

### Launching Ceremony of SUCCESS Programme in District Larkana

SRSO formally organized the launching ceremony of European Union (EU) funded Sindh Union Council and Community Economic Strengthening Support (SUCCESS) Programme on 29- March-2016 at the auditorium of SZABIST in district Larkana. Mr. Ghulam Akbar Laghari (Commissioner Larkana Division) honored the ceremony as chief guest. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan (Chairman SRSO), Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi (BoD member SRSO), Mr. Mohammad Ali Bhutto (MPA), local notables, elected representatives, local political leaders, representatives from different organizations and local women from Larkana participated in the ceremony.

Mr. Mohammad Dittal Kalhoro (CEO SRSO) welcomed the audience and illuminated the objectives and significance of SUCCESS programme. Women from UCBPRP Districts (Shikarpur, Jacobabad, and Kashmore) also participated and shared their personal successful case studies under GoS funded UCBPRP Program. The stories of these rural women were full of conviction, dedication, firm commitment and restless efforts which resulted the significant reduction in their poverty at the household level. The participants highly applauded the speeches of four women leaders and wished to have a similar type of efforts in these two districts Larkana and Kamber-Shahdadkot under the SUCCESS programme.

MPA- Mr. Ali Mohammad Bhutto also addressed in the event and appreciated the efforts of rural women of Shikarpur, Kashmore and Jacobabad districts. He said that he found himself very lucky and happy while seeing such event where rural women expressed their significant efforts with utmost confidence.

Chairman SRSO, Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan also addressed and expressed the history and importance of UCBPRP initiative. He praised the Govt. of Sindh and the European Union for continuous support towards the rural development and poverty reduction purposes. He further said that the approach of RSPs is very effective in poverty reduction context, because they have deep roots at the household level, due to this relation each household can easily be accessed in the programme districts. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan said Government has two significant pillars i.e. Political pillar and Administrative pillar, but these two-pillars do not have access at the household level. He added that the RSPs approach of three tiers Social Mobilisation (CO, VO, and LSO) forms the third social pillar of the society which contributes and supplements the Government's political and administrative pillars.

At the conclusion of launching ceremony, Commissioner Larkana Division, Mr. Akbar Ali Laghari also delivered an inspirational speech, urging on the role of women as equal to the men. He said that women should have full freedom to express their viewpoints; women must be treated equally at the household level. He further said that there should be equal opportunities of work, awareness, education for women. He said it is highly indispensable to adopt the policy of equality for women which will result in the visible changes in the status of women.



## First Programme Introduction Dialogue by Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan

First Dialogue (Programme Introduction) was organized in the village Jumo Shaikh on 29-March-2016 under European Union (EU) funded SUCCESS Programme. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan (Chairman-SRSO) conducted the first programme dialogue with the women of the village. The Senior Managers and Professional staff from three RSPs i.e. SRSO, TRDP and NRSP attended and carefully listened/learned the dialogue. Chairman SRSO passionately interacted with rural women and evoked the years of his work experience in Gilgit-Baltistan where he organized more than one million households, and those HHs significantly improved their lives and got rid of poverty with their self-help initiatives. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan explained the benefits, objectives and results of formation of community institutions and community driven development.

Chairman SRSO emphasized on rural women to organize themselves into their community institutions and start the basic practices of savings, self-help activities, identify issues, discuss those issues in detail and decide for its appropriate solutions. Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan also urged women to harness their true potential, work hard to eliminate their poverty by adopting permanent livelihood options doing proper micro investment plans (MIPs) at their household level. He further said that the years of experience has apparently proven that community driven development is always long lasting and sustainable in rural areas and this permanently reduces the poverty as well.

Subsequent to the dialogue of Chairman SRSO, Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi (SRSO-BoD member) also holds a brief interactive dialogue with women. He also urged women to play their essential role by contributing through positive efforts for poverty reduction and development of their native areas. At the conclusion of the event, a mango tree was planted in the corner of the village by Mr. Shoaib Sultan Khan and Mr. Fazalullah Qureshi. More tree plants were also distributed among women to plant in their homes.

#### Cheques and Contract Letters Distribution Ceremony

A formal event for CIF and Micro Credit cheques distribution organized at the town hall Jacobabad.Mr. Aijaz Hussain Jakhrani (MNA) and Mr. Agha Shah Nawaz Babar (DC-Jacobabad) both have honored the event as Chief Guests. Mr. Khaleel Tetlay (Acting CEO-RSPN), Mr. Muhammad Dittal Kalhoro CEO SRSO and other local influential, as well as representatives of various VOs and LSOs, has also participated in this event. The Chief Guests have distributed the Cheques among the community members/identified beneficiaries. During the speech, the both guests have applauded the role of SRSO and Helpage for their consistent efforts for reduction in poverty at these marginalized areas.

