohammad Fazal (ADC Shikarpur), Mr. Mohammad Rafique Jaffari (SGA Representative) & Mr. Mohammad Dittal Kalhoro (CEO SRSO) and other senior managers from various RSPs. The delegation members interacted with rural women and discussed various self-based initiatives and its impact over the population. All members admired the role of rural women in their areas for development that has been taking place gradually. They also regarded the confidence and interest of rural women for such initiatives.



## EU Delegation visit to Jacobabad for UCBPRP interventions



SRSO district Jacobabad team arranged a visit of European Union (EU) delegation in village Khuda Bux Khambra UC Mirpur Buriro and LSO Eman UC Thull Nao. Additional secretary P&D, ADC Jacobabad, DHO JCD, DEO JCD, DSV-EPI, DO-SWD JCD, Mr. Nisar Khokhar KTN/Kawish, BRSP, SRSP, SRSO, HANDs representatives Journalists, Bankers, and community members participated. Delegation members appreciated the activities, efforts, confidence of rural women for poverty reduction. Members also praised the role of VOs/LSOs in terms of socio-economic activities and women empowerment in district Jacobabad.

## EU Delegation Visit to Ghotki for LEP interventions

A delegation from European Union (EU) visited the various villages of union council Bhehtoor in order to see the different interventions i.e. puncture shop; Chapel shop and cross breed animals under LEP project in district Ghotki on 01-Oct-2015. Delegation also interacted with respective beneficiaries and owners of assets and discussed the various aspects pertaining to the impact and the observable change being taken place in result of these massive interventions. LSO Sunheri Roshani also gave their presentation on physical achievements in their UC.



## PPAF Delegation Visit to Ghotki for LEP & SM projects

PPAF delegation also visited the LEP project, SM project and PM-IFL project interventions on 18-Nov-2015 in same UC Bhehtoor. Delegation met with respective beneficiaries and discussed their existing conditions while after getting these inputs from PPAF through SRSO. Concerned LSO presented their achievements and future plan in rural context.

## Community conference on human rights

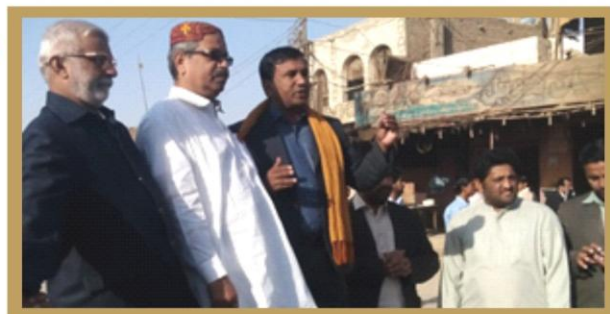

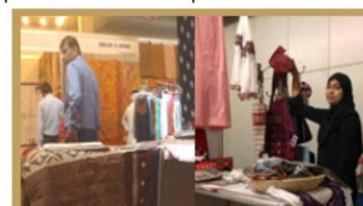
### Organized community conference on education