The Deputy Commissioner Jacobabad honored the event as the Chief Guest. This event was organized as part of the Sindh Reading Project expansion in this district. Officials from SRSO and SRP along with community members participated. Chief Guest, while addressing the participants said that illiteracy is the major cause of social issues; therefore, education is the only way or remedy to establish a valued society where everyone has equal opportunities and skills to work for the betterment of area and the country as a whole we will have to ensure education for all. He further said that the poverty can only be alleviated through achieving 100% literacy in rural areas. Followed by the speech of DC, Ms. Attiya Bhutto advisor SRP-Sindh said that the USAID-supported Sindh Reading Program's (SRP) vision is to improve the quality of education by promoting and implementing the policies by assisting the Government of Sindh (GoS) Literacy and Non-Formal Education (NFE) Directorate in achieving all set objectives.

#### Inauguration Ceremony of Non-Formal Education Center (NFE) at Kandhkot District



Under USAID funded Sindh Basic Education Programme's Sindh Reading Project, an inaugural ceremony of Non-Formal Education Centers held on dated 16-02-2016 in Kashmore district. Non-formal education centers are aiming to enroll and educate out-of-school children between age group of 10-15 years. A total of 34 NFE centers will be established and 1000 out-of-school children will be enrolled. Mr. Liaquat Ali Bhutto Deputy Director (Non formal education) honored the ceremony as a chief guest along with SRP Officials, CEO-SRSO Mr. Muhammad Dittal Kalhoro, SRSO Officials, LSO members, Parents, NFE learners and other local dignitaries and the prominent persons were attended the inauguration ceremony.

Mr. Liaquat Ali Bhutto Deputy Director (NFE) cut the ribbon and inaugurated the NFE center. Cluster School Bahadur Khan Khoso's Students presented the subjective tableaus on the importance of education and received standing applaud by the audiences. Chief Guest in his speech said that I am very glad and congratulate to you for opening NFE center in your community. Now this is your responsibility to make it successful. SRSO conducted 5 workshops at different district after that we approved JICA course for you as you got a primary education in two years. Following that CEO-SRSO said that as SRSO is working in rural communities having such relation in rural areas with communities, SRSO prioritized the need for such centers. SRSO started working on education project since 2009. Congratulations to all of you for gathering another chance to educate your community children particularly girls. It is very good for you that you will get a primary degree in two years, through this NFE project. He further said, "You are a real asset and we want to provide you with maximum opportunities so that you can prove your capabilities and improve your living standards

The team was comprised on Mr. Mohammad Younis (Program Specialist), Mehboob Ellahi (Program Officer) along with Mr. Ghulam Ali Kato (Academic Coordinator-SRSO) and Rizwan Ali Shah (MIS-SRSO). Team after visiting centers appreciated the efforts and steps that have been taken to ensure the quality of education and access to children at NFEs. It is worth mentioning that 33 NFEs will be established for 1,000 children who had missed the learning/education. This will cause literacy rate enhancement in the target area.





#### Brooke Official Visit at District Jacobabad

Dr. Sher Nawaz (Sr. Manager) from The Brooke hospital for animals has visited Women Equine Welfare Group and conducted a formal session on the subject of Wound Management. The purpose of this session was to build the capacity of women equine owners on basic management practices of working animals primarily equines. He further paid thanks for a chance to conduct a session with women owners.

Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) different districts Khairpur, Jacobabad, Kandh Kot and Shikarpur team started the Tree Plantation Campiagn under the Green Sindh Program, at various locations through the involvment of local community members from village organizations (VOs) and Older People Assciations (OPAs) in the District. According to the plan, more than one hundred thousand three trees will be planted in areas of the dsitrict. The purpose behind this campaign was to reduce or overcome the effects of Global Warming in these areas. Trees are considered very effective To control the effects of global warming.





SRSO district office Shikarpur organized a Community Conference, in which the cheques of Micro-Credit under HelpAge-BLF were given to the older people. This project aims to improve the lives of older people by empowering them as they are also the respectable citizens of the country and can have significant contribution through their vast exposure and experiences. At the conclusion of the Community Conference, the DC Shikarpur planted a tree and started the Tree Plantation Campaign under Green Sindh Program at OPA and VO level. The participants at the program were Mr. Sikander Ali Khushk (DC Shikarpur), Mr. Agha Waheed Ahmed (SWD), Mr. Mohammad Dittal Kalhoro (CEO-SRSO) and members and office bearers from Community Institutions (COs/VOs/LSOs).

#### SRSO- Help Age organized five free Eye Camps



Help Age International & Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) organized 05 one day Free Eye Camps with the technical assistance of AL-Shifa Trust (medical Staff) and with financial support from Sight Savers International. These camps were organized on different dates and different venues at District Shikarpur in areas of the project, with the help of OPA (Older People Association). The service in the eye camp included Eye checkup, prescription & surgeries with free eyesight glass) for patients. The main goal of this activity was to provide quality eye health facility to Poor older people & their families that cannot bear medical expenses and fair to come at hospitals. Following beneficiaries benefited from this eye camp were Free checkup of 2000 older poor persons, free medicines to 2000, free near vision glasses to 1197 persons and free cataract surgery services to 251 older and poor persons were provided to poor and older people of Shikarpur.



## If the feelings are mutual the effort will be equal

(A case study of joint venture in installing a 'Chaki'Village Sanbal Khan Jagirani, District Khairpur)

Mai Bali a feeble poor old woman aged 51 and Nazar Bano a sincere unschooled mother aged 36. Both women are Mother in law and Daughter in law in relationship respectively. They belong to the village of District Khairpur UC Wada Machi Village Sanbal Khan Jagirani. They have large family but little resources to lead happy and healthy life. The head of HH is a daily wage laborer which is the only source of their livelihood. They were leading their lives under poverty line with poor health and hygiene conditions.

Mai Bali's husband, Mr. Ali Dost aged 55 is weak and unable to do lot of labor. Contrary to this, Nazar Bano having a large family comprises six daughters and two sons; five out of eight are school going children. Nazar Bano with visionary mind and ambitions to

uplift her family doesn't want her children get deprived of education; because of low income earned by her husband Rasool Bux aged 38. Both women were suffering from the same menace of poverty and helplessness.

Education is a basic right of every child. So that, Nazar Bano doesn't want her children deprived of their right. But poverty and shortage of resources were great hurdles to her. She couldn't afford the expenses of education as a whole. Her mother in laws and her sufferings were same therefore; to cope with the situation they planned for joint venture a grind mill to support their households.

In the year 2009, SRSO team visited village for Introduction of the Program and CO formation. It brought a silver lining to fulfill their needs and dreams. SRSO team was welcomed with cheered faces and shinning eyes. Not only women but also men members of the village were hopeful and found themselves blessed after mobilization. As a result of mobilization both women participated in the Community Management Skills



Training (CMST) held in district Khairpur. This great effort of the SRSO team changed the course of lives and paved a new way for the betterment of the helpless women and families, which further raised more status of women in their families, changed socioeconomic conditions and empowered them.

In the year 2010, Mai Bali and Nazar Bano with mutual consensus submitted a resolution for Community Investment Fund (CIF) to fulfill their dream of joint venture. Luckily, the interest free loan of Rs. 19,000 was disbursed to both applicants with lenient installments. The amount of Rs. 10,000 disbursed to Mai Bali and Rs. 9,000 to Nazar Bano. By adding another Rs. 1,000 Nazar Bano purchased a used small grinding mill 'Chaki'. They initiated small enterprise to support their families. Owing to age factor Mai Bali does not work over the 'Chaki', she regularly in the morning, cleans the mill and offer prayer from the Almighty to shower His blessing in shape of 'Barkat'. Mai Bali only gets Rs. 4,000 of the income of 'Chaki' while Nazar Bano keeps Rs. 8,000 for herself.

In the area there is trend of deduction of 2 kg of flour as a service charges but Nazar Bano provides extra benefit to the customers; no deduction of 2kg of flour. She only gets Rs. 100 charges per 40 kg, she approximately earns Rs. 200 to Rs. 500 per day. Which have improved the conditions of both households thoroughly. People from Village Mang Tagar, Murid Jalbani and Mehr Jagirani bring their wheat bales to get flour without losing their 2kg.



Nazar Bano also participated in the training of Enterprise Development Program (EDP) held in the district Khairpur organized by SRSO, where she improved her expertise of embroidery and learnt about value edition to make the articles marketable and generate more money. Moreover, she is a part of Business Development Group (BDG) by selling 'Balochi Bharth' hand embroidery she earns her livelihood in a better way. She earns Rs. 5,000 per month from 'Balochi Bharth' embroidery.

As she is a visionary woman, she didn't restrict herself to embroidery but she bought a sewing machine to generate more income. It is her remarkable achievement that a sewing machine is a result of her savings. She charges Rs.130 for stitching a suit; in the month she gets about 5 to 8 suits from which she is able to earn Rs. 700 per month.

She has a buffalo given under Government of Sindh, Union Council Based Poverty Reduction Programme (GoS/UCBPRP); to build assets and promotion of livestock farming and dairying as enterprise for poor women. Nazar Bano had no livestock prior but these days she has a pregnant buffalo with increased worth.

The prime objective of hard working is to provide quality education and health to her children. She had fulfilled by her determination and cooperation of Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO).

Finally, Nazar Bano shared her feelings with gratitude. She said that before becoming the member of CO she was not confident and able to speak in other local languages. Further she exclaimed that all she has these days; whether it should be clothes, health and enrollment at the school is the result of organizing into a community group in shape of CO. This membership has changed my life and made me hopeful to fulfill my dreams and prosper life. She is very thankful for the capacity building of her i.e. disbursement of interest free loan, improving her handicraft skills and having a buffalo under GoS/UCBPRP. As a result, she has improved her socioeconomic conditions comprehensively.
